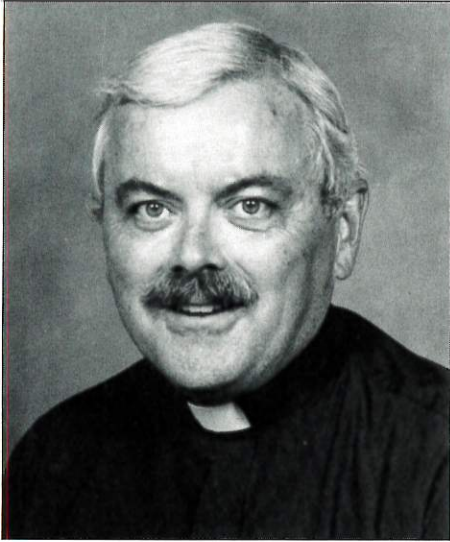

SEASON OUTLOOK

On paper, the 1990 Spring Hill College Badgers may look to have some very big gaps to fill. With the loss of three starters due to graduation, the Badgers may look as though they are rebuilding; however, Coach Carl Nash does not think so.

"We have seven returning lettermen and six of them have started one time or another" said Nash, who enters his second full season as head coach. "There will have to be some players step forward and take charge, it doesn't matter if it's a veteran or a new signee."

The bright area for Nash and his team is on the front line with 2-time All-District performer John Jerkins leading the group. Senior Ron McDonald turned in some stellar performances with his shot-blocking and rebounding abilities and Senior Marcus Nettles is a tenacious player that is said to be the Badgers best over-all athlete. Jerkins, a 6'4" Junior averaged 17.3 points a game and 8 rebounds per contest. Coach Nash knows the strengths of his big people, but realizes that they must work hard on fundamentals to make up for their lack of size. We are smaller than some in our conference, so we have to make up for that by being stronger and smarter", states Nash.

A real battle that's brewing is for the point guard position. Junior Mark Flint and Sophomore Sean Wright are working to take over and solidify the spot that has been the Badgers biggest question for a couple of years.

With the graduation of All-District performer Mike McKinley, Nash looks to fill that void with an impressive list of returners and newcomers. P.J. Thelen a part-time starter last season and newcomer Kirk DePriest will be vying for that swing guard position. Thelen, a 6'6" Sophomore played a big part in some key wins last year

and is the leading candidate for the job, however, Kirk DePriest, a highly touted Jr. College transfer from Seminole Jr. College, will be right on Thelens' heels for the position.

Jerome LeBlanc, a Jr. College transfer from Georgia and Anton Chatman, a Freshman from Talladega, Alabama will be used in several key roles as time progresses. Sophomore Brad Copenhaver is looked at to give depth inside as he did last season.

The rest of Nash's recruits are a solid group of players. Sam Coates, an All-State player in Louisiana who prepped at Runnels High School in Baton Rouge, will push for a role inside. Kevin Andrews from Tucker Georgia, Josh Guilbeau from New Iberia, Louisiana and Chris Graefe from West Palm Beach, Florida are strong players who will add depth to a solid team.

Once again, Nash feels that the defense, not the offense, will keep the Badgers in many games. "We will score points, we all know that. However, our defense is something I was disappointed with last year. We will be better defensively", said Nash.

Spring Hill will need that defense especially in their pre-conference outings. The Badgers face Washburn University, Livingston University, and NAIA National Champion Birmingham-Southern. NAIA powers Montevallo and Arkansas College are also coming to town. In the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference play, the Badgers will be battling against a very balanced league with William Carey, Louisiana College, Dillard, and cross-town rival Mobile College, all vying for the Districts bid to the NAIA National Tournament. "It's hard to say who has the best shot to go to Nationals", states Coach Nash. "Our District always surprises me, someone will sneak up on the rest."

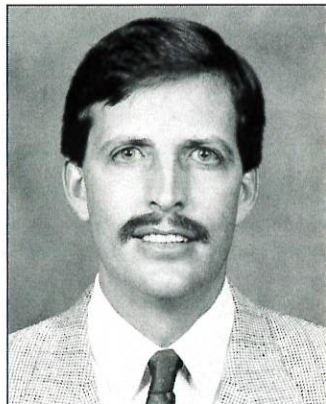

Carl Nash, Head Coach



Coach Carl Nash is entering his second full season as head coach for the Spring Hill Badgers. Nash, who took over the head coaching duties in January of 1989, has guided the Badgers to two consecutive trips to the District 30 playoffs. Last season, Nash led Spring Hill to its best finish ever in the District 30 playoffs.

Nash who hails from Del Norte Colorado, was a stellar athlete in basketball and baseball. He attended Colorado State University in Fort Collins and Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colorado, where he graduated in 1982. He has a master's degree from the United States Sports Academy.

Nash began his coaching career at Durango High School. He also coached in Farmington, New Mexico before coming to Spring Hill College in 1984 as a graduate assistant. In 1985 Nash left his native country to coach in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia's International Basketball program, and compiled a 27-7 record winning numerous championships along the way. Nash rejoined the Badgers in 1986 as an assistant coach and each season Spring Hill reached the playoffs. He also has a very impressive 67-34 lifetime

coaching record. That's a .663 winning percentage.

Coach Nash is married to the former Pamela Meier of Raleigh, North Carolina. Nash and his wife are avid scuba divers, which naturally attracted them to the Gulf Coast.

Rick Pietri, Assistant Coach

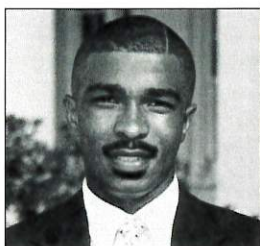


Rick Pietri enters his second year as an assistant coach at Spring Hill. Last year Pietri helped guide the Badgers to their fourth consecutive play-off appearance.

Prior to coming to Spring Hill, Archible coached in the Mobile Collegiate Summer League.

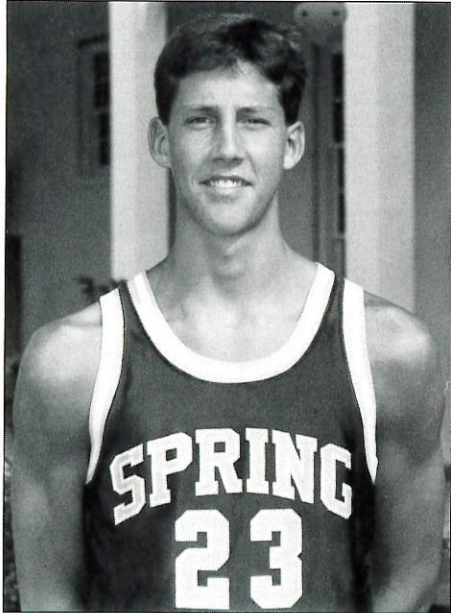
Coach Archible is a graduate of Alabama State University. Angelo and his wife, Jean have two children, Angelo Jr. and Ketría.

Sophomore 6-6 185 lbs. Guard Lakeside Park, KY

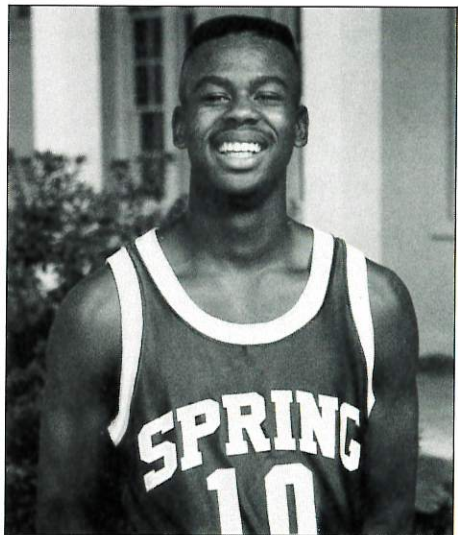

In his spare time, Ron likes to ride motorcycles, go horseback riding, and spend time with his family. Ron is majoring in Public Relations and Sociology.

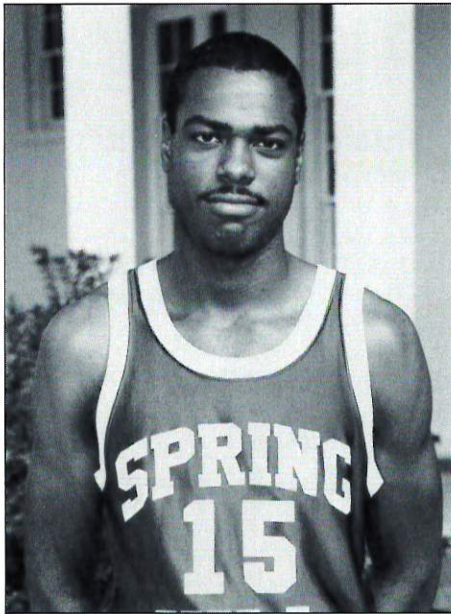

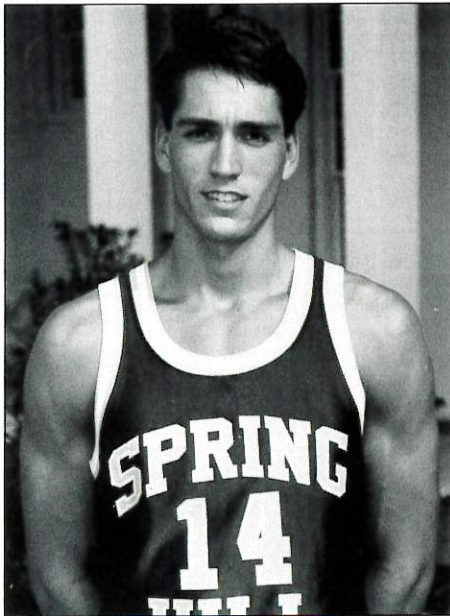

In his spare time Kirk enjoys fishing and skiing.

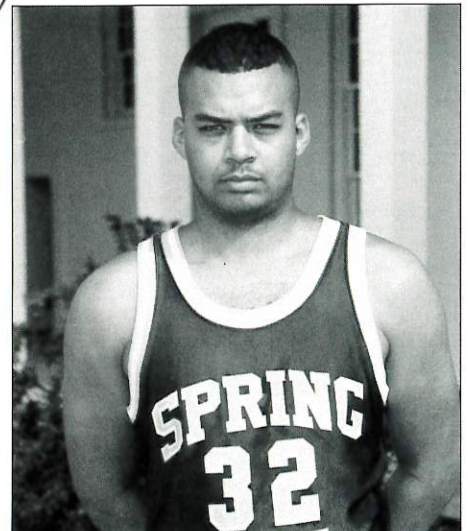
JEROME LEBLANC 32

Jerome enjoys reading, fishing, and swimming in his spare time. His major is International Business. Jerome was Phi Theta Kappa at Bishop State Jr. College.



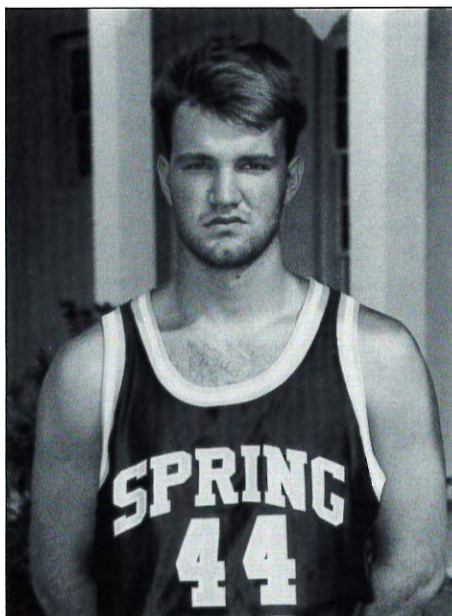

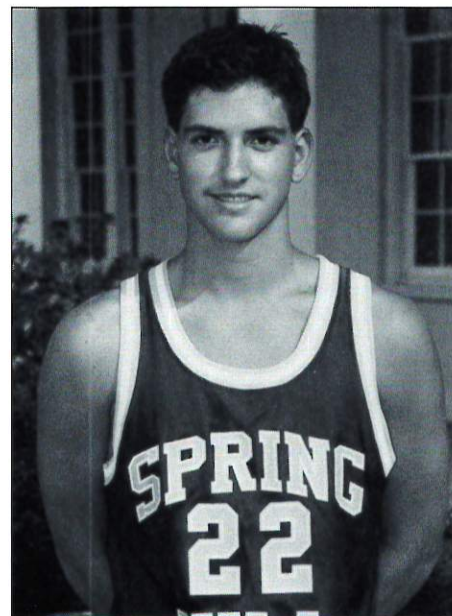

Anton enjoys tennis, music, fishing, playing the piano, and his math and science studies. His major is Pre-Engineering.

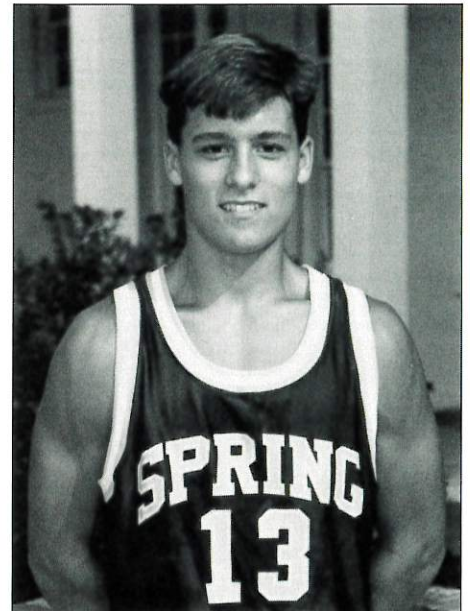

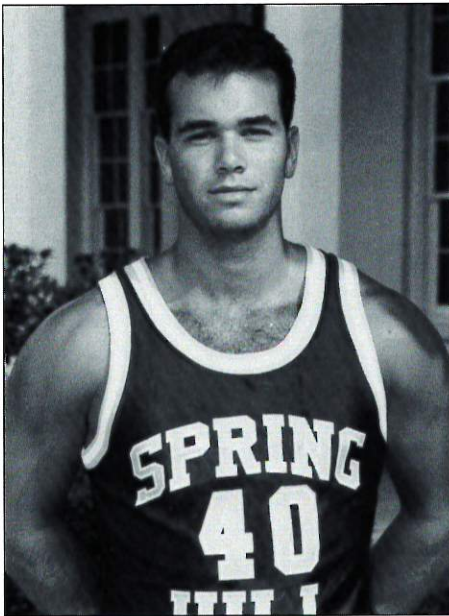

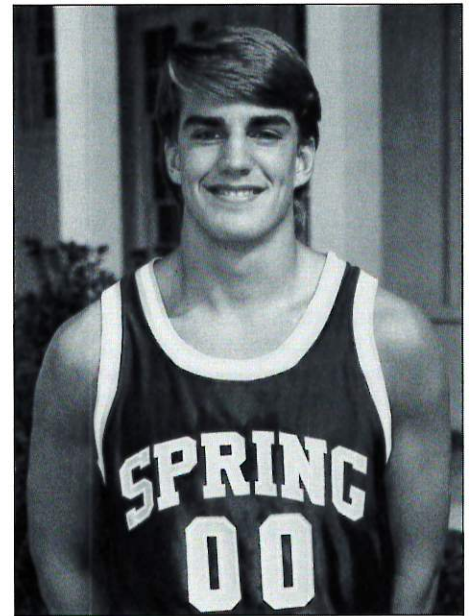

1989-90 IN REVIEW

Entering the season, the Badgers had high hopes for a district championship and a trip to nationals. After a tremendous start in the conference, it looked as though these hopes could materialize. However, hard luck in the district semi-finals versus Louisiana College denied the Badgers of their ultimate goal.

At Christmas break, the Badgers carried a fine 7-3 record including wins over Montevallo and Livingston and a hard-fought loss to perennial power Auburn-Montgomery. A great chunk of depth was taken from the Badgers, though, as starter Keith Williams suffered a season ending knee injury.

With the losses of key personnel, the Badgers had minor problems adjusting, losing three of four with the lone win coming against arch-rival Mobile College. When the district schedule began, however, the Badgers had worked out the kinks and got off to a 5-0 start while holding sole possession of first place. In this impressive stretch the Badgers had drilled the likes of Xavier, Dillard, and Louisiana College by an average score of 92-76!

Hard times would follow, however, as Spring Hill rounded out its district schedule with heartbreaking, last second losses to William Carey and Tougaloo. Heroic Badger comebacks were also held off by Xavier and Mobile College.

Finishing the District 30 season 8-8 and tied for fourth, Spring Hill qualified for the playoffs and hosted an exciting first round victory over Xavier. The Badgers then traveled to Louisiana College for the semi-finals. Without injured star John Jerkins, Spring Hill trailed only 82-80 with one minute left. However, the Badgers' only other basket would come at the buzzer ending the game and the season 95-82.

The Badgers' two All-District selections, Jerkins and Mike McKinley were the main cogs of the squad. McKinley, who led the team averaging 19.7 points a game, ended his career as the second leading scorer in school history. Jerkins averaged 17.3 points and 8.0 rebounds in his second consecutive All-District season. Post man Steve Weber also turned in an impressive season finishing third on the team in scoring and leaving many with the belief that he was the most improved player in the league. Hustling Danny Deal provided intensity and defense while Marcus Nettles added size and rebounding as the two battled for the starting small forward position. Meanwhile, the point guard spot was occupied by sharp-shooting Mark Flint with Sean Wright adding speed and quickness off the bench. Ron McDonald provided excellent depth in the post while swingman P.J. Thelen contributed solidly when called upon.
