HEAD COACH



PEGGY MARTIN

Mobile Sports Hall of Fame member Dr. Peggy Martin is in her sixth season as the head volleyball coach at Spring Hill College. In 2011, 2012 and 2013, she directed SHC to three consecutive NAIA National Tournament appearances for the first time in program history. The Badgers also won their second consecutive Southern States Athletic Conference (SSAC) regular season championship in 2013 with a perfect 14-0 mark and were the SSAC Tournament for the first time in school history. As she begins her 39th season as a collegiate head coach, Martin opens 2014 with a career record of 1,206-317-8 including a 142-36 record with the Badgers.

Martin holds the most wins in the history of NCAA Division II after 33 consecutive winning seasons at the University of Central Missouri where she compiled a 1,064-281-8 record. At the end of the 2008 season she retired as the Jennies' coach and returned to her hometown of Mobile, but the opportunity to coach at SHC was too tempting to pass up.

Over 33 seasons at UCMO, Martin never suffered a losing season, won 25 matches in 31 consecutive seasons and won or shared 19 Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association titles. Her teams made a record 25 consecutive NCAA Div. II Tournament appearances, reached the "Elite Eight" six times and finished as the National Runner-up in 1987. She has won 22 Coach of the Year Awards including the 1987 NCAA Division II National Coach of Year Award.

Martin first served as softball and volleyball coach at UCMO when she started her Division II career in 1975 and even stepped into an assistant women's basketball coaching role for the 1976-77 season. Her first collegiate coaching experience came at Florida Southern College as a volleyball and basketball coach at the then club level program.

In college, she played at Indiana University and led the women's basketball team to three consecutive national tournament berths while winning four letters in softball and three letters in field hockey. She completed her bachelor's degree at IU in 1972 and earned a master's degree from the University of North Carolina-Greensboro in 1974. In 1980, she completed her doctorate in physical education at Indiana University.

ASSISTANT COACH



Ricky Helldoerfer

Helldoerfer joins Spring Hill for his first season as assistant volleyball coach in 2014. He comes to SHC after spending three seasons as an assistant women's volleyball coach and one year as a men's assistant at Graceland University. Helldoerfer was a four-year libero at Graceland where he earned his degree in biology with a minor in psychology and was a three-time Libero of the Week. At Graceland, his teams won a conference title and tied for 5th place at the

National Championship Tournament.

Hailing from Forestville, Md., Clarke is a sophomore psychology major at SHC who prepped at Stone Ridge School of the Sacred Heart under head coach Jessica Garcia. She was team MVP in 2012 and 2013 as well as All-ISL for three consecutive seasons in 2011-13.

PREVIEW 2014

The Spring Hill college volleyball team enters a new era this fall as the school has moved from the Southern States Athletic Conference (SSAC) of the NAIA and into the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) of NCAA Division II, but head coach Peggy Martin does not see the move changing the high level of play for which her teams have become known. "Our personnel will dictate our style of play, but I don't see the philosophy of sharing the ball changing much due to our change in affiliation," she says. "We just need to execute at a higher level to compete in the new league as well as in NCAA Division II."

One strong point that the Badgers can rely on is that they will have two experienced seniors on the floor in middle hitter Megan Haber of Lillian, Ala., and libero Sami Maurer of St. Louis, Mo. "At this point we probably have about 12 potential starters fighting for spots with only Haber and Maurer being sure in their positions," Martin says. "Our two senior leaders have been very consistent this pre-season."

The Badgers lost three four-year starters to graduation after the 2013 season in setter Taryn Nash, middle hitter Sha Sha Buchanan and libero Meredith Donald, but Martin feels she has the young talent that can step up and take on those responsibilities. "It will be tough to replace those three and we'll have to replace Nash by committee at setter with redshirt freshman Marie Rooks from Tallahassee, Fla., and junior Mallory Raulerson of McGill-Toolen Catholic High School in Mobile," she says. "At middle hitter, sophomore Savannah Becnel from Metairie, La., currently leads freshman Katelyn Bobinger, who is also from McGill-Toolen. Only the libero role with Maurer is solid at this point, but we've had very good competition in practice for every spot."

Spring Hill's squad is younger than it has been in the past three years with underclassmen outnumbering upperclassmen 11 to six, but Martin says her young Badgers are up to the challenge. "I am very happy with the sophomore group that consists of outside hitters Molly Griffin of Westlake Village, Calif., and redshirt freshman Hannah Masoner of Camden, Tenn., along with Becnel and Rooks stepping in as they have," she says. "And I expect sophomore outside hitter Madison Seuzeneau to compete for more time. Our freshmen are a little behind the returners, but they are a promising group."

Last season, the Badgers lost junior middle hitter Sami Hantak of St. Louis, Mo., to injury late in the year, but she has worked hard in her rehabilitation and should return very early in the campaign. Junior outside hitter Ginny Hicks of Salt Lake City, Utah, played well in 78 sets in 2013 and will also be an important cog of the 2014 squad. Junior defensive specialist Abby Allard of Belleville, Ill., also returns after averaging more than a dig per set as a sophomore. Sophomore outside hitter Sara Brodner of Chicago, Ill., will fight for more playing time along with a cadre of freshmen in defensive specialist Catherine Milwee of Mobile's St. Luke's Episcopal School, defensive specialist Morgan Murphy from Chicago, outside hitter Julie Vujnovich of Belle Chasse, La., and outside hitter Randi De'Armitt of New Orleans, La.

The younger players will have to step into the mix early in the year as the SIAC schedule prefers interdivisional crossover tournaments and divisional tri-matches over traditional home-and-home single matches. "Playing three matches in one day would challenge any team," says Martin. "I can only hope our young players will pick-up our system quickly to give our starters some breaks. It's disappointing that we could not schedule more home matches and it will be a challenge for a young team to play so many matches on the road."

Overall, Martin says the future of Badger Volleyball is bright. "We look forward to the challenges ahead of us. We have a competitive group and expect to continue the winning culture of SHC Volleyball in our new conference home."
