HEAD COACH



DR. PEGGY MARTIN

Mobile Sports Hall of Fame member Dr. Peggy Martin is in her seventh season as the head volleyball coach at Spring Hill College. In 2011, 2012 and 2013, she directed SHC to three consecutive NAIA National Tournament appearances for the first time in program history. The Badgers also won their second consecutive Southern States Athletic Conference (SSAC) regular season championship in 2013 with a perfect 14-0 mark and were the SSAC

Tournament for the first time in school history. As she begins her 40th season as a collegiate head coach, Martin opens 2015 with a career record of 1,232-324-8 (.790) including a 168-43 (.796) record with the Badgers.

Martin holds the most wins in the history of NCAA Division II after 33 consecutive winning seasons at the University of Central Missouri where she compiled a 1,064-281-8 record. At the end of the 2008 season she retired as the Jennies' coach and returned to her hometown of Mobile, but the opportunity to coach at SHC was too tempting to pass up.

Over 33 seasons at UCMO, Martin never suffered a losing season, won 25 matches in 31 consecutive seasons and won or shared 19 Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association titles. Her teams made a record 25 consecutive NCAA Div. II Tournament appearances, reached the "Elite Eight" six times and finished as the National Runner-up in 1987. She has won 22 Coach of the Year Awards including the 1987 NCAA Division II National Coach of Year Award.

Martin first served as softball and volleyball coach at UCMO when she started her Division II career in 1975 and even stepped into an assistant women's basketball coaching role for the 1976-77 season. Her first collegiate coaching experience came at Florida Southern College as a volleyball and basketball coach at the then club level program.

In college, she played at Indiana University and led the women's basketball team to three consecutive national tournament berths while winning four letters in softball and three letters in field hockey. She completed her bachelor's degree at IU in 1972 and earned a master's degree from the University of North Carolina-Greensboro in 1974. In 1980, she completed her doctorate in physical education at Indiana University.

ASSISTANT COACHES



SHAWN TAYLOR

Shawn Taylor comes to SHC after three seasons with the University of South Alabama (USA) Jaguars under head coach Amy Hendrichovsky where he helped develop three all-conference student-athletes including the 2013 Sun Belt Conference (SBC) Freshman of the Year Mechell Daniel.

Before his tenure at USA, Taylor spent two seasons as the top assistant at Arkansas State University (ASU) under head coach Justin Ingram. In his two seasons in Jonesboro, the Red Wolves posted an overall record of 38-22 and a 23-9 mark in the league. The Red Wolves finished 2010 as co-champions of the SBC West Division with an 11-5 conference record and won an outright division title in 2011 with 21 overall wins and a 12-4 conference mark. While at ASU, Taylor coached four all-conference players in Cayla Fielder (2011 and 2010), Allison Kearney (2011), Ashley Tipps (2011) and Megan Baska (2010), who also won recognition as the 2010 SBC Defensive Player of the Year.

Taylor earned his master's degree in college student personnel from KSU in 2006 and his bachelor's degree in liberal studies from Graceland in 2004 where he played for the Yellowjackets from 1999-2002.

PREVIEW 2015

The Spring Hill College (SHC) volleyball team began its NCAA Division II and Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) era with a bang in 2014 by building an impressive 26-7 overall record and an undefeated 17-0 mark in conference play. Head coach Peggy Martin enters her 7th season at Spring Hill with another strong line up for 2015. "Moving into our second year in the NCAA and the SIAC, I don't see us changing our strategies or tactics," she says. "We will compete at the same high level every time we take the court."

The Badger starting line will undergo some tweaks this season as Spring Hill lost four starting players, but Martin is confident that the players stepping into the roles will be ready for the challenge. "Our starting line-up is still evolving and could change weekly," she says. "But there is strong competition on the floor." Senior setter Mallory Raulerson from McGill-Toolen Catholic High School in Mobile has settled into the setter position while fellow senior Virginia Hicks of Salt Lake City, Utah, will be on the right side with sophomore Katelyn Bobinger from McGill-Toolen providing her relief.

In the middle, junior Savannah Bechel of Metairie, La., will share time with freshman Dorina Klinger of Frauental, Austria. The outside hitters are junior Madison Seuzeneau of Tampa, Fla., and SIAC Preseason All-Conference selection junior Molly Griffin of Westlake Village, Calif. Sophomores Hannah Masoner of Camden, Tenn., and Randi De'Armitt of New Orleans, La., will both see significant playing time at the outside hitters, as well.

On defense, senior Abby Allard of Belleville, Ill., will be the first off the bench for back court duty and freshman libero Hailey Kirkpatrick from Slidell, La., and sophomore defensive specialist Morgan Murphy of Chicago, Ill., will look to collect their share of the Badger digs this season.

Martin has been pleased with her team's efforts in the early practices. "This team has worked very hard in the preseason and will get better with every practice and playing opportunity that they have," she says. "With two freshmen in the starting rotation the chemistry has been good - almost like they are veterans of the program."

Younger Badgers will also earn their stripes this year as sophomores outside hitter Julie Vujnovich of Belle Chasse, La., and defensive specialist Catherine Milwee out of St. Luke's Episcopal High School in Mobile are joined by a solid freshman class that includes setter Anna Tietjens of St. Louis, Mo., along with middle hitters Emily Greim of McKinney, Texas, and Destiny Marks from Diamondhead, Miss. Freshman Grace Herrington of Gainesville, Fla., will see time at setter and defensive specialist while freshman Caroline Herrera from Austin, Texas, will learn the college ropes at outside and right side hitter.

Long-time Badger fans will notice that Martin has stepped up the level of non-conference competition on the schedule this year with a tournament appearance at Rollins Collins in Orlando, Fla., and a tri-match against the University of West Georgia and the University of West Florida in Pensacola. "We are trying to play a tougher schedule every year of the transition into D2 to get to that level of competition," says Martin. "We need to be challenged to learn what the next level requires for success."

One of the challenges the Badgers will face over the next two seasons is the lack of postseason opportunities due to the limitations of the NCAA transition process. Martin says that her team cannot worry about that situation. "In general, I want some of our younger players to develop and challenge the juniors and seniors this year," she says. "Our goal is always to be the best team we can be regardless of championship eligibility."
