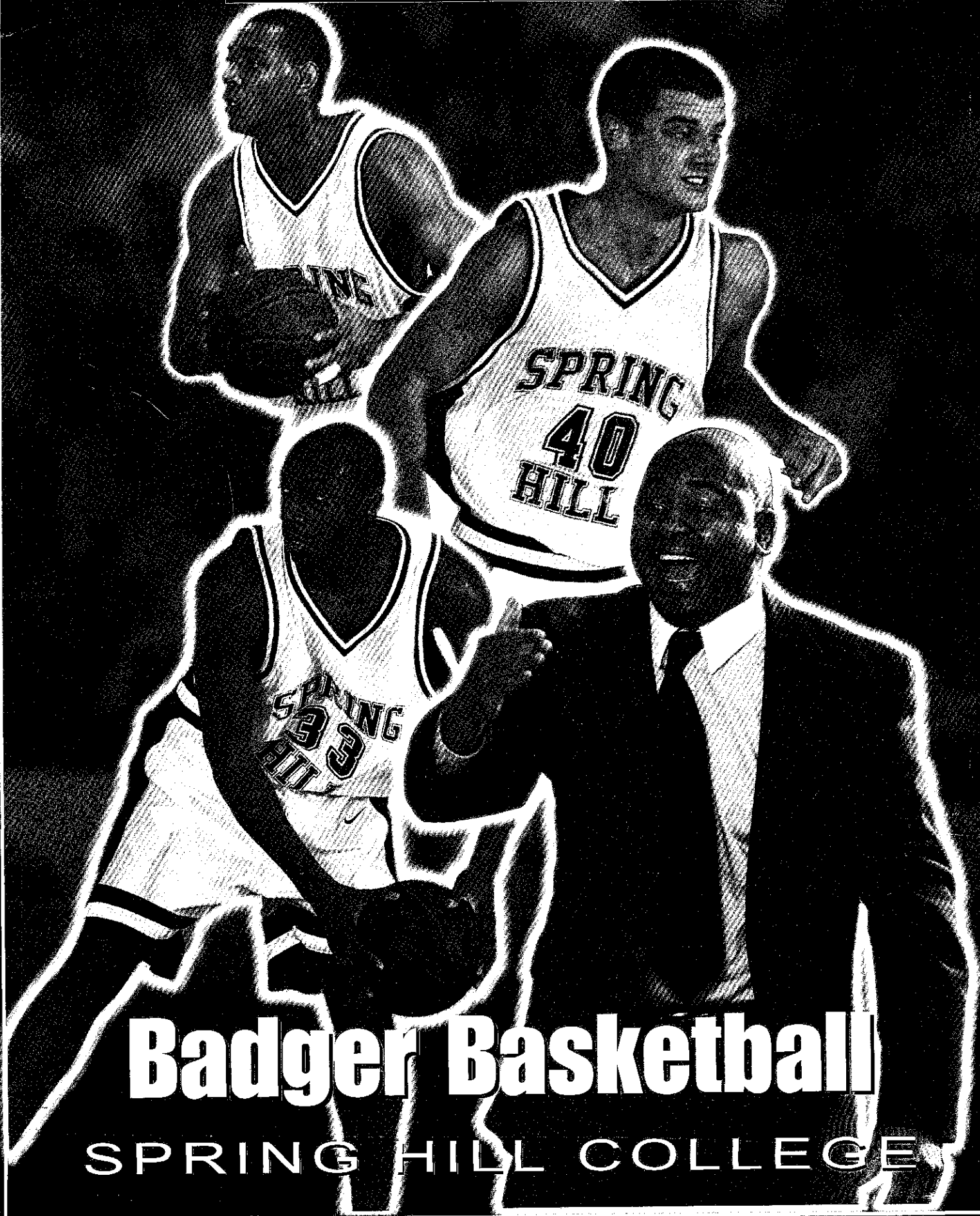

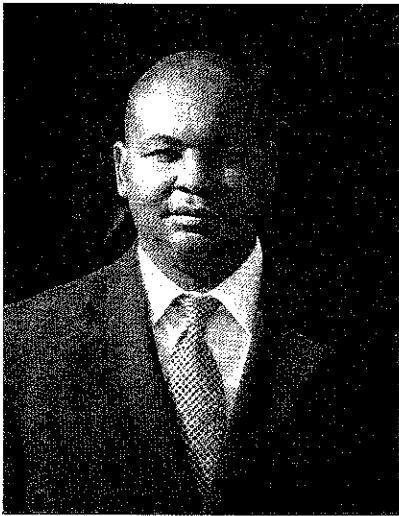

Head Coach Robert Thompson

Entering his second season as the head coach for Spring Hill, Robert Thompson has begun ushering in a new era of Badger Basketball.

He guided the Badgers to a 17-18 record in his first season. Now, as he continues to recruit the highest caliber student-athletes to Spring Hill, Thompson wants to make his mark in Badger history.

A native of Tupelo, Miss., Thompson comes to Spring Hill after four years as head coach at Arkansas Tech University, in Russellville. He took over the coaching position at Arkansas Tech in 1999 and led the Wonder Boys to their first Gulf South Conference (GSC) tournament berth and a ranking of eighth in the NCAA Division II South Regional in the 1999-2000 season. Thompson was also named GSC Coach of the Year after his first season at Arkansas Tech.

Before Coach Thompson became Arkansas Tech's 18th head coach, he served as Delta State University's assistant men's coach from '96-'99. While in Cleveland, Miss., Thompson helped lead the Statesmen to the Gulf South Conference West Division Title in '96-'97 and '97-'98, Gulf South Conference Tournament Champions in '96-'97 and '97-'98, NCAA Division II South Regional Champions in '97-'98, and the NCAA Division II Elite Eight in '97-'98.

Thompson is familiar with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference (GCAC) having served as assistant men's basketball coach and head cross-country coach at Belhaven College (Jackson, MS) from 1993-1996. He was also a member of the Belhaven team from 1988-1992.

Coach Thompson earned his bachelor of science in physical education from Belhaven College in 1993. He then received his master's of science in Education from Jackson State University in 1997. He and his wife, Alfreda, have two children, Joshua Cordell (6) and Justin Lydell (1).

Jason Williams begins his second year as an assistant coach at Spring Hill College. A native of Marshalltown, Iowa, he attended Marshalltown High School and Marshalltown Community College before joining head coach Robert Thompson at Arkansas Tech University.

At Marshalltown C.C., Coach Williams lettered twice in basketball and golf and received his A.A. degree. He then moved onto Arkansas Tech, where he played for Thompson. Williams is ranked in the school's top five for three-point field goal percentage in a season. He lettered twice in basketball and received his bachelor's degree in management marketing in December of 2003 from Arkansas Tech University.



Assistant Coach Kenneth Ray

Kenneth Ray begins his first season as an assistant coach at Spring Hill College. A native of Benndale, Miss., he attended George County High School where he played varsity basketball for three seasons with current NFL wide receiver Eric Moulds.

Ray received his A.A. degree at Gulf Coast Community College where he served as a manager for the team in 1993 and then as the assistant coach last season. Ray is currently working on his B.S. in biology at Spring Hill.

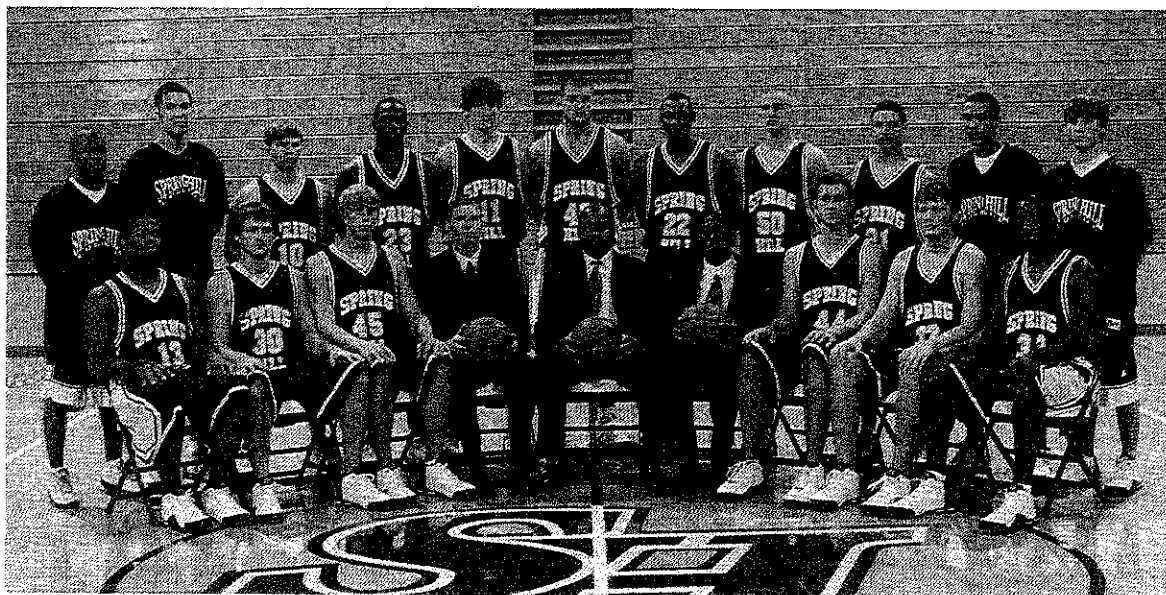

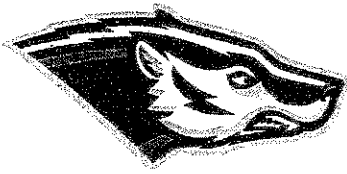

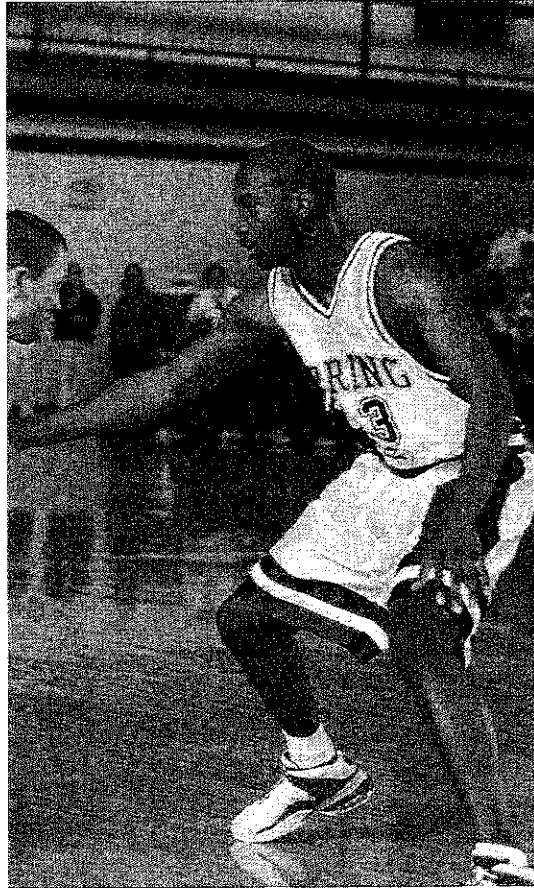
As Robert Thompson begins his second season at the helm of the Spring Hill men's basketball program, it is evident that he is beginning to put his mark on the program. The Badgers welcome 11 new players to campus to compliment the six returners from last year's squad.

Guards:

"I think that we are going to be a lot better at guard than we were last season. Ugo Ezekwe, who transferred from the University of South Alabama, will not be eligible to play until the second semester, but is very strong and can handle the ball very well at the point. He is very quick to the basket and is a very unselfish player. I will feel very comfortable with him in our system once he is able to play. Josh Matthews is the only senior on the team and will be a leader at the two-guard. He is very quick and agile and he has accepted his role as the leader. Last year he came off the bench, but this year we are expecting him to come out and play with some intensity right from the beginning. Griggs Covington is a junior college transfer who is a very solid shooter and a big presence at the guard position. He plays tough and is not afraid to go on the floor for loose balls or go inside to pull down rebounds, he is a great team player and should fit very well into our system," Thompson said.

"Scotty Fletcher is another junior college transfer who will get a lot of work in the first half of the season. He is a great shooter and an extension of me on the floor. He is a very smart player and only takes good shots. He

has come in and learned very quickly what we want to do and is another great addition to this team. Rob Murray is a very talented freshman who will be backing up Fletcher, but will see some playing time. He is a 6-3 point guard who will become a very valuable player in the years to come as he continues to get bigger and stronger. He makes very good decisions on the floor and plays solid defense," Thompson said.



"Krisner Green is a great shooter who will play behind Matthews this season. He is another junior college transfer who will make an immediate impact on this team. He is a pure shooter and can bring you back into a game very quickly with his ability to shoot from long range. Chris Baldwin converted from the post last year to play in the three spot. He has improved a lot since last year and is a very big, athletic presence for us. He is a driver and a slasher, but he can also pull up and hit a big jump shot as well. He understands the game very well and plays hard."

Post Players:

"Chris Miernicki is a tough kid from Chicago. You look at him and you think you should wear him out, but at the end of the game he has held his opponent to four or five points. He gets inside the paint and just works hard for every loose ball and every rebound. I am really excited about Barkley Falkner, who is a freshman from Oxford, Miss. He is very strong and very aggressive and plays the game with an authority. He really changes the dimensions of our team inside the paint; he can score, he can rebound and he under-

stands the game and knows what everyone around him is doing. Lars

Hosel, from Germany, is another returning player that we have in the post who has improved a lot since last year and is really starting to understand the American style of game and the aggressiveness that comes with it. Cash Covington is a great freshman shooter. He is very comparable to Baldwin with his size and his ability to come out and shoot the three.

Schedule:

"We are playing three NCAA Division I schools this year and it gives us a chance to see where we are before the conference season starts. Hopefully we can go out and be respectable opponents in these games and not get blown out.



By playing these games it gives our guys a chance to play Division I basketball. I tell our

guys that when we play those games, that they are now playing Division I basketball and it gives them an extra boost of energy and they play hard. We played McNeese State and South Alabama last year and only lost by 13 and 11 points in those games, so we know that we can go out and be competitive.

Outlook:

"This is going to be a very exciting team to watch. They are going to play hard and play smart. We have a lot more depth than we did last year. They are a very family oriented bunch, they hang out with each other off the court and understand their roles on the team."

Doug Mosley begins his first full season as Director of Athletics and Recreation for Spring Hill College. Mosley, who began his duties in December 2003, oversees all the day-to-day operations of the College's Department of Athletics and Recreation.

Mosley came to Spring Hill after serving as the Assistant Director of Athletic Development at Troy University. While at Troy, Mosley helped launch the Red Wave executive suites program at Movie Gallery Veterans Stadium and managed 27 suites for university boosters and fans. Prior to that, Mosley served as marketing and public relations manager for Comcast Sports Southeast (CSS) where he helped grow the company to become the nation's seventh-largest regional sports network.

As Director of Sports Information, Broadcasting and Technology for the NAIA from 1996 to 2000, Mosley planned and directed event publicity for 23 national championships annually, served as an association spokesperson, produced and syndicated NAIA events for national broadcast and launched the NAIA website. Mosley also has extensive experience at the international sports level, serving as the softball venue press chief during the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, a representative for Kodak's photographer services at the 1998 Goodwill Games in New York and a USOC track and field press attache during the 1999 Pan Am Games in Winnipeg. He has also been active in the USOC's Olympic Public Relations Association (OPRA).

Mosley has more than 14 years of sports media and marketing experience and is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA). He was formerly a member of the board of directors for both the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and the NAIA Sports Information Directors Association (NAIA-SIDA). He's been a sports writer for the Pensacola News-Journal and the Leaf Chronicle (Clarksville, Tenn.) and was sports information director for Auburn University Montgomery from 1994-96.

Mosley earned his bachelor's in business administration and marketing from Culver-Stockton College in Canton, Mo., where he played varsity football and tennis. He's married to Stacy and has one son, Luke (2).

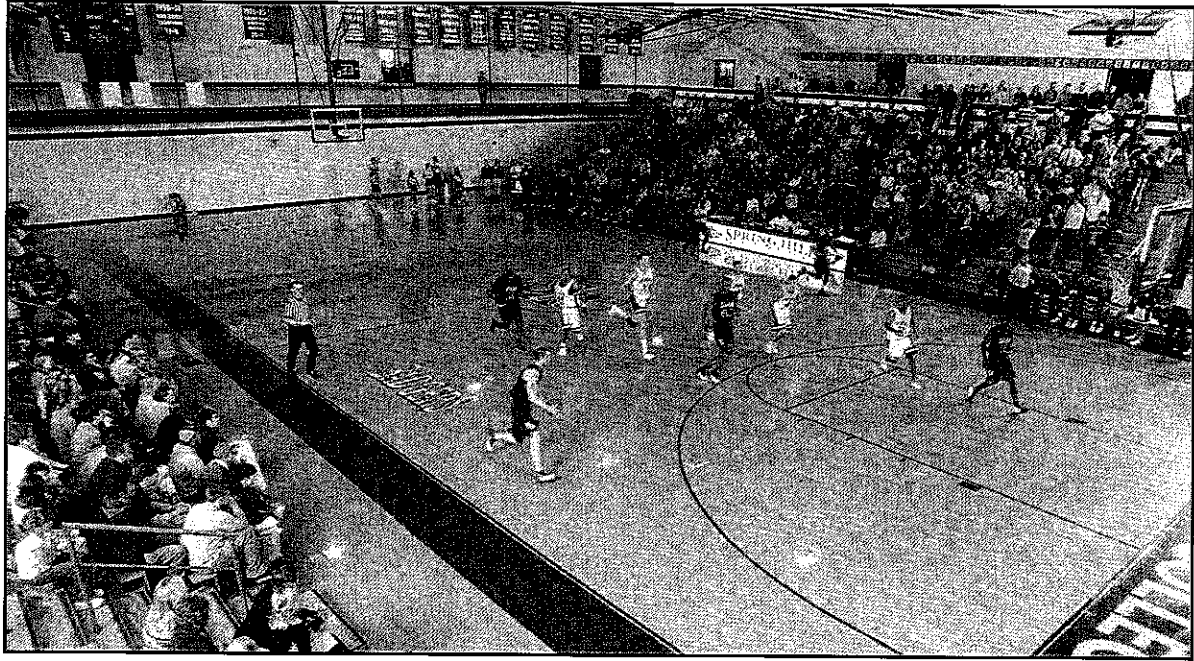

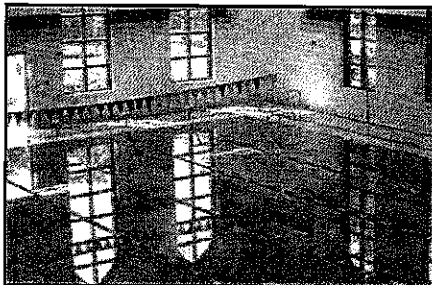

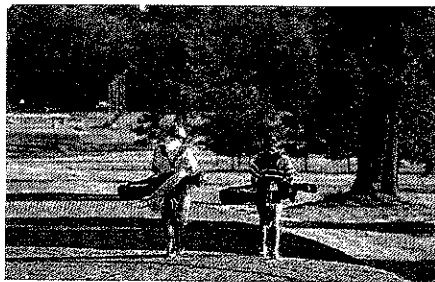

The GCAC first made its appearance in 1981, with Belhaven, College of Jackson, Dillard, Xavier, Louisiana College, Spring Hill, Tougaloo, and William Carey as charter members. Since then, College of Jackson and Louisiana College have left, while Talladega College has come and gone. Also, Mobile joined in 1985, SUNO in 1995, and LSU-Shreveport in 2000. The GCAC then and now brought together schools with similar standards – private four-year schools, in the Gulf Coast region, who play in the NAIA.

The GCAC holds conference championships in the sports of women's soccer, men's and women's cross-country, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, and men's golf.

In 2003-04, Spring Hill College brought home a conference championship in men's tennis and volleyball.

Throughout its history, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) has provided strong leadership for all aspects of intercollegiate sports. Since its introduction of intercollegiate championship basketball in 1937, the NAIA has maintained the highest standards while administering first-rate athletics programs.

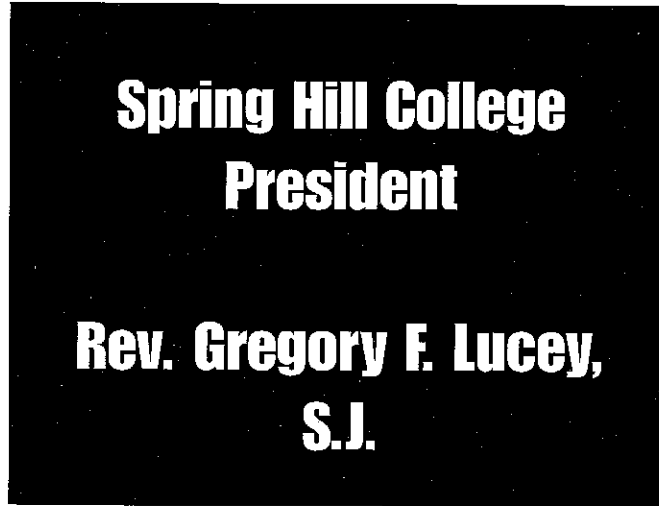
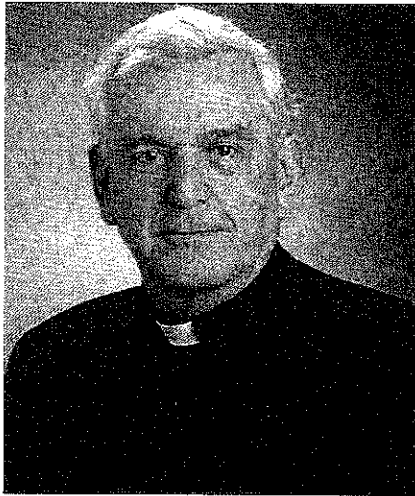
The NAIA awards student-athletes with awards for academic achievements, awarding juniors and seniors with a 3.5GPA or higher. They give All-American awards for those athletes who excel in competition. The NAIA also recognizes student-athletes, coaches, and schools through the Champions of Character program. The goal of the Champions of Character program is to promote the true spirit of competition through five tenets: respect, integrity, responsibility, servant leadership, and sportsmanship.

There are currently more than 300 schools and more than 47,000 student-athletes competing in one of 13 NAIA regions and 30 NAIA sport conferences. Hundreds of NAIA students are recognized annually as All-American Scholar-Athletes, and thousands more are honored on the conference level. There are 23 NAIA national championships held every year in 13 sports, as well as championships held at the regional, sectional, and conference levels.

Rev. Gregory F. Lucey, S.J. became Spring Hill College's 37th President on June 1, 1997, and from the beginning his leadership has made a significant impact on the College. With a Vision for the College on the Hill, Fr. Lucey has set into motion plans that have led to record enrollment, development and implementation of a comprehensive Campus Master Plan, and construction of a new library resource center that will not only benefit the Spring Hill community, but all of Mobile. In addition, Fr. Lucey is strengthening the college to be attractive for students and effective in achieving its mission by developing state-of-the-art learning spaces such as those in the newly renovated Quinlan Hall. He is also enhancing faculty development, providing better living spaces, restoring St. Josephs Chapel, and building the endowment.

Fr. Lucey often remarks that for alumni returning to Spring Hill, the campus experience takes on a new meaning as they see the transformation taking place. Under his guidance, the campus has seen the completion of a new 150-bed residence hall as well as parking and circulation changes designed to make the campus safer and more pedestrian friendly. The College also celebrated its first-ever night baseball games in Spring 2003 as lights were added to Galle Field.

Under Fr. Lucey's direction, Spring Hill College has enjoyed record fund-raising years, including record gifts totaling \$13.5 million from alumnus and trustee Skip Viragh '68 (1941-2003). Fr. Lucey's goal is to enrich the Spring Hill Experience for every student while making the 174-year old institution a premier, small, residential, Catholic liberal arts college in the Jesuit tradition.

Prior to Spring Hill, Fr. Lucey served as President and Chairman of the Board of the National Jesuit Conference based in Washington, D.C. Additionally, Fr. Lucey served as rector for the Jesuit Community at Marquette University and Vice President for Development at Seattle University. He received a Ph.D. in educational administration from the University of Wisconsin at Madison, an M.A. in liturgy from the University of Notre Dame, as well as undergraduate and graduate degrees in philosophy from St. Louis University.

A Wisconsin native, Fr. Lucey entered the Society of Jesus in 1951 and was ordained in 1964. He founded and served as director of Marquette's Center for Ignatian Spirituality and in 1995 he attended the 34th General Congregation of the Society of Jesus as one of 200 delegates worldwide. He is a trustee of Loyola University, New Orleans and Marquette University.

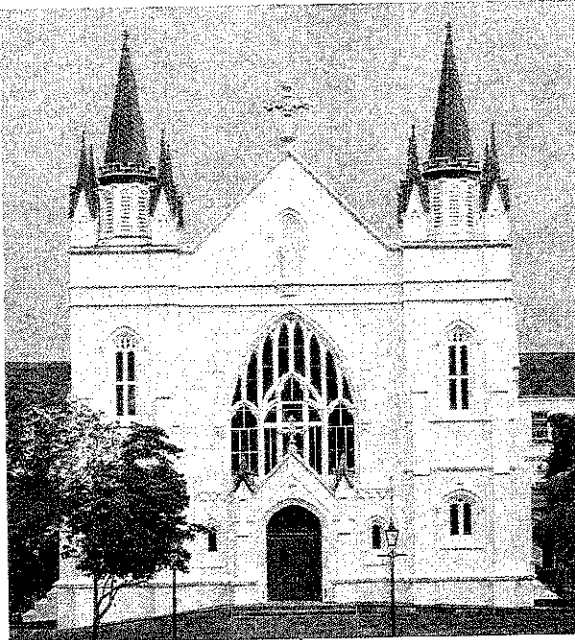

At Spring Hill, we will introduce you to academic subjects you've never seen before – and give the ones you thought you knew a deeper context and a new fascination. You'll be challenged by teachers and other students in a friendly classroom environment to develop a position based on critical thinking and synthesis, defend that position articulately, and write about it persuasively. Faculty will help you – one on one – to acquire depth and judgment. As you make connections between subjects, especially those in the core curriculum, you'll develop the intellectual agility necessary to succeed in a changing world.



A Solid Core

The core curriculum, based in the liberal arts and sciences, sets Spring Hill apart from other colleges. At 54-60 hours and 18-20 courses, it accounts for almost half of the graduation requirements. The core includes studies in English and literature, history, philosophy, theology, foreign language, social science, mathematics, computer science, laboratory science and fine arts. And because everyone who graduates from Spring Hill completes the core, you'll be in class with all kinds of diverse majors – not just people who are interested in the same things you are. It's an eye-opening experience.

Grow Your Spirit

In the spirit of St. Ignatius, who founded the Jesuit order in 1540, Campus Ministry programs involve each element – mind, body and spirit. When Spring Hill students do a street feed, for example, first they study the problem, examining statistics and discussing issues to see where the injustice lies. Then they go do the work, physically engaging with the homeless. Finally comes the reflection, prayer and spiritual growth. Other projects include Christmas on the Hill, Spring Break Immersion Trips, Urban Immersion weekends, and Habitat for Humanity.

Liturgies twice daily give the opportunity for the Spring Hill community to join in prayer. The school year opens with a Mass of the Holy Spirit each fall, and an Ecumenical Prayer Service is held at the beginning of each spring semester.

Feel at Home

The 450-acre Spring Hill campus is spectacular – to anyone who has entered from Dauphin Street and driven through an immaculate 18-hole golf course, or anyone who has strolled down the Avenue of the Oaks leading to the 150-year-old, white-columned Stewartfield House. It has 36 buildings, many of which are designated historic monuments. It's a park-like setting, perfect for jogging, golfing, dog-walking or just relaxing on a gorgeous Alabama day. The campus combines convenience with ambiance.

About 80% of our students – and 91% of our freshmen – live on campus in one of seven residence halls. Each room has Internet

access, comes with a full cable package, and is air-conditioned, of course!

But the most important part of the room, the floor, and the hall is the way students there nurture the friendships that influence you for the rest of your life. When you live together, you can take advantage of those spur-of-the-moment opportunities that turn out to be a blast. It's an experience, and an educational dimension, that you can't get at a commuter institution.

We offer four-year guaranteed housing in our residence halls and apartments, so you won't find yourself scrambling for off-campus accommodations. The suite-based Fairway Apartments, opened in 1996, offer convenience combined with sweeping golf course views. No surprise

that it's the first choice of many juniors and seniors.

Viragh Hall, a three-story student residence completed in 2002, houses about 146 students in non-traditional suite-style living. Each six-to-eight-person suite consists of two-person bedrooms, a shared living room, two bathrooms and an outdoor patio. A kitchen area, computer room and lounge provide space for socializing.

A new student residence, set to open for the 2005 fall semester will accommodate 222 people in single and double rooms connected by a bath between each pair. The U-shaped complex features an interior courtyard, two 40-seat classrooms, study rooms and bright, airy public gathering spaces.

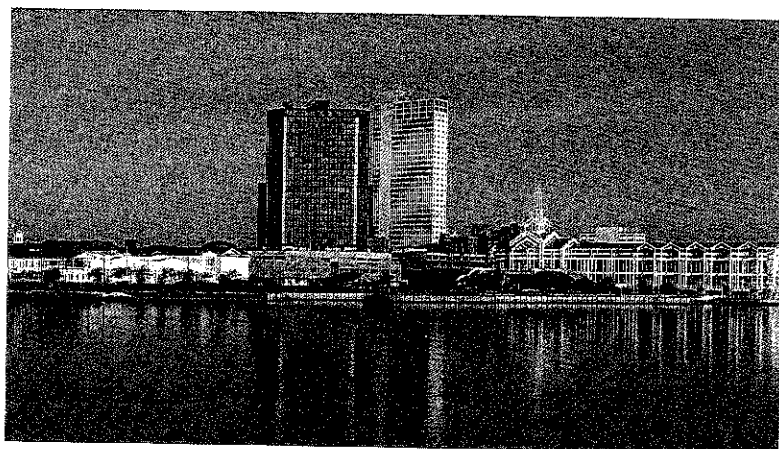


Going to Mardi Gras

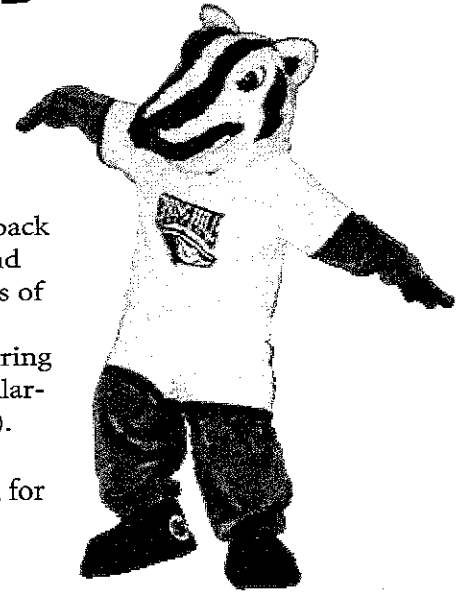
