# HEAD COACH



## FRANK SIMS

Frank Sims starts his 30th season at the helm of the Badgers and has compiled a 765-795-3 record over that time span. Over the 31 total years he has served as a collegiate skipper, he has accumulated a career record of 801-805-3. Sims is Spring Hill's all-time winningest coach and his record includes 21 20-win seasons, six 30-win seasons, two 40-win seasons and four conference championships. Spring Hill has appeared in the NAIA Regional Tournament four times in his reign and Sims has been honored as a conference Coach of the Year on five occasions with the latest time being the 2014 Independent Collegiate Athletic Association (ICAA) honor in the Badgers' first season in NCAA Division II.

# ASSISTANT COACH



## ANDY McCALL

Andy is in his 1st season as an assistant coach at Spring Hill after spending three years as a Graduate Assistant with the Badger program. As a player, he enjoyed a four-year career in the Badger outfield (2007-10) where he hit .335 during his career and stillowns the school's single season record for triples. During his senior season, he hit .353 with six triples and 44 RBI. McCall was a two-year starter with 81 career RBI.

McCall graduated from De Smet Jesuit High School in St. Louis, Mo., and in 2005 he helped lead De Smet Jesuit to the State Finals. At SHC, McCall works with the hitters and outfielders and plays a key role in recruiting while also overseeing the strength & conditioning program. He also served as an assistant coach with the Laramie (Wy.) Colts of the Mountain Collegiate Baseball League during the summer of 2012. In the summer of 2013, McCall was chosen to be the head coach of the Socastee Sharks in the Beach Collegiate League located in Myrtle Beach, S.C. He led them to a league best 21-7 record to win the regular season BCBL title. McCall coached the Mobile Pirates of the Deep South Collegiate League during the summer of 2014.

# GRADUATE ASSISTANT



## BROOKS BOBINGER

Brooks Bobinger moves from the field to the dugout as the Badgers' graduate assistant coach after spending three seasons (2011, 2013-14) on the Badger infield. Bobinger tallied a .211 batting average with a .911 fielding percentage as a middle infielder and 3rd baseman. On the mound, he built a 2.42 ERA in nine games with three starts and 22.1 innings pitched. In his senior season, he represented SHC on the 2014 Musco Lighting-SSAC Champions of Character Team.

# PREVIEW 2015

The Spring Hill College baseball team will make a historic transition in 2015 when they move from NAIA into NCAA Division II and the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC). Head coach Frank Sims is excited to begin the new era and looks forward to the new level of competition. "I like this group of ballplayers a lot," he says. "We lost very few players off last year's squad and we have virtually our entire pitching staff back."

Sims is confident that his team has the experience and leadership to make an immediate impression on its new rivals. "With our returning pitching staff plus the newcomers, we have a chance to compete right down to the last out of every game on the schedule," he says. "Our NAIA All-America selection Taylor Eads will be back in the outfield and our 3rd baseman Willie Floros is back after suffering a season-ending injury in the first few weeks of last year. With a healthy team on the field, we should be in fine shape."

Sims is particularly happy with his pitching rotation headed into the season. Senior starter Jack Howard of Decatur, Ga., returns after picking up 51 strikeouts over 80 innings in 2014 along with junior Wesley Parish of Fairhope, Ala., who notched 57 strikeouts in 72 innings. Senior Keller Douglas of Covington, La., holds the SHC career saves record with 14 over his three-year career as a closer, but will transition into a starting role this year as junior Johnathan Billings of Luling, La., looks to take over the closing duties. Sophomore transfer Jordan Fontenelle from New Orleans, La., will also join the Badger starting corps. Lefties senior Brady Hitt of LaPlace, La., and junior Andrew Pierson from Coconut Creek, Fla., will earn valuable time on the mound, too.

In the mid-week and in middle-inning relief, seniors Robert Quinn of Jacksonville, Ala., and Cyrus Beerman of Tampa, Fla., along with junior Hunter Nowak from Alpharetta, Ga., sophomore Christian Bahlinger of Mandeville, La., and sophomore left-hander Shane Petrie out of McGill-Toolen Catholic High School in Mobile will each see action while junior Paul Sullivan of St. Louis, Mo., and sophomore Zach Cunningham of Slidell, La., will add to the depth of the Badger bullpen.

The Badger infield will see some shake up this season as middle infielders and long-time veterans Brian Sims and Brooks Bobinger graduated, but freshman Hunter D'Armond of Greenwell Springs, La., moves into the 2nd base slot vacated by Sims and senior Mason Hutson of St. Louis will platoon with sophomore Keaton Smith of Meridian, Miss., at shortstop. Junior Pete Spradlin of St. Louis will also see time at 2nd base this year while the junior Floros steps back on to 3rd base. At 1st base, the Badgers are rich in depth with senior Kyle Freeman of Pensacola, Fla., leading the charge as juniors Jacob Malkoff of Enterprise, Ala., and Andrew Solliday of Bedford, Ind., are both ready to take the sack when needed. Behind the plate, junior Alex Jones of Pensacola has won the starting role as seniors Roy Moulder of Milton, Fla., and Ryan Stevens of Theodore, Ala., will also see action. Stevens, however, will make the designated hitter position his primary focus this year along with Malkoff.

The outfield sees the senior slugger Eads from Slidell return to right field along with his .423 average, 13 home runs and 51 RBI from last year. Junior Garrett Webb of Gainesville, Fla., will move into centerfield, but there will be a battle for the left field position with Spradlin facing competition from sophomore Austyn Jacques of Cumming, Ga., senior Brian Solliday of Bedford, sophomore Michael Ball of Mandeville and freshman Conner Harrison of St. Louis.

"Our offense will be better than last year even when it was healthy," says Sims. "We are solid 1-through-9 and we have more power than we've had in several years. We'll still rely on running, bunting and finding holes in the infield, but we are back to having hitters with the power that pitchers and outfielders have to respect."

Overall, Sims is confident that his team is ready for 2015 and the challenges ahead. "It will be different this year," he says. "But we have a team that will represent Spring Hill well in the new conference. We face a tough mid-week schedule, but facing tough competition is why you play the game. We look forward to hitting the field and finally seeing what we can do."
