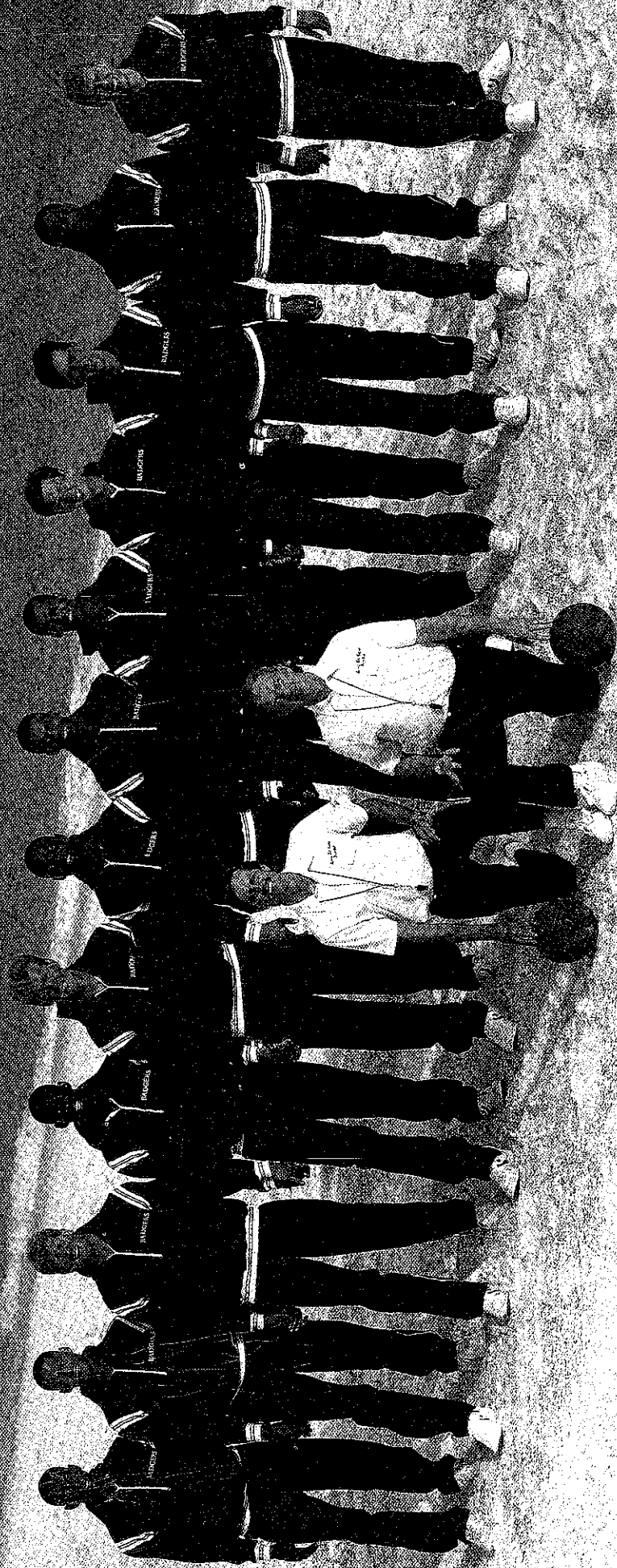
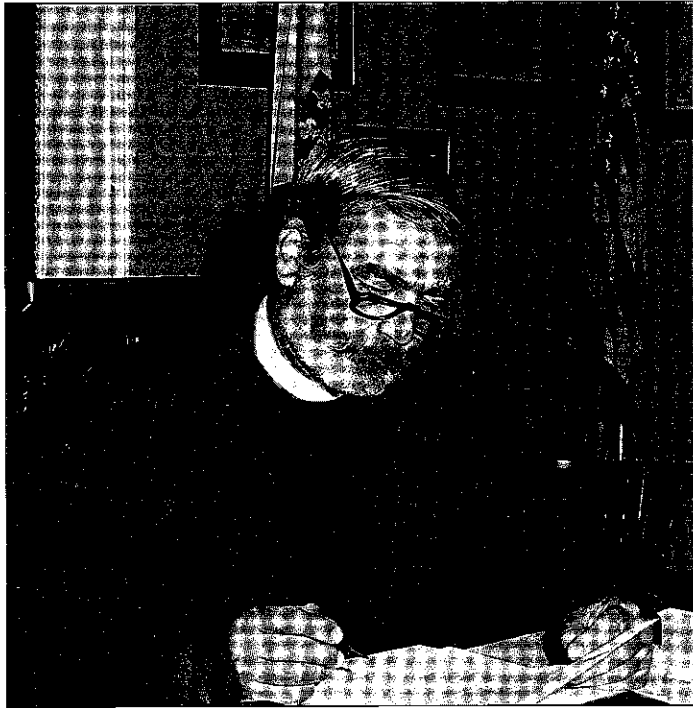
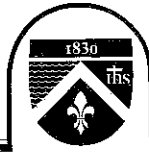

Spring Hill College is the oldest college in Alabama and the third oldest Jesuit institution in the country. Founded in 1830, the college offers a rigorous liberal arts program as well as graduate programs in business, teacher education and theology.

The student body of 1,100 hails from 34 states and 12 foreign countries. The 14.1 student/faculty ratio means that students and professors work

very closely together. Numerous academic support programs, complimented by a strong athletic program, also help students to explore academic, career and personal opportunities. At Spring Hill, education goes beyond the classroom.

The Spring Hill experience is the formation of men and women into persons who are intellectually, spiritually, socially and morally mature.

After soaring to a school record 27 wins last year, it is accurate to say that Spring Hill College has joined the elite of the nation's small college basketball teams.

The Badgers are among a select few to have averaged 21 wins per season over the past four years while earning three NAIA post-season tournament bids.

Enroute to chalking up their impressive record, the Hillians have also shot their way to the enviable position of number one in the nation in field goal percentage (out of more than nearly 500 NAIA Colleges and Universities), blitzing this past season's opponents with a whopping 56.2 percent for the season.

In fact, the Badgers have shot more than 50 percent from the field while leading the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference in scoring each of the past four years.

These accomplishments have vaulted Head Coach Drayton Miller into the lofty position of being the school's all-time winningest coach with 83 wins during his four year tenure.

Yet, when Coach Drayton Miller is asked about the miraculous turnaround at Spring Hill that he and his staff have achieved, he speaks most proudly of the academic and social accomplishments. **"We may well be the only winning program in the country that currently enjoys a 100 percent graduation rate over the past four years. Furthermore, all of our present players are in good academic standing and making progress toward a degree."**

"This is especially significant at a time when other programs around the nation are struggling with moral, social, ethical and drug and alcohol related problems. The credit for our success goes to the athletes themselves; a dedicated faculty; and an administration that has been extremely supportive."

"Without question there will be setbacks along the way and certainly no coach or teacher could ever realistically expect that each and every one of his students would always enjoy total athletic and academic success."

"However, as long as we are allowed to maintain our current posture, the wins and losses of a temporary athletic season will always take care of themselves, especially against the backdrop of a program which holds paramount the academic policies of the college as well as the spiritual and personal growth of each student-athlete."

"Certainly, in light of what we have accomplished, our program has demonstrated itself to be an affirmation of Spring Hill's commitment to athletic excellence in partnership with academic achievement."

"We have truly become an important and proper adjunct of the College's total educational enterprise. Indeed, our program provides living testimony that sane and sensible athletics can be successful in an intellectually stimulating and educationally sound academic environment."

In spite of heavy graduation losses, which include the school's all-time leading scorer, All-America forward Chris Williams and two other first team All-District players, center Darin Tang and point guard Chris Nelson, the Badgers could surprise. They return both

starting wing players, Mike McKinley, a 6'5" junior and Ray Younger, a 6'3" sophomore. No less than six other lettermen who saw extensive playing time also return.

According to Miller, "even though we will have a young squad, with only one senior on our entire roster, we return a solid nucleus of players to go with what we consider to be our best ever recruiting effort. We expect to field another very strong team, especially as the season progresses."

The Badgers regular season games for 1988-89, which feature an attractive 16 game home slate, will be highlighted by the inauguration of the "First Annual Gulf Coast Holiday Classic Tournament." This tournament will feature a round robin format with Spring Hill, crosstown rival Mobile College and two formidable out-of-town opponents, Fontbonne College of St. Louis, Missouri, and Molloy College of Long Island, New York, on December 28-30 at St. Paul's Gym.

Spring Hill will also travel to Athens, Alabama to participate in the state's premier Thanksgiving Holiday Invitational Tournament which, in addition to the Badgers, will feature host school Athens State, perennial NAIA powerhouses Georgia Southwestern and the University of Arkansas-Monticello.

In addition to these two highly competitive tournaments, the Hillians schedule also includes tough non-conference road trips to Georgia and Florida.

The 16 game Gulf Coast Athletic Conference schedule again promises to be extremely difficult because of the overall balance of the league.

The strength of this year's schedule should excite the Badgers' fans; certainly it will challenge this year's young and inexperienced team.

Coach Miller, however, remains optimistic. "Our goals, as usual, are to win 20 games and earn yet another NAIA post-season tournament bid. If we stay healthy, these goals are entirely within our reach.

The Spring Hill College "Lady Badgers" are extremely excited about the upcoming 1988-89 season. They will field a veteran, all senior starting five who have the potential to be a serious contender in the GCAC and District 30.

The Lady Badgers have lost only one major contributor (albeit a good one) from last year's squad—a squad that led the league in rebounding. Gone is forward Anita Union (12.9 ppg., 9.1 rpg.).

Returning are four senior starters: two-time All-District forward Ashley Gomillion (14.0 ppg., 8.4 rpg.), forward Janice Porter (8.5 ppg., 7.7 rpg.), and guards Tammy Ardoin (8.1 ppg., 4.6 rpg.), and Deanne Neyrey (7.6 ppg.).

Spring Hill can claim considerable experience among its reserves as well, particularly senior Kim Jenkins (8.8 ppg., 6.3 rpg.), senior Debora Simmons and sophomore Lisa Giometti. Also on board is a promising freshman point guard, 5-7 Barbara Brady.

New Head Coach, Angelo Archible, is pleased with the squads senior leadership and is optimistic about the upcoming season. "If we stay healthy I believe we will have our most competitive team in recent years. These young ladies have worked very hard and deserve a great year."
