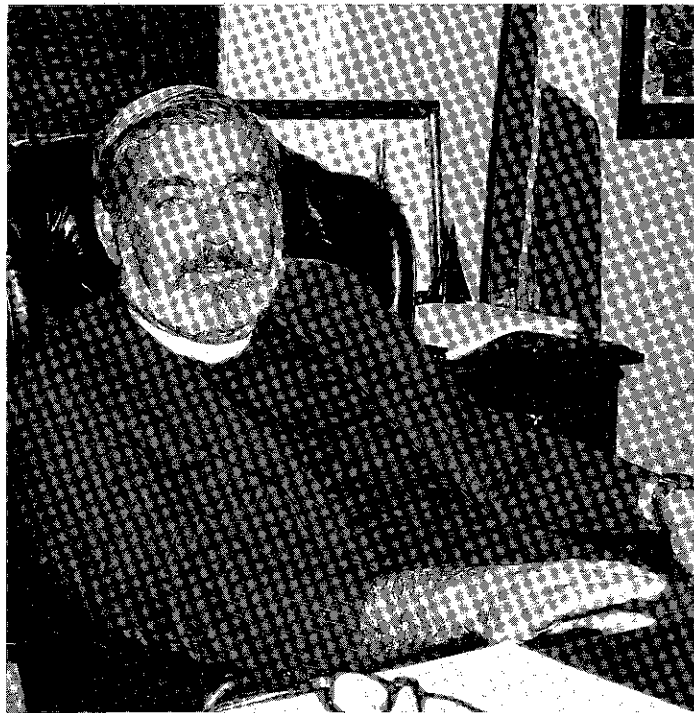

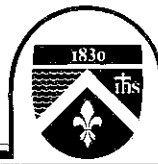
Spring Hill College is the oldest college in Alabama and the third oldest Jesuit institution in the country. Founded in 1830, the college offers a rigorous liberal arts program as well as graduate programs in business, teacher education and theology.

The student body of 1,100 hails from 34 states and 12 foreign countries. The 14.1 student/faculty ratio means that students and professors work

very closely together. Numerous academic support programs, complimented by a strong athletic program, also help students to explore academic, career and personal opportunities. At Spring Hill, education goes beyond the classroom.

The Spring Hill experience is the formation of men and women into persons who are intellectually, spiritually, socially and morally mature.

I am optimistic about the upcoming season and am especially pleased to have an experienced team coming back. The 86-87 squad has nine returning lettermen, including four starters.

Our goals are to win 20 games and get into a post-season tournament. If we stay healthy, these goals are entirely within our reach. Last year, after we had won 20 games in 1984-85, we were picked by the other conference coaches to win the league but then lost 3 of our five starters due to injury and *early* graduation.

In spite of this shock, we still won more games (15) against tougher competition, than SHC had won in the previous five years put together. Nine of our losses last year came either in overtime or by a margin of one or two points. On the negative side, those close losses reflected a dire lack of rebounding and depth after we had to move the number six, seven and eight players into the starting line-up and come off the bench with our ninth, tenth, and eleventh players.

On the positive side, we hung in there and played some great basketball. We beat four of the six NCAA Division II schools on our schedule. We also played the eventual conference champions to an overtime loss at home and a one point loss on the road. No team beat us worse than 14 points, a far cry from the days of 30 to 40 point losses.

Barring further injury this year, I am confident that we will be a very competitive team and enjoy a winning season. After what we went through last year, the players certainly deserve one. They have done a great job for us both on and off the court.

I am extremely pleased to announce that every player on my roster is in good standing and making normal progress toward graduation. In fact, a recent internal study of the academic standing of student-athletes at Spring Hill College revealed that *every student-athlete in the entire athletic department*, which includes men's and women's basketball, baseball, golf, and men's and women's tennis *is in good standing academically*.

I seriously doubt if there is another institution of higher learning in the United States that can make that claim. The credit for this goes to the athletes themselves; a dedicated faculty which goes the extra mile to provide a first-rate education; and an administration that has been extremely supportive.

Finally, we have a very special team chaplain and academic advisor in Father Patrick J. Hunter, S.J., who has no equal in the job he does.

Without question there will be setbacks along the way and certainly no coach or teacher could ever realistically expect that each and every one of his students would always enjoy total athletic and academic success. However, it is, in my opinion, the mandate of every educator to do all that he possibly can to motivate and lead young people toward academic achievement.

As long as we maintain this posture, and I am confident that we will, the wins and losses of a temporary athletic season will take care of themselves, especially against the backdrop of the real wins of an entire lifetime.

In light of all of the negative press surrounding college athletics today, the results we have achieved here at Spring Hill are singularly important. Father Tipton put forth, and I concurred, right from the outset that we were going to "be on the cutting edge of something new and different in college athletics and provide a role model" in intercollegiate athletics for others after us. We are accomplishing that to the best of our ability.

Coach Pam Young is beginning her fourth season as head coach of the Spring Hill College Lady Badgers. Since coming to the Hill, Coach Young has had the challenge of rebuilding a competitive women's program in the tough NAIA District 30 region. During her tenure, the women's basketball team has been in competition for the District playoffs every year. Her quality recruiting has brought in talented young players who have increased shooting percentage, assists, blocked shots and have added solid aggressive defensive tactics to Spring Hill's game.

Coach Young is a 1979 graduate of Belhaven College in Jackson, MS, where she was a basketball standout. She served as assistant women's basketball coach at the University of South Alabama from 1980-83. The Lady Jags became a top contender in the Sun Belt and was ranked nationally. She received her Masters Degree in Education in 1981 from the University of South Alabama.

The outlook for the coming season is very promising and rightly so with the nucleus of the young team returning for their second year and the added strength of three exciting freshmen and one junior college transfer. We are still very young, but our sophomores now have a year of experience, growth and maturity to take with them onto the hardwood this season.

Though short of a winning season last year (13-15), the squad of eight freshmen, one sophomore, and two seniors showed much improvement in games won, shooting percentage, and all other phases of the game. Many team and individual records were shattered and the season produced several highlights: a 76-74 victory over Dillard University; a 63-61 overtime victory over William Carey College; a 76-74 overtime victory over the University of Montevallo; and a 82-75 victory over NCAA Division I Prairie View A & M.

A good recruiting year has helped the 1986-87 "Lady Badger" team to have talent, strength and depth in every position on the court. Angele Davis, a 6'3" freshman center from Clinton, LA and

Anita Union, a 5'11" junior forward/center from Brewton, AL will add much needed rebounding and overall strengths to our inside game. They will be joined in the front court by 5'9" freshman forward, Peyton Peek, and returning players, 6'1" Ashley Gomillion (sophomore, Fairhope) and 5'10" Janice Porter (Sophomore, Mobile).

Comprising the back court will be returning guards, 5'8" Tammy Ardion (sophomore, Franklin, LA), 5'4" Deanne Neyrey (sophomore, Metairie, LA), 5'6" Debora Simmons (sophomore, Magnolia, MS), and newcomer 5'6" Frances Sanders (freshman, Huntsville, AL).

It all adds up to what will become an exciting season for the SHC women's basketball team. The 25 game schedule includes new rivals Auburn Montgomery, Blackburn College and Florida Memorial; as well as old rivals University of West Florida, Jacksonville State, and 14 tough District 30 teams.

A winning season and one of the top spots in District 30 will be first and second on the minds of the "Lady Badgers" this year.

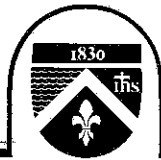
