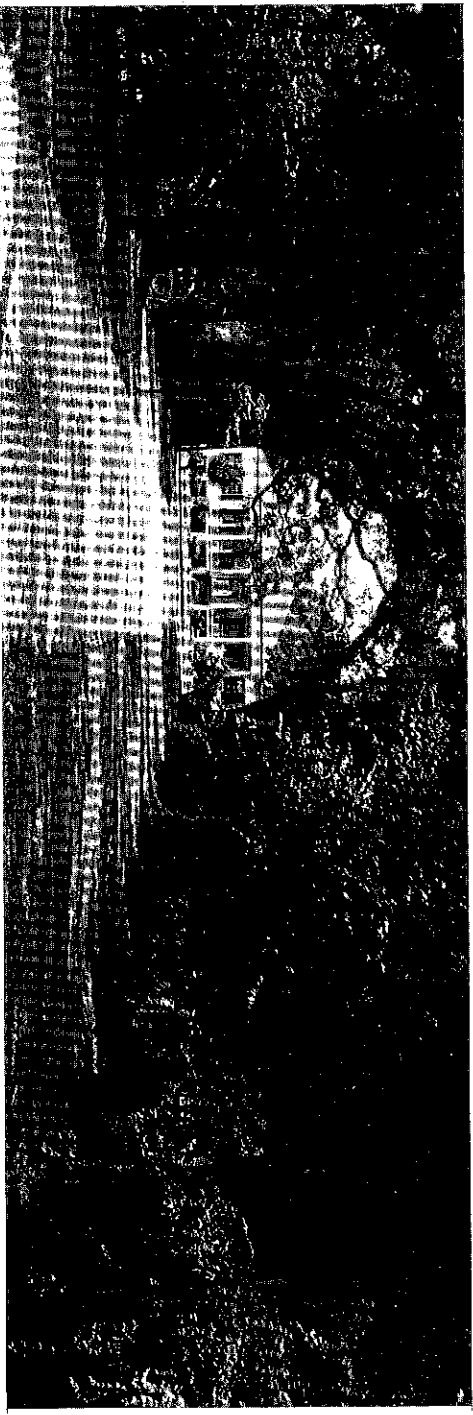

The 1987 baseball season should be an exciting and interesting year. With Spring Hill's youth, inexperience, and enthusiasm, it could create some hard-fought, fun-to-watch games. So we are looking forward to seeing you and your family at our games this Spring.


As a team we have set some lofty goals for the 1987 season. We want to set our sights on 30 to 35 winsl, win our conference and District 30 titles. This will be a great challenge for our young ball club. We lost 9 lettermen and 4 All-Conference players from our 29-21 team in 1986. On the bright side, we do have 6 returning lettermen, plus 1 All-Conference pitcher back for the 1987 campaign. We will have no seniors, 3 juniors, 5 sophmores and 10 freshmen. The young men we have are talented, but we will have to wait and see how soon they can adjust to college baseball.

Our schedule is one of the best NAIA schedules in the South. We try and play the best competition available to us. This year's key opponents will be Division I schools Tulane, Southern Miss, Southeastern Louisiana and Samford; Division II powers Troy State and Columbus, last years top two teams in Division II; and of course, NAIA powers Birmingham Southern, William Carey, Christian Brothers and Huntingdon. We must be ready to accept this challenging schedule.

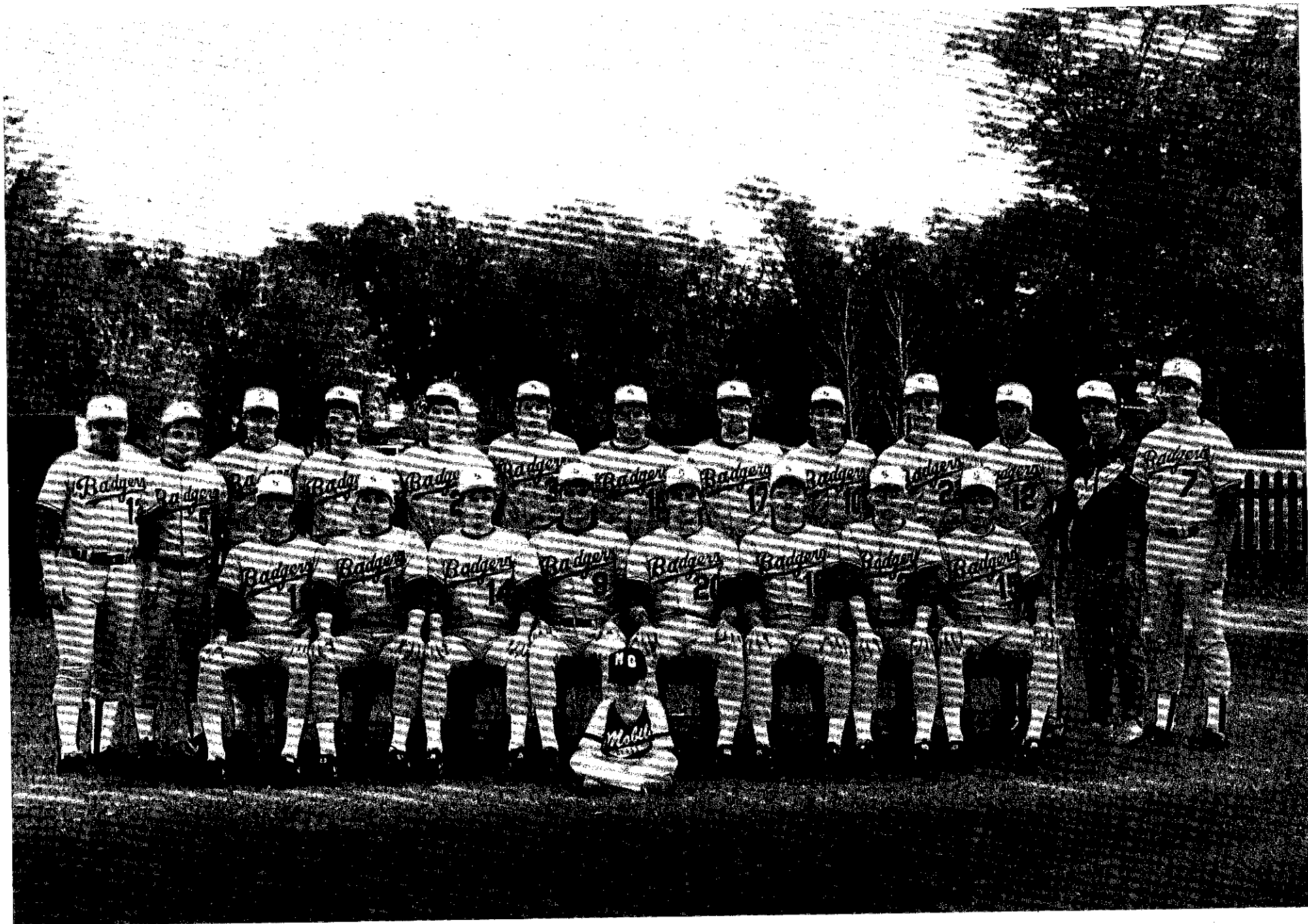
Barring injuries to key positions, we will learn and grow as a team in this 1987 campaign. That will be our key for success, not only for this season but for our bright future.
