HEAD COACH



PEGGY MARTIN

Mobile Sports Hall of Fame member Dr. Peggy Martin finished her sixth season as the head coach of court volleyball at Spring Hill College in 2014 and leads the Badgers into their first season of sand volleyball in 2015.

The Badger court team finished its first season in NCAA Division II with a 26-7 record including a perfect 17-0 mark in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic

Conference (SIAC). In 2011, 2012 and 2013, Martin directed SHC to three consecutive NAIA National Tournament appearances for the first time in program history. The Badgers also won their second consecutive Southern States Athletic Conference (SSAC) regular season championship in 2013 with a perfect 14-0 mark and were the SSAC Tournament for the first time in school history. Closing her 39th season as a collegiate head coach, Martin holds a court volleyball career record of 1,232-324-8 (.790) including a 168-43 (.796) record with the Badgers.

Martin holds the most wins in the history of NCAA Division II court volleyball after 33 consecutive winning seasons at the University of Central Missouri where she compiled a 1,064-281-8 record. At the end of the 2008 season she retired as the Jennies' coach and returned to her hometown of Mobile, but the opportunity to coach at SHC was too tempting to pass up.

Over 33 seasons at UCMO, Martin never suffered a losing season, won 25 matches in 31 consecutive seasons and won or shared 19 Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association titles. Her teams made a record 25 consecutive NCAA Div. II Tournament appearances, reached the "Elite Eight" six times and finished as the National Runner-up in 1987. She has won 22 Coach of the Year Awards including the 1987 NCAA Division II National Coach of Year Award.

Martin first served as softball and volleyball coach at UCMO when she started her Division II career in 1975 and even stepped into an assistant women's basketball coaching role for the 1976-77 season. Her first collegiate coaching experience came at Florida Southern College as a volleyball and basketball coach at the then club level program.

In college, she played at Indiana University and led the women's basketball team to three consecutive national tournament berths while winning four letters in softball and three letters in field hockey. She completed her bachelor's degree at IU in 1972 and earned a master's degree from the University of North Carolina-Greensboro in 1974. In 1980, she completed her doctorate in physical education at Indiana University.

ASSISTANT COACH

Helldoerfer joins Spring Hill for his first season as assistant volleyball coach in 2014. He comes to SHC after spending three seasons as an assistant women's volleyball coach and one year as a men's assistant at Graceland University. Helldoerfer was a four-year libero at Graceland where he earned his degree in biology with a minor in psychology and was a three-time Libero of the Week. At

Graceland, his teams won a conference title and tied for 5th place at the National Championship Tournament.

PREVIEW 2015

The Spring Hill College (SHC) sand volleyball team opens its premier season in 2015 and head coach Peggy Martin says her squad is proud to be the sport's first team in school history, "Our student-athletes are excited to be a part of the inaugural season of sand volleyball on The Hill and are very grateful for the opportunity to compete in this amazing emerging sport for women," she says. "The timing is perfect in that just as we are becoming a full-fledged NCAA member, sand volleyball has been adopted as an NCAA championship sport."

The "Sandy Badger" squad will consist of several experienced SHC indoor veterans along with some exclusive sand competitors. Stellar senior middle hitter Megan Haber from Foley, Ala., and junior setter/defensive specialist Mallory Raulerson from McGill-Toolen Catholic High School in Mobile join the sand team as the current Badger No. 1 pair while the No. 2 pairing will consist of junior Savannah Becnel of Metairie, La., and freshmen Julie Vujnovich from Belle Chasse, La.

Two sophomores will comprise the No. 3 squad as outside hitter Madie Seuzeneau of Tampa, Fla., and Hannah Masoner from Camden, Tenn., will team together. The No. 4 court for SHC will be junior Ginny Hicks of Salt Lake City, Utah and sophomore Amber Perkins from New Orleans, La. Rounding out the team in the No. 5 position will be freshmen Catherine Milwee out of St Luke's Episcopal School in Mobile and Andria Dytrych from Chicago, Ill.

Similar to the style of collegiate tennis and golf, the pair positions in NCAA sand volleyball are based on practice competitions and are subject to change each week. Each program also maintains a No. 6 pairing that competes in a non-scoring match at most tournaments as they fight to earn a spot among one of the five scoring teams. For Spring Hill, freshmen Katelyn Bobinger from McGill-Toolen and Morgan Murphy of Chicago currently comprise the No. 6 team.

Along with the new sport comes a new athletic facility on Spring Hill campus. Currently under construction at the south end of the Badger soccer facility at Library Field, the Jim and Betty Walsh Sand Court Facility will be the home of the Sandy Badgers. Named in honor of SHC basketball star and Athletics Hall of Fame member Jim Walsh and his wife Betty, the courts were made possible by a generous donation from the Walsh Family.
