We are grateful for the attendance and support of our fans. Your continued support is a vital link in our chain of success.

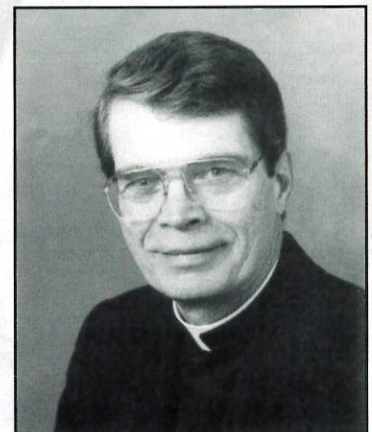

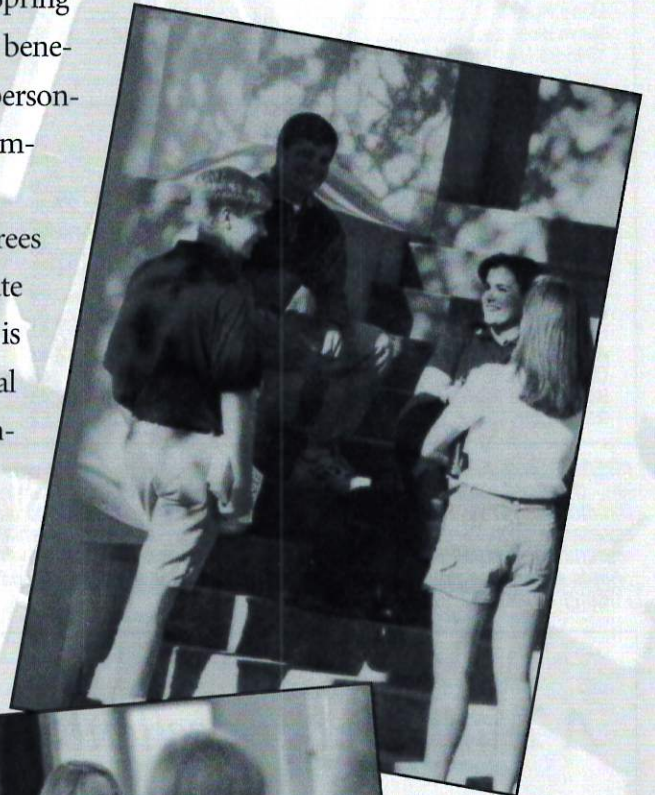

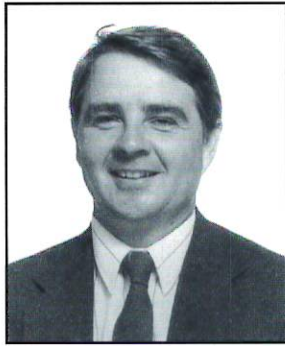

FRANK SIMS



Frank Sims begins his fifth year as athletic director at Spring Hill College. In the 90s, Badger and Lady Badger athletic programs have made regular appearances in national tournaments. The men's basketball team and women's golf team have each made three consecutive trips to the NAIA National Tournament, while the women's cross-country program competed in the NAIA National Meet in Kenosha, Wis. in 1992 and 1993.


Sims can also be found out on the diamond, where he is entering his 12th year as the winningest baseball coach in school history. He earned his 300th win as the Badger head coach in 1995, and will soon earn his 400th career victory sometime during the 1997 season.

Under his leadership, SHC has enjoyed much success in the post-season, with three Gulf Coast Athletic Conference titles and two trips to the NAIA national tournament. His 1992 team went 40-15 and set 18 team, individual, and conference records.

Sims began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater, Eastern Illinois University, where he earned his bachelor's degree in health, physical education, and recreation.

Sims is a member of the executive committee of the NAIA World Series where he serves as chairperson of the International Play Committee. He has also been an assistant coach for the local Mobile Baysharks of the Texas-Louisiana Professional Baseball League for two seasons.

Frank and his wife, Dana, have four children, Drew, Sarah, Kelsey, and Brian.

1996 - 97 BADGERS SEASON

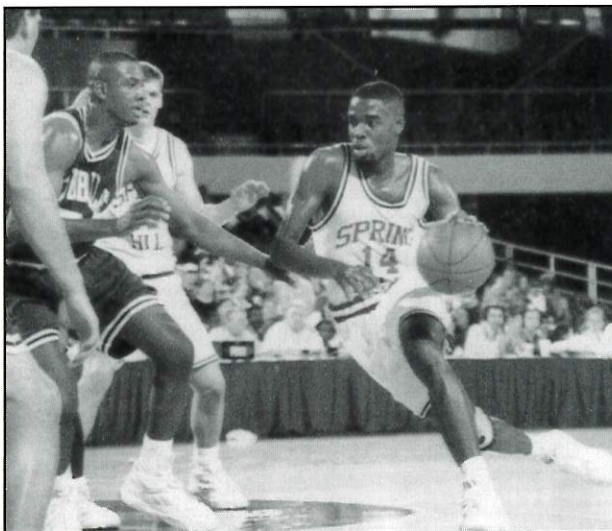
PREVIEW

Success has been a part of the Spring Hill men's basketball program over the past five years. In this time, the Badgers have posted five consecutive 20-win seasons while earning three trips to the NAIA National Tournament. The Badgers have also won three Gulf Coast Athletic Conference (GCAC) Tournament championships and one regular season championship.

Last season, the Badgers narrowly missed winning their second regular season championship and qualified for their fifth consecutive post-season berth, the tenth in the last 12 years. Spring Hill finished the season with a 21-10 mark overall, 14-4 in the GCAC.

As head coach Joe Niland begins his fourth year at the Hill, he has the good fortune to oversee a roster whose main strength is experience. The Badgers only lost one player (Stephen Sterling) to graduation and return 10 letterwinners from last season.

A trio of seniors conclude their distinguished careers this season. Guards Eric Lovett and Chad Frazier and forward Eddie Timmons were selected All-Conference, while Timmons was also selected as an honorable mention All-American. Lovett, a strong perimeter player, has started every game since his freshman season. In 92 games, he has averaged 11.8 points, 4.6 rebounds and 3.1 assists per game. Last season, Lovett averaged 12.9 points and 5.2 rebounds per game while also leading the team in assists. Frazier is the main outside threat, as he shattered Mike McKinley's school record for 3-point baskets in a season with 108 last year. He needs only 34 this season to break McKinley's career mark for 3-point baskets. Frazier led the team in scoring (17.1 ppg) and led the GCAC in free throw percentage (.830). Timmons brings an aggressive style to the floor and is one of



the go-to people underneath. He was second on the team in scoring and rebounding (14.4 ppg, 6.4 rpg), and has also averaged just over 11 points and 5.6 rebounds in his three-year career.

"I'm looking forward to coaching these three for one more season," Niland said. "They have provided great leadership on the floor for this team, and they have been great people off the court as well."

One of the keys to this season will be the expected contributions from last season's freshman class. The head of the class is the GCAC Freshman of the Year, sophomore forward Eric Campbell. The 6' 4" Campbell finished the season as the leading rebounder (7.4 rpg) and third leading scorer (13.1 ppg). Campbell led the GCAC in field goal percentage (.662), which tied Marc Allen's school record. He also led the

team in blocked shots.

Three upperclassmen return for their junior season. Guard Josh Frerman and forward Alfonso Cueto made their contributions to the success of last season from the perimeter and post, respectively, and will be expected to make significant contributions this season, while returning guard Dwight Ladd will contribute in a supporting role.

Returning sophomore forwards Jason Allen and Ronald Robinson and guard Wali Harrison have worked hard to improve their game over the summer, and will be

expected to step up and make significant contributions in a supporting role.

Three newcomers that should provide immediate support are guards Rory Wheeler (Clearwater, Fla.) and Jonathan Mays (Jackson, Tenn.) and transfer forward James Moore (Venice, Fla.).

As usual, the pre-conference schedule poses a challenge for the Badgers. Six of the Badgers pre-season games are against opponents that are ranked in the NAIA pre-season Top 25. The Badgers play two games against Auburn-Montgomery (No. 10), two against Life College (Tied 11th), who finished last season ranked second in the nation, and both opponents in the St. Mary's Invitational in San Antonio, Texas (Incarnate Word, 14th and St. Mary's 24th). Also ranked in the top 25 is GCAC rival Dillard University, the pre-season pick to win the GCAC. The well-balanced GCAC has a number of teams that can challenge for the title, including Xavier University, William Carey College and cross-town rival University of Mobile.

"This team has enjoyed a lot of success in the past, but we have not peaked yet," Niland said. "Our team goals have stayed the same since I've been here...to play well and earn a berth in the national tournament."

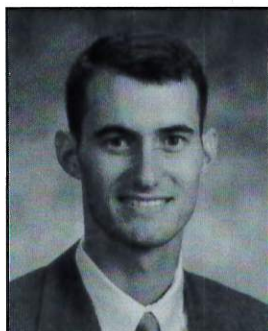
Joe Niland begins his fourth season with the men's basketball team as the fifth all-time winningest coach at the Hill. He has posted three straight 20-win seasons, a .696 winning percentage (64-28) and has guided the team to a berth in the NAIA National Tournament, as well as a Gulf Coast Athletic Tournament championship.

Niland came to the Hill after spending three seasons (1990-93) at Florida Southern College in Lakeland. He assisted head coach Gordon Gibbons and helped guide the Moccasins to a 73-20 record, two Sunshine State Conference championships and two berths in the NCAA Division II National Tournament.

From 1988-90, Niland assisted Richard Schmidt at the University of Tampa. There, he helped lead the Spartans to two SSC titles and two NCAA Division II National Tournament berths.

Niland earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Buffalo in 1981. His family has a strong basketball background. His father, Joe Sr., was a former player and coach at Canisius College in Buffalo, while his brother David is the head basketball coach at Penn State-Behrend College in Erie, Penn. His cousin, John Beilein, is the head coach at Canisius College.

Niland and his wife, Ellen, have four children, A.J., Katelin, Jake, and Patrick.

Ben Daggett returns for his second season as the assistant coach of the men's basketball program.

Daggett received his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from the University of Arkansas in 1995. While at Arkansas, he served for four years as a student manager for the Razorbacks men's basketball program. During that time the Razorbacks won the 1994 national championship, two Southeastern Conference championships, and went to the NCAA championship game in 1995.

A native of Marianna, Ark., Daggett's responsibilities include scouting, recruiting, video exchange and other administrative duties in addition to on-the-floor coaching.

Daggett is currently enrolled at the United States Sports Academy, where he will soon earn a master's degree in sport management.

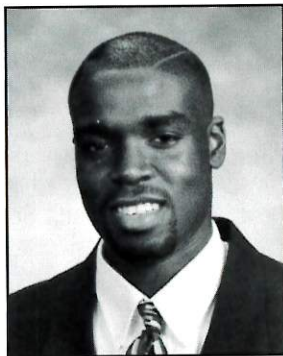


13 CHAD FRAZIER

1996 - 97 LADY BADGER SEASON

PREVIEW

Over the last three seasons, the Spring Hill women's basketball team has earned a berth into the post-season playoffs, participating in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference (GCAC) Tournament. Last season, the Lady Badgers narrowly missed the 20-win plateau, finishing with a 19-14 overall record and placing fourth in the GCAC for the third consecutive year.

To move up to the next level, a berth in the national tournament in Jackson, Tenn., next March, the Lady Badgers will need to play well as a cohesive unit. Despite losing two key starters to graduation, fourth-year head coach James Walker will oversee a roster that is a strong balance of experienced returnees and talented newcomers. This balance may push the Badgers toward one of two national tournament berths in the GCAC.

A key strength to the Lady Badgers is experience in the frontcourt. A key returnee to the mix is junior Allison Kahn. Kahn, one of the better all-around players on the squad, returns this season after missing last year due to a knee injury. Kahn was the third leading scorer on the team as a freshman. Kahn was named All-GCAC as a sophomore, leading the GCAC in field goal percentage (.632). She finished second on the team in scoring and rebounding that season.

"Having Allison back will make a huge difference for this team," Walker said. "She has bounced back from her ACL injury, and we expect big things from her."

Kahn, along with two-time All-GCAC player Donmeka Martin, will divide a majority of the rebounding chores. Martin led the team in scoring and rebounding the last two seasons and is on track to shatter the career scoring and rebounding records over the next two seasons. The scoring record is currently held by Ashley



Gomillion (1,580 points, 1985-89), while the rebounding record was set by Kathy Smith (1,026 rebounds, 1982-86). Martin averaged 14.3 points and 8.2 rebounds per game last season. She also led the team last year in blocked shots.

Rounding out the frontcourt are two returnees. Junior Ellie Ramey (6.0 ppg, 3.6 rpg) and sophomore Jennifer Nalu (3.1 ppg, 2.5 rpg) made key contributions last season and worked hard over the summer to improve their game.

The backcourt will be well balanced between newcomers and returnees. Three key returnees are senior Megan Johnson (2.1 ppg) and juniors Alice Turni (8.9 ppg, 5.6 rpg) and Elvia D'Orcy (4.5 ppg). Johnson and D'Orcy will see time out on the wing while Turni will be expected to play significant minutes as the small for-

ward. Walker is expecting these three to step up and make significant contributions on the perimeter.

Two key newcomers for Walker will be freshman guards Lindsey Stuardi and Jill Mathias. Stuardi was arguably one of the better overall players in the area last year. The former McGill-Toolen standout will start the season as the point guard. Mathias will spend time at either the wing or small forward.

"I think Lindsey is going to do well," Walker said. "She has great instincts and exceptional court awareness. She will fit in well with our personnel."

The balance of the roster are all freshman guards. Kelly Egbert (Daphne HS), Heather Wingard (Baker HS) and Molly Conner (Arlington, VA) round out the roster. These players will add stability and depth to the guard position.

"This is one of the best groups, talent wise, that we have had since I've been here," Walker said. "Our goal is to win the conference every year, but with the conference getting two berths to the national tournament, we need to be in a position to either win the conference or be in the conference tournament final."

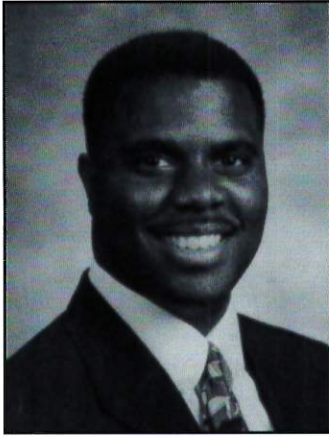
This year's schedule includes four of 12 non-conference games against teams ranked in the pre-season NAIA Top 25 poll. Also on the schedule are two games against NCAA Division II member University of West Florida and Worcester Polytech, a top-ranked NCAA Division III member.

In the always tough GCAC, Xavier University and cross-town rival University of Mobile are included in the poll. The well balanced schedule should give the Lady Badgers the preparation they need as they hope to be one of two GCAC teams in the national tournament this season.

Walker has guided the Lady Badgers to three straight berths in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference Tournament. Competing against some of the top teams in the nation, the Lady Badgers have managed a fourth place finish three years in a row.

The Jackson, Tenn. native is a 1990 graduate of Morehouse College in Atlanta, where he earned his bachelor of arts degree in Business Administration. He also earned a master's degree from the United States Sports Academy, receiving a double major in Sport Management and Sport Coaching. While at Morehouse, Walker set the career record for assists, with 712 and led the 1989-90 team to a NCAA Division II Final Four appearance. After his collegiate career ended, he played professionally in France for three months.

Walker also coaches the women's cross-country team. James and his wife, Kimberly, welcomed their first child, Kendell, on April 8.

Fowler also serves as coordinator for the SHC Intramural Program and assists with Staff Development in the Student Services Office.

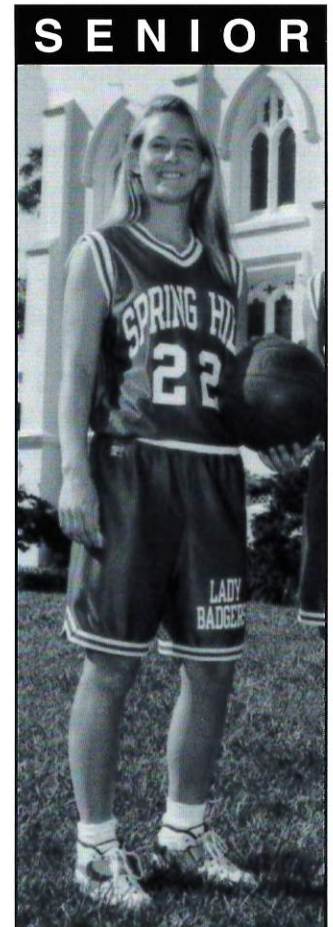

A S E A S O N T O R E M E M B E R

The basketball teams at Spring Hill College have enjoyed a lot of success over the years. The 1974-75 squad was the first team to win 20 games (20-7). This team was also crowned as the Southern States Conference Champions. The teams of the 1980's advanced to the District 30 Playoffs five times in a six year span. The record for the most wins in a season was set by the 1987-88 team, which won 27 games. In the early 90s, the Badgers played in three consecutive NAIA National Tournaments. Weekly national rankings have included the Badgers a number of times, including a #4 ranking under Coach Joe Niland during the week of December 15, 1995. It has been a great era for Spring Hill basketball, but one team that stands out in the memories of successful teams is the group that took the floor in the 1950-51 season.

The 1950-51 team was coached by Bill Gardiner, who came to the Hill in March of 1946 as the youngest coach in the Gulf States Conference. Prior to joining the coaching staff at Spring Hill, Gardiner played basketball and football at Georgetown University. He also played professional baseball with a team out of Washington, D.C. in the Dixie Pro League during his senior year in college. After his years at Georgetown, he served in the United States Army where he acquired the rank as captain. While in the army, Gardiner was captured by the Germans and was held as a prisoner of war for six months. Following his liberation as a prisoner, he worked with the Army Special Service Program for a year as a basketball and boxing coach.

Entering the year, Gardiner was confident that his team would have a bright season, but he said it was "dependent on the amount of hard work the players [were] willing to put out and the support they

receive[d] from the student body" (Springhillian, October 28, 1950). The players and the student-body both met Coach Gardiner's conditions as the season turned out to be one of the most successful years for any Badger basketball team.

The Badgers returned eight players from the 15-12 team of 1949-50. Hal McCormick, leading scorer from the 1949-50 squad, Jules "Stormy" Mugnier, second high scorer, and Jim Walsh, free throw artist, led the list of returnees. Also returning were Frank Bolling, Vince Herold, Andy McLaughlin, Glen Murphy, and Tony Skivo. Four newcomers were added to the varsity team to help the veterans. Jerry Fredericks, star player of the 1949-50 Lil' Badgers team, Phil Jennings, an all-prep star from Milwaukee, Bob MacDonald, an all-prep standout from Washington, D.C., and Allen Hickey, an all-city selection from Mobile, rounded out the roster.

Spring Hill opened the season with three straight wins. The Badgers inaugurated the new season at home by defeating the Livingston State Teachers 58-47. Coach Gardiner's switching man-to-man

defense limited the Teachers to only a 29 percent field goal percentage. Hal McCormick accounted for 19 points, and Jules Mugnier scored 12 points for the victorious Badgers. Spring Hill won the next two games at home against Keesler Field (57-34) and Troy State Teachers College (88-56). The Badgers set a school record in the Troy State game by scoring the most points in a single game.

Over the Christmas break, the team traveled to New York and New Jersey to challenge some small college teams considered to be the best. The first stop for the Badgers was in Jersey City, where they took on St. Peter's College. Spring Hill represented the South well, as they defeated the Peacocks 65-62. The Hill's next opponent was in Rochester, against the 7-2 Iona College Gaels. Spring Hill led at halftime by a score of 24-22, but the Badgers got into foul trouble in the second half and fell short at the end, 57-51. Hofstra College of Long Island served as the final host for the Badgers, who entered the game with a 6-2 record. The Flying Dutchman jumped out to an early eighteen point lead, yet Spring Hill never gave up. Coach Gardiner had to change things up, so he put Andy McLaughlin and Tony Skivo on the floor with Hal McCormick, Jules Mugnier, and Jim Walsh. This group fought back and took the lead 36-35, but the Badgers tired quickly and lost a tough one, 52-45.

Spring Hill entered the new year with the best record since pre-war days, 6-3, and then went on to win 12 of their next 14 games. The Badgers accomplished a lot during that tremendous streak. They had become the first Spring Hill team to ever defeat Northwestern State College on their home court. They also ended Centenary College's perfect home record with a 68-64 triumph. Most importantly, they had

taken over first place in the Gulf States Conference with an 11-3 conference record.

The student body lived up to Coach Gardiner's pre-season conditions by welcoming the Badgers home from a road trip with a police-escorted motorcade. Approximately 20 carloads of students and alumni picked up the blue and white bus on Moffett Road and, led by a police car, drove back to the campus. The players exited the bus to cheers from the crowd and to the music from the school's chamber music ensemble. The coaches and team were introduced, and then assistant coach Paul Napolitano said a few words to the crowd. Finally, the Badgers' number one fan, Father Dan Cronin, was called on to recap the road trip that left the team in a perfect position to win the conference.

The Badger cagers ended their regular season in fashion by beating arch-rival Loyola University 65-63 to win the Gulf States Conference. The victory was the Badgers' fifth straight win over the Wolves of Loyola. Jim Walsh led Spring Hill with 21 points in a game in which the lead changed nine teams. The win also capped an undefeated season at home in the City Recreation Center, where the

Badgers were 13-0.

Spring Hill advanced to the National Catholic Invitational Tournament in Albany, where they met perennial power St. Francis of Brooklyn. The berth in the national tournament was the first ever by a Spring Hill basketball team, and as a result, they were nervous. St. Francis jumped out to an early lead, and the Badgers were never able to catch up. Jules Mugnier led the team with a season-high 25 points, but it was not enough as the Terriers won 74-65, eliminating the Badgers in the first round. St. Francis went on to win the NCIT title.

The 1950-51 season still ranks as one of the best by any basketball teams in Spring Hill history. Their accomplishments throughout the season were immense. They won the Gulf States Conference with a 13-3 record, had an overall record of 19-8, and an unblemished record at home. The victories over Centenary, Northwestern State, and Loyola were definitely highlights of the season. But, without question, the most incredible feat of the year was their appearance in the national tournament.

The members of that great team will always remain in the history books of Spring Hill because they played so well as

a team. When asked to name the best all-around player on the team, Father Dan replied, "Spring Hill [had] five best all-around players, none of whom deserved more credit than the other" (Springhillian, February 24, 1951).

As a result of their success, many of the members of that team have been honored by the school.
