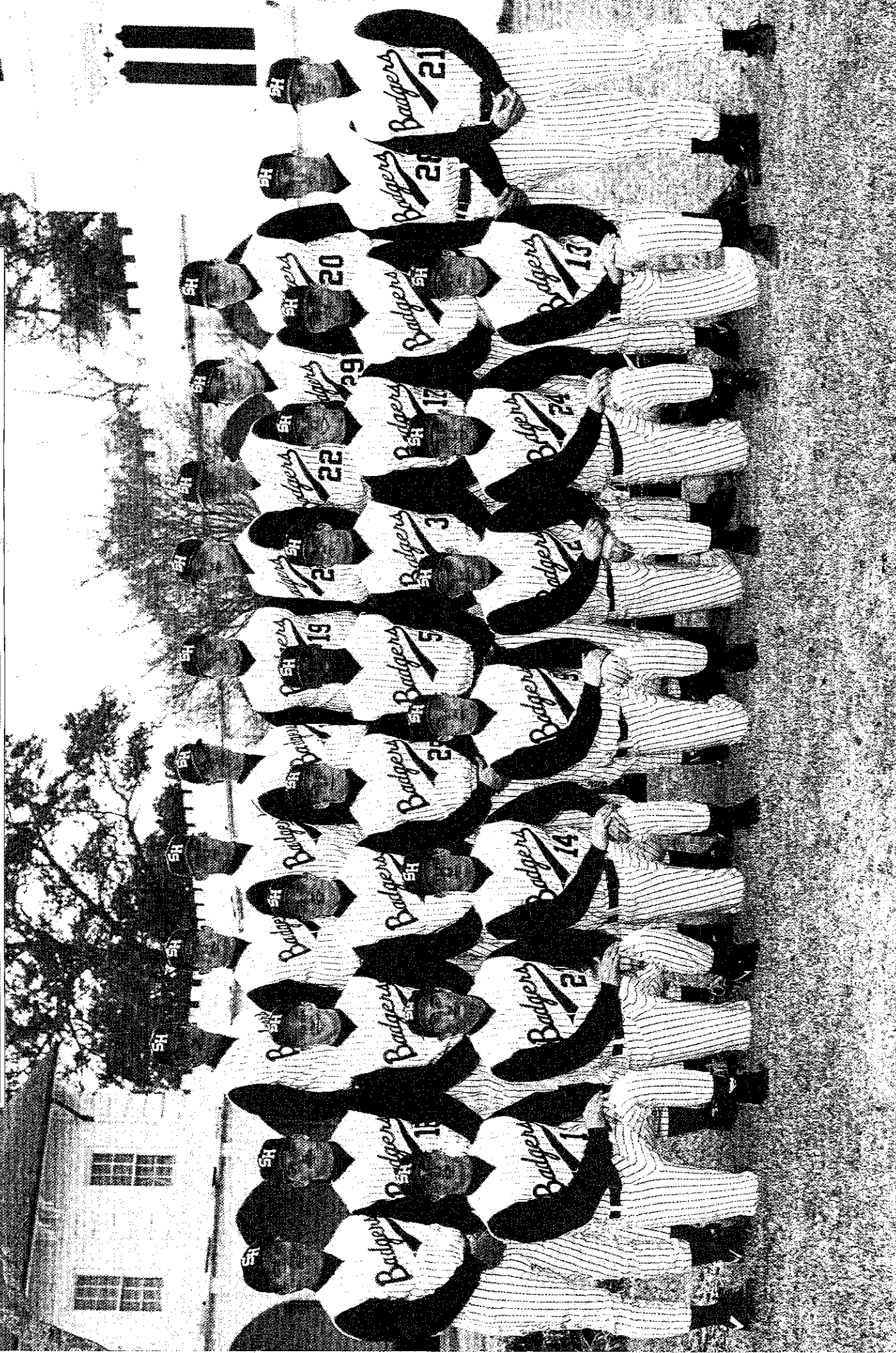

We are grateful for the attendance and support of our fans. Your continued support is a vital link in our chain of success.



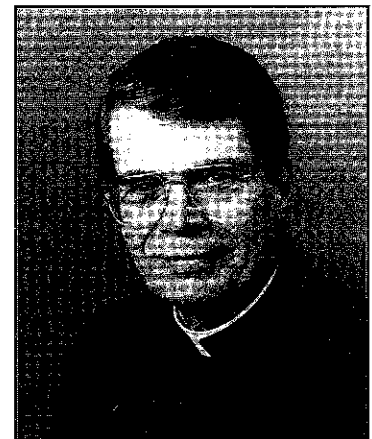
We have a lot to cheer about this athletic season on the Hill, and I hope to see you in the crowd each time the Badgers take the field or court.

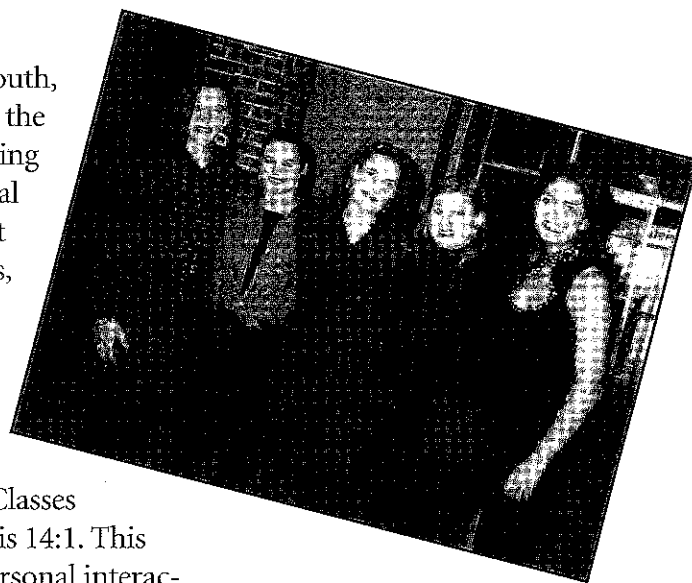

The Spring Hill Experience

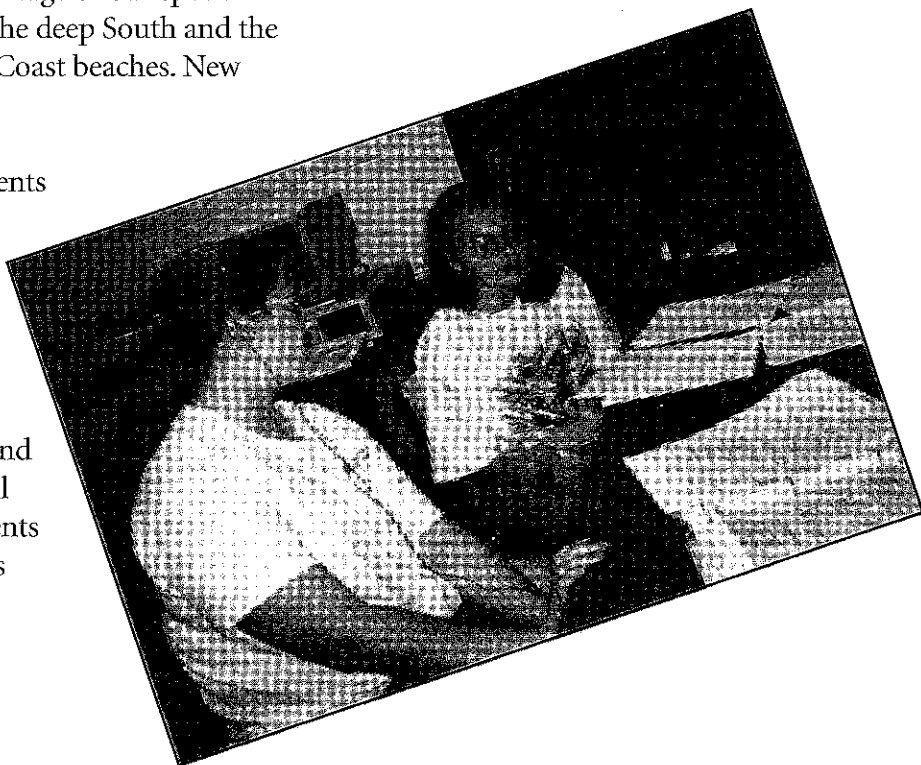

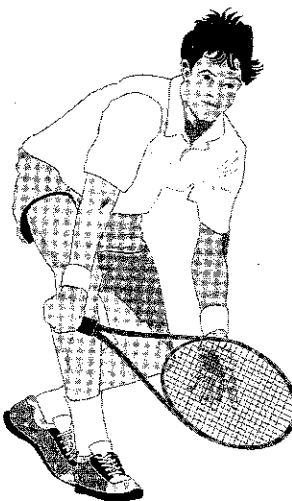

MEN'S BASEBALL

Youth & Experience Key as Spring Hill College Opens 1996 Season

The 1996 Spring Hill College baseball team will be young, but not inexperienced. The roster includes three seniors, two all-conference selections, four junior college transfers in addition to 10 underclassmen.

Now in his eleventh year as head coach, Frank Sims is very proud of this year's recruiting class, the largest one in terms of numbers and overall ability he has ever had in his tenure at the Hill.

"The numbers will prove to be good for competition," Sims said. "This team has great potential, it seems to have great chemistry...we will need to put the right players in the right positions and we need to do this early."

Sims believes that the biggest strength for the 1996 Badgers will be on the mound.

Three pitchers who help post a team 3.20 ERA last season, return. Senior *Steve Quina* (5-4, 3.20 ERA), junior *Steve Stokes* (6-4, 2.50 ERA) and sophomore *Steve DeWitt* (9-4, 3.39 ERA) will more than likely divide the starting pitching chores. Two talented newcomers, freshmen *Eric Busby* of Fairhope High School and *Trae McGill* of Murphy High, may step in and push for a starting nod. Sophomores *Brian Winland* from Roswell, Ga. and *Michael Cummins* from McKinney, Tex., should see action in a relief role.

Senior catcher *Oscar Tomasich* (.265) and sophomore third baseman *Tim Hilpert* (.381, 28 RBI), a pair of All-GCAC conference selections, return. Tomasich is expected to provide the on-field defensive leadership while Hilpert, along with junior left fielder *Shea Grandquest* (.270 40BI), and sophomore designated hitter *Jason Kelly* (.280, 30 RBI), are expected to provide a majority of the offensive punch.

Among the newcomers are a foursome of junior college transfers. Junior shortstop *Dan Veres* from Faulkner U., along with fellow infielders *Sean Yanes* from Brevard JC, Fla., *David Baez* from Seminole JC, and outfielder *Colin Uter* from Southwest Mississippi JC, will be expected to step in and make an immediate impact. Talented freshman outfielder *Jason Kuehl*, Oregon High in Wis. transfer senior catcher *Randy McKinion* from nearby South Alabama, and redshirt freshman *George O'Dwyer* from St. Johns, La., are expected to make significant contributions to the Badger offensive attack.

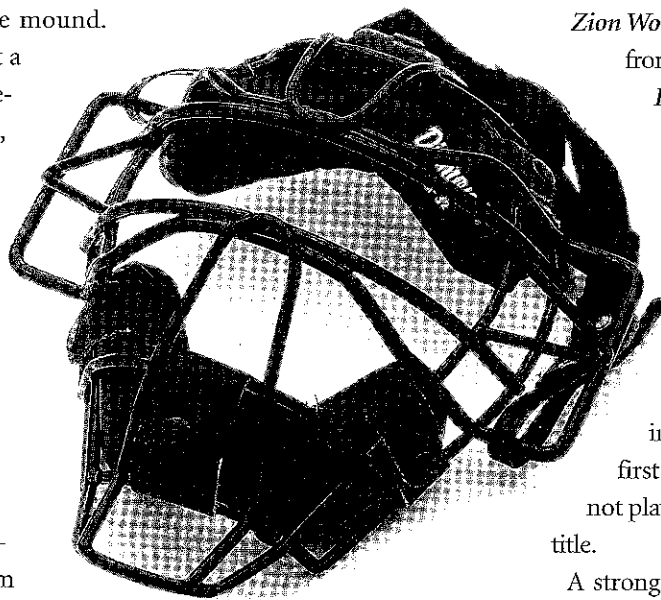
Junior outfielders *Darryl McPherson* from Murphy High, *Mike Brabner* from McGill Toolen High, catcher *John Steen* from Metairie, La., sophomores infielder/pitcher *Zion Wooldrige* from Lillian and *Jared Labue* from DeRidder, La., along with freshman *Dan Rhames* from Bay Minette round out the roster.

"We're as deep and strong defensively as ever," Sims said. "If we hit in the clutch, we could win 40 plus."

Winning has been a part of Badgers baseball over the last decade with three conference titles in the last 10 years. Last year was the first time in five years the Badgers were not playing for the conference tournament title.

A strong non-conference schedule includes West Florida, Huntingdon College and Auburn-Montgomery. An equally tough Gulf Coast Athletic Conference slate including defending conference champion William Carey College awaits the Badgers this season.

"Although we have one of the strongest overall schedules in the South, the critical part of our schedule will be at the end of the season," Sims said. "How well we play at the end of the season is key in the NAIA. Our conference, as a whole, is getting stronger, and we need to play well at the end of the season if we're going to win the conference tournament."

Frank Sims enters the 1996 season as the winningest baseball coach in Spring Hill history. He earned his 300th win last season as the Badgers went on to a successful 30-20 record.

Under his leadership, SHC has enjoyed much success in the post-season with three Gulf Coast Athletic Conference titles and two trips to the NAIA national tournament. His 1992 team went 40-15 and set 18 team, individual and conference records.

Sims began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater, Eastern Illinois University where he earned his bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation. After one season at EIU, Sims moved on to Sparta High School in Illinois where he served as an assistant coach for football and basketball in addition to head coaching duties for the baseball teams. Sims posted a 44-18 record in three seasons on the diamond.

After his experience at Sparta, Sims moved on and subsequently earned his master's degree in H.P.E.R. from Morehead State in Kentucky in 1980. He later became the head baseball coach at Milton College where his squad finished 36-10, narrowly missing a berth in the NAIA World Series. Two seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater followed before he became the head coach of the Badgers late in the 1985 season.

Now in his fourth year as Athletic Director, Sims is a member of the executive committee of the NAIA World Series where he serves as chairperson of the International Play Committee. He also has been an assistant coach for the local Mobile Baysharks of the Texas-Louisiana Professional Baseball League the past two seasons.

Frank and his wife Dana have four children, Drew, 11, Sarah, 8, Kelsey, 6 and Brian, 4.

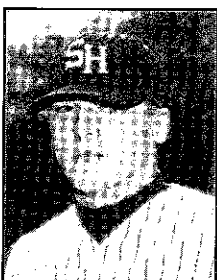


#12 Eric Busby

Mike was a redshirt last year and is another young man who is getting better. "Mike is learning and if he keeps working, he will pitch some games for us."

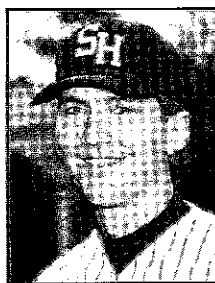

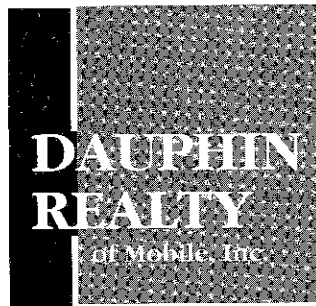

Cooney Returns to Alma Mater to Guide Youthful Badger Men's Golf Team in 1996

The 1996 edition of the Spring Hill College men's golf squad is younger than usual. The roster features eight underclassmen, many of whom have become seasoned veterans who will lead the Badgers through a challenging spring tournament schedule into a hopeful berth in the national tournament.

First-year head coach Barry Cooney returns to his alma mater and inherits a program with a proven number one and two freshmen who will more than likely emerge as the number two and three starters.

At the top of the returnee list is *Keith Hoard*. The talented sophomore from Louisville, Ky., narrowly missed a berth as an individual in last year's national tournament. Cooney is relying on Hoard's consistent game to spur the team's chances in tournaments. Hoard was the only freshman to participate in all of the tournaments last spring as well as the fall tournament season. "By far he's been our most consistent player," Cooney said. "He is very dedicated and has the skills to be a leader on this team."

Two newcomers that could make an immediate impact are freshmen *Burt Cestia* from New Iberia, La., and *Mike Anderson* from Baton Rouge, La.. In addition to their high school golf programs, both participated in local junior golf programs near their hometown. Cooney believes this experience will be a plus in tournament play this spring. "I'm looking for both of them (Cestia and Anderson) to continue the successes they've enjoyed and to improve as the season progresses," Cooney said.

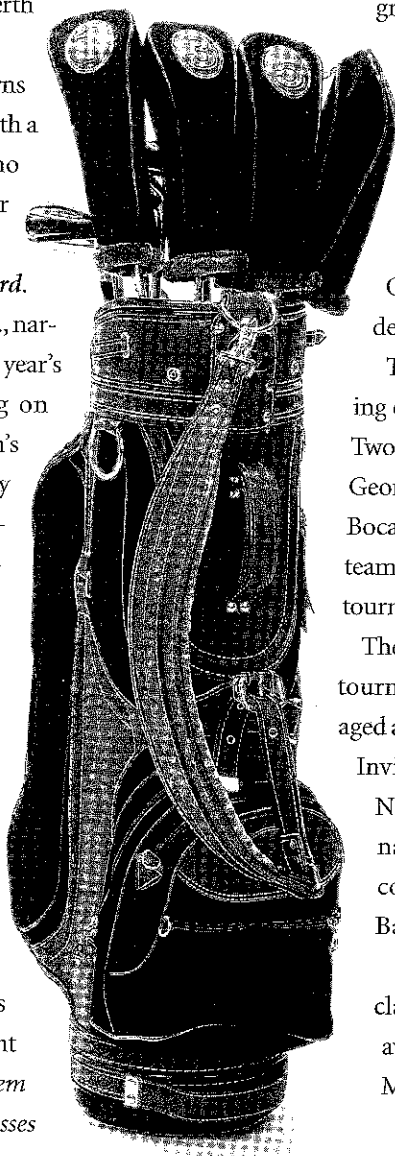
The final two spots for playing time will be challenged by seven players. The two returning upperclassmen, senior *Ciaran Fitzpatrick* from Buffalo, and junior *Craig Alcon* from Chalmette, La., will be relied upon to provide leadership for the group this spring. Sophomore *Barry Steiner* from St. Louis, played in each fall tournament, and should be a factor this spring.

The remaining four players on the roster are freshmen. *Pat Madigan* from St. Louis, *Brad Usher* from Dallas, *Chris Roselle* from Philadelphia, and *Bennett Bowers* from Augusta, Ga., will join the others in qualifying rounds to determine the lineup for the season.

The 1996 spring schedule has the Badgers squaring off against some of the best teams in the nation. Two of these tournaments, the Berry Invitational in Georgia, and the NAIA Southeastern Invitational in Boca Raton, Fla., will be loaded with a nucleus of teams that have perennially appeared in the national tournament.

The Badgers have already completed in a prestigious tournament this past fall in Tampa, Fla. SHC managed a third place finish out of 23 teams in the Webber Invitational which was loaded with top NAIA and NCAA Division I and II teams. The strong tournament finish should earn the Badgers national consideration in the first poll, although the Badgers did not make the top 25 in pre-season.

With strong leadership from a rising underclassmen group, the Badgers may earn the long awaited berth in the national tournament this May in Tulsa, Oklahoma..

Cooney played golf at nearby McGill-Toolen High School for four years where he had the opportunity to play in the Alabama State Golf Championships as a junior and senior.

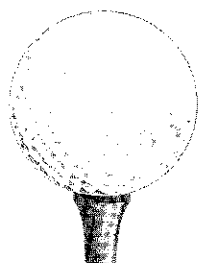

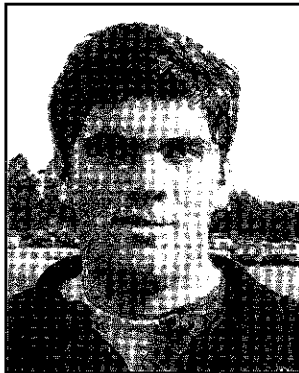

Bianco Looks to Guide Lady Badgers Women's Golf Team to Third-Straight National Tournament Appearance

The Spring Hill College Lady Badgers golf team has earned two trips to the NAIA National Tournament, an impressive accomplishment for a four-year old program.

Finishing third at the inaugural Sprint-NAIA National Championships in Sioux City, Iowa, in 1994 and fifth in last year's championships, the team is gearing up for a run at a third-straight national tournament appearance.

The 1996 roster is deep in talent and experience. Three Lady Badgers seniors have been on the roster since the program's inception back 1993. First year head coach Amber Bianco will rely on returning NAIA All-American *Cookie Strong*, Mobile, *Dina Hines*, Mobile, and *Meg Ekins*, Batesville, Ind., to provide the leadership needed to guide the team through a competitive spring tournament schedule.

Strong placed ninth at the 1995 nationals, and Bianco expects a lot from her this season, including a top-five finish. "She loves the game, and has a very good attitude towards the game," Bianco said. "She maintains the momentum that flows from the first to the 18th green."

Bianco also expects a lot from Hines, whom she considers one of the "hardest working persons" on the team. Ekins, currently a member of the Lady Badger basketball team, will join the team at the end of basketball season.

Fellow NAIA All-American *Margaret McDowell*, Birmingham, is one of three talented underclassmen that returns for her sophomore season. Strong, consistent play led McDowell to an eleventh place finish at last year's national tournament.

The remaining members of the roster are very strong for different reasons, Bianco says. Junior *Hanna Krehling* from nearby Foley is the power hitter of the group. Fellow junior *Tracy Allu* of Washington, Pa., is able to create the shots to get out of trouble, while sophomore *Emily Gaia*, Memphis, Tenn., plays a good iron game.

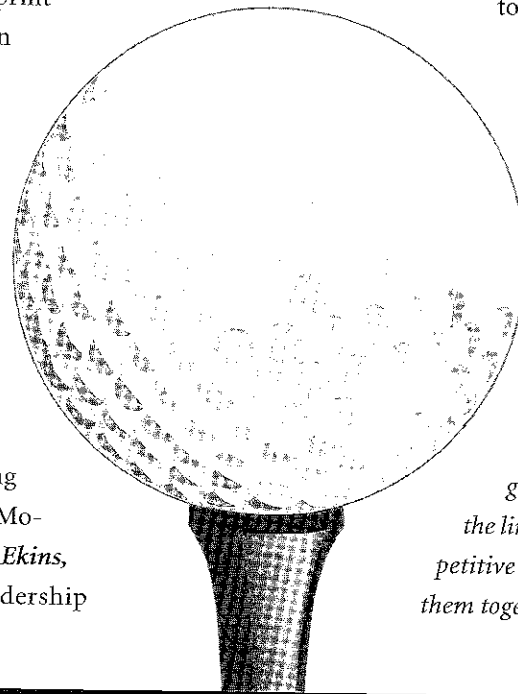
"If they get their short game together, and they gain confidence, the sky is the limit," Bianco said. "They are all very competitive and have different strengths which pulls them together as a group."

The Lady Badgers will enter the spring season coming off a strong fall campaign that included their lowest single round in school history (326) in an eventual fourth-place finish at the Tennessee Tech Invitational.

The Lady Badgers will also have an opportunity to face top competition as they host the Spring Hill College Invitational at the Linksman Golf Course in Mo-

bile, from March 11-13.

Bianco is hopeful that the spring tournament schedule can serve as the springboard for a third-straight national tournament appearance.

Spring Hill College gave first-year head coach Amber Bianco the reins to a team that has rapidly risen to one of the nationally ranked teams in the NAIA, in only its fourth year of existence.

Bianco, who earned her bachelor of arts degree in criminal justice with a minor in political science, was a member of the University of Alabama-Birmingham women's golf team for four years, a team that regularly finished in the top ten at tournaments. Bianco's best finish as an individual was eighth at the 1994 Great Midwest Conference Tournament in her senior year.

Bianco, who has been involved with golf for over a decade, has worked at area tournaments, has helped out at golf clinics and taught private lessons. She played four years at Murphy High School and was the only girl on the team for three years before joining the first girls golf team at the school in 1990.

Bianco works as an administrator for a local insurance brokerage house, a job she has held since her college graduation.



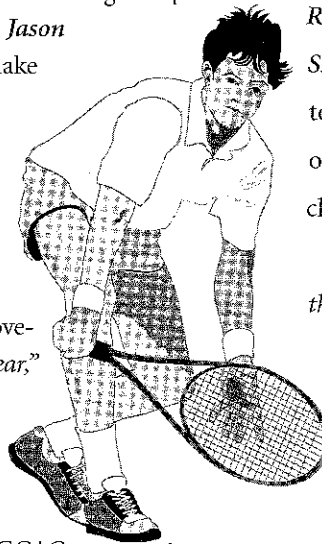
Roster Depth and Doubles Play Key as 1996 Badger Men's Tennis Season Begins
