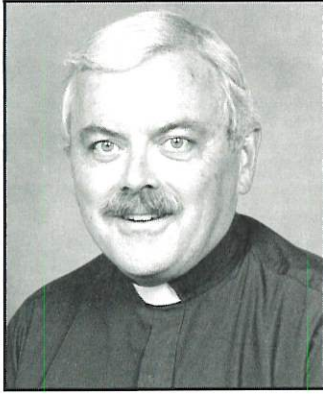

SEASON OUTLOOK

Can the Spring Hill Badgers return to the District 30 play-offs? That's the number one question the Badger hoopsters will have to answer to themselves and their fans. Last year, the Badgers were well on their way to a fifth straight play-off appearance as they got off to a 14-3 overall start and began 4-1 in the conference. The loss of two key starters, however, contributed to a fall that left Spring Hill 17-12 and out of the district play-offs. With the loss of both starting post players including leading rebounder and co-captain Ron McDonald, where do the Badgers stand going into this year?

Coach Carl Nash responds this way: "We have many new faces and we're not sure how our chemistry will be with the new guys and the returnees. We won't have one big gun as we've had in the past which means we will really need everyone to play well together."

Although the Badgers do not have one "big gun", they do possess a major spiritual cog. Junior P. J. Thelen's broken wrist, suffered in last year's conference opener, left Spring Hill with a major void that was never filled. This year, Thelen is back 100 percent to provide the Badgers with what they missed from him late last year. Coach Nash who named Thelen a co-captain this year states, "P. J.'s biggest contribution comes in areas other than scoring. He's a 6'8" guard which is a rarity and causes match-up problems, he passes extremely well, he goes hard to the boards, and forces turnovers on defense."

Another vital piece to the Badgers puzzle is swingman Kirk DePriest. The 6'4" senior provides Spring Hill with powerful intensity, stifling defense, and strong outside shooting. DePriest led the Badgers in 3-point shooting last year, an area that Nash says needs the most improvement. "We shot horribly as a team last year. We must get better perimeter shooting if we are going to contend for a championship."

Some of that improvement from the perimeter could come from one of the newcomers to Spring Hill College. Junior Doug Layman, a 6'3" transfer from Armstrong St. (GA), has tremendous shooting range. Very sound fundamentally, Layman is expected to contribute heavily this season. Also anticipated to add punch to the Badger attack are transfers Ronald Gomez and Marc Allen. Gomez is a 6'4" sophomore who played for

Alabama State Champ Faulkner St. J. C. last year. A beast on the boards, Gomez will give a lift to Spring Hill's front line. 6'9" sophomore Allen will also be looked to for immediate assistance in the post area when he comes eligible at Christmas. The native Mobilian is a very capable inside scorer as well as a fine shooter from the perimeter. Freshman Bobby Parker is another local product who will provide heavy competition at the point guard position. LeFlore alum Terrance James will also provide depth at point guard.

While the newcomers will definitely contribute heavily, the returning veterans should continue to flourish at the "Hill." Senior Co-Captain Mark Flint will renew his yearly confrontation with Junior Sean Wright for the point guard position. Sophomore Anton Chatman, who was forced into a starting role on the wing last year due to injury, brings his quickness and strong driving ability back to the Spring Hill attack. The Badgers front-line is very deep as Senior Jerome LeBlanc and Junior Brad Copenhaver return. Both provided key minutes off the bench last year and their experience is extremely valuable. Three Sophomores return to add to the Badger power attack. Sharp-shooting, 6'7" Sam Coates is expected to contribute more as are Chris Graefe and Kevin Andrews.

Coach Nash says that the competition for starting jobs is wide open. Whoever the five players are that start this year, they will be met with one of the strongest non-conference schedules ever at Spring Hill College. The Badgers will travel to NCAA Tourney participant U.N.O. this year. This is the first time in six years Spring Hill will play a Division I opponent. Spring Hill will also play NAIA powers Birmingham-Southern, Auburn-Montgomery, and Arkansas College.

While the non-conference schedule is tremendously tough, this year's GCAC schedule is absolutely brutal. "This could be the strongest conference from top to bottom in GCAC history," states Nash emphatically. Xavier and Louisiana College are likely favorites to win the league. For Spring Hill College though, the District 30 play-offs are the immediate goal. "If our newcomers and returning vets mesh well together our chances are good to get back to the play-offs."

THE COACHES

In two and a half years Carl Nash has placed himself as the second best basketball coach in terms of winning percentage in school history. That's not bad for a program that was projected to take a few more years to rebuild.

In January of 1989, Coach Carl Nash went from assistant coach to head coach and directed the Badgers to their third consecutive District 30 playoff appearance. At the age of 29 he became Spring Hill's 9th head basketball coach in 43 years.

In 1990, his first full year as head coach, Nash directed Spring Hill into the District 30 semi-finals — only the second time the Badgers have ever reached that far in the District 30 Tournament. Three players off that team made the NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete team which Coach Nash takes the most pride in.

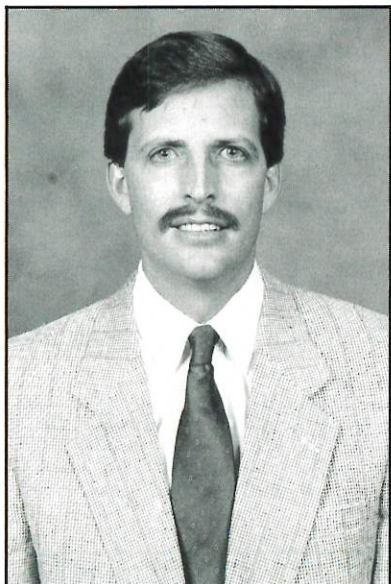
1990-91 proved to be an up and down year, however. Once again the Badgers won 17 games and in three straight weeks Spring Hill received honorable mention votes for the NAIA Top twenty-five. Once again, Coach Nash was most proud of one of his players making the NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete team and yet another making the NAIA Honorable Mention All-American team.

This past summer, Nash was voted by his peers to coach the South Collegiate team at the Alabama Sports Festival. This was the first year that college basketball was sponsored in the Festival.

Coach Nash was born in Del Norte, Colorado where he was a standout in basketball and baseball. He attended Colorado State University and Fort Lewis College, where he graduated in 1982. Nash earned his M.S. in 1984 from the United States Sports Academy.

Nash began his coaching career at Durango High School in Durango, Colorado. He came to Spring Hill College in 1984 as a graduate assistant. In 1985 Nash left for the United Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, where he coached in the International Basketball program. His team won the "Ramadan Games" and he was voted "Coach of the Year" with a 27-7 record. Nash rejoined the Badgers in 1986 as an assistant coach and each season Spring Hill reached the District 30 playoffs. He has an 84-46 lifetime coaching record which translates to a .646 winning percentage!

Coach Nash is married to the former Pamela Meier of Raleigh, North Carolina.

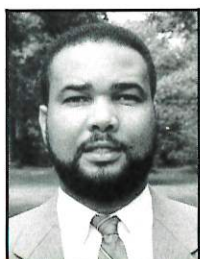
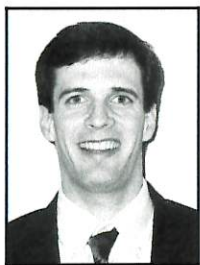
RICK PIETRI, Assistant Coach

Rick Pietri begins his third season as Carl Nash's number one assistant coach. Pietri has helped the Badgers to a combined 34-27 record in the previous two seasons.

The New Orleans, Louisiana, native graduated from De La Salle High School in 1983 before initially making his way to Mobile. Pietri received a full scholarship to manage the basketball team at the University of South Alabama and graduated with a B.A. Degree in Communication Arts from U.S.A.

For the next two years, Pietri served as an assistant basketball coach at St. Paul's High School in Covington, LA, helping them to a District Championship in 1988. He then returned to Mobile in 1989 to coach at the "Hill" and complete a Master's Degree in Secondary Education at U.S.A. which he finished this past June.

Rick's brother Mark is a 1989 graduate of Spring Hill College and is currently an assistant basketball coach at Samford University in Birmingham. Rick is married to the former Suzanne Odom of Mobile.



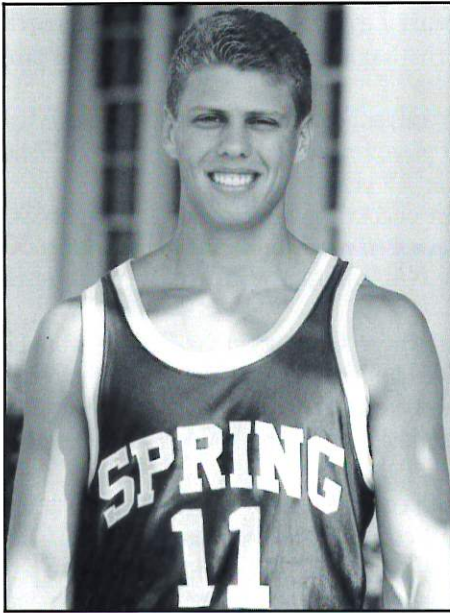
ANGELO ARCHIBLE, Assistant Coach

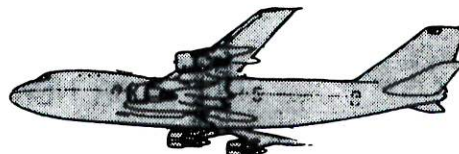

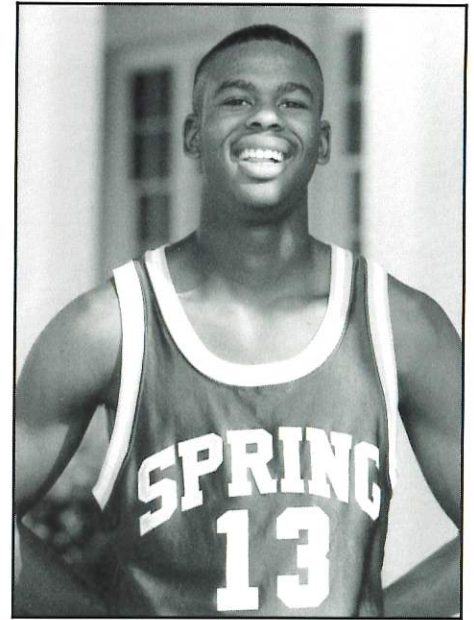
Wright has begun to develop his shooting range, and Coach Nash will look for Sean to score more this season.

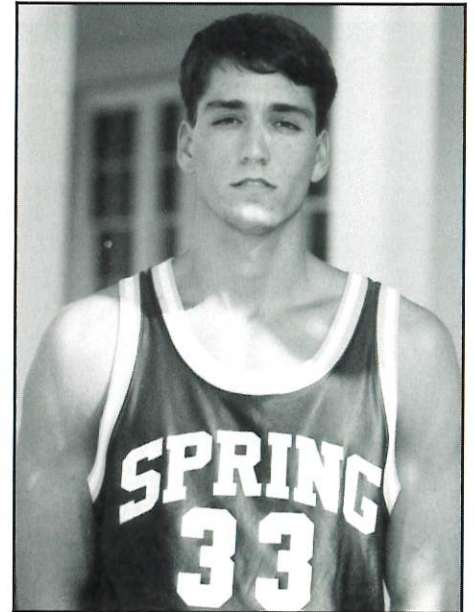

PERSONAL: In his spare time, Kirk enjoys fishing and skiing. Kirk is a Pre-Med major at the "Hill".

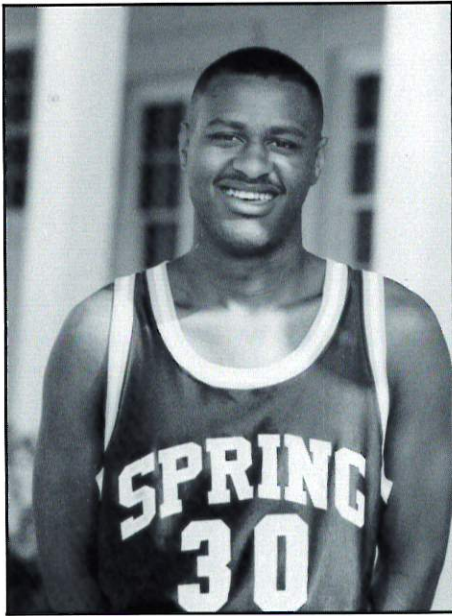

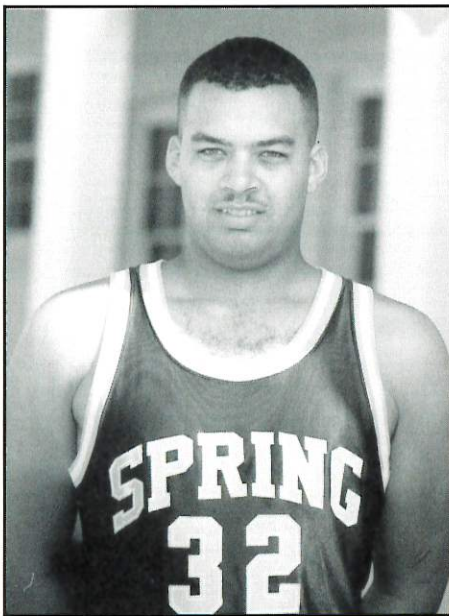
With added physical strength and a determination to improve his overall game, the Badgers will look to Coates to add depth to the front line.
