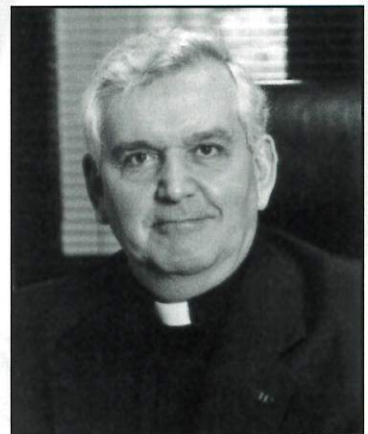
We value the strong support of our fans. Your continued support of our players is a vital link in our chain of success.

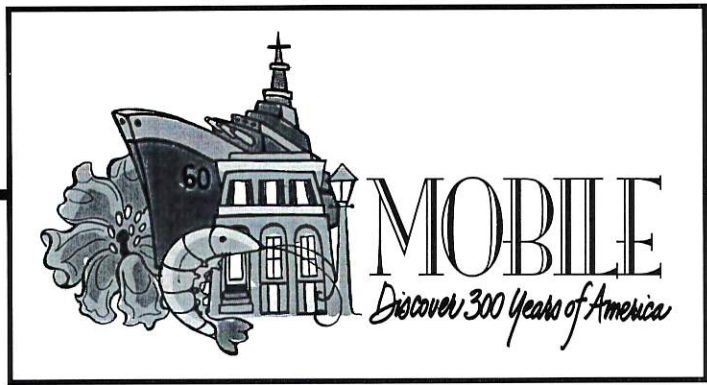

Rooted in southern tradition, the people of Mobile are committed to the ethics and values that make America great. Through grassroots community projects, Mobilians are active in making the Port City a better place to live, visit, and enjoy. This spirit of cooperation and commitment toward the future placed Mobile in a top-seed position for the title “All America City.” That title, now won, can be seen by visitors not only on the city’s street-side banners, but in the smiles of the friendly people of Mobile.

Mobile has always prospered because of its strategic location. A deep bay and harbor area offer a perfect shipping port. The barrier islands of Gulf Shores and Dauphin Island were ideal for military strategists. There they built strong forts to assure that only welcome guests ventured into the bay. Today these many historic forts offer visitors a glimpse into the past.

The international trade sustained by Mobile throughout her 300-year history has provided even the earliest settlers with the finer things from Europe, England, the Mediterranean and the Orient. Mobile’s five historic house-museums, are open to the public year-round and display artifacts native to this land, and treasures brought from far away.



Grand houses and public buildings, each with their own distinctive charm, reflect the builders’ and owners’ taste and heritage. Festivals and the observance of religious holidays were not forgotten by early settlers. From its founding in 1702, Mobile has celebrated Christmas, “Boef Gras” (now called Mardi Gras), Lent, Easter and more. Modern-day celebrations now include Azalea Trail Run & Festival (March), Providence Festival of Flowers (March), BayFest (October), Kwanza (December), and First Night Mobile (December).

It is no wonder that words such as “southern hospitality,” “charm,” and beauty,” are frequently used to describe this 300-year-old Port City.

# REC CENTER



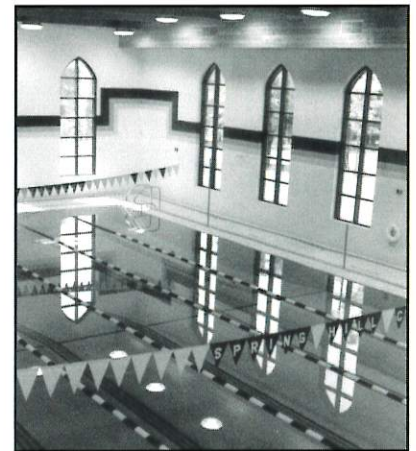
After nearly six decades of traveling, the Spring Hill College basketball program finally has a place to call home.

Opened to the campus in June 1997, the \$7.3 Student Recreation Center is a state-of-the-art recreational facility utilized by the students, faculty and staff of Spring Hill.

The facility includes a modern weight room, complete with free weights, station training, and cardiovascular equipment. This equipment was graciously donated by John Burke, a 1963 Spring Hill graduate.

Also included in the facility is a six-lane, 25-yard swimming pool, two raquetball courts, and a dance/aerobics studio, as well as locker room and training facilities for students and staff. Athletic department offices and a Hall of Fame Room for special receptions are housed on the upper level.

The centerpiece of the facility is the 2,000-seat gymnasium. The facility is the home for the men's and women's intercollegiate basketball and campus intramural programs.

## 1997-98 LADY BADGER SEASON

# PREVIEW

Throughout the five-year tenure of head coach James Walker, the Spring Hill women's basketball team has earned a spot in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference tournament. Last season, the Lady Badgers suffered their first sub-.500 season in Walker's career, posting a 14-17 mark overall and sixth place (8-10, tied 6th) conference record.

As SHC embarks on the 1997-98 campaign, Walker will oversee a lineup dominated by experienced returnees. Nine players return, including four of five starters from last season. The team was dealt a serious blow when All-GCAC selection Alison Kahn suffered a season-ending injury during preseason practices. Five talented newcomers join the mix to give Walker a roster of 14, the largest ever at the Hill.

Headlining the returnees is three-time All-GCAC selection Donmeka Martin (18.8 ppg, 9.9 rpg). Martin, who was also named as an honorable mention selection to the Kodak All-American team, has led the Lady Badgers in scoring and rebounding for the past three years. She needs only 47 points and 120 rebounds to become the all-time leader in school history. She also led the team in virtually all offensive categories including blocked shots, free throws made (128) and field goal percentage (.533).

"She has proven that she can carry the team," Walker said. "We need for the others on our team to step up and contribute this season."

A second key returnee will be sophomore guard Lindsey Stuardi (9.9 ppg, 3.4 rpg). Stuardi fared well making the adjustment to the college game leading the team in assists and free throw percentage (.798), while finishing second in steals and 3-point field goals made and percentage. Stuardi will be expected to provide solid direction from the point.



Senior guards Alice Turni (8.3 ppg, 4.9 rpg) and Elvia D'Orcy (7.3 ppg, 2.9 rpg) are well-seasoned veterans who will be expected to step up and make significant contributions from the wing. Turni may see time at small forward while D'Orcy and resuming sophomore Jill Mathias (4.2 ppg, 2.0 rpg) will see time at shooting guard.

In the post area, senior Ellie Ramey (6.0 ppg, 3.6 rpg) returns after a mid-season knee injury that cut her season short last year. Also returning will be junior Jennifer Nalu (5.3 ppg, 4.6 rpg). Joining the duo will be newcomers Karen Stokes (Pensacola, Fla.) and Shanna Picard (Faith Academy). Each averaged 12 points and 7 rebounds per game for their respective high schools last season.

Returning sophomore Heather Wingard along with newcomers Nicolette

Nalu (Fairhope High) and Jessica Wendolek (Gulf Breeze, Fla.) will be expected to make significant contributions in the backcourt and will spend time out on the perimeter in a reserve role. Wingard has a year of experience while Nalu and Wendolek will add stability and depth to the perimeter as they adjust to the college game. Nalu averaged 15 points and 5 assists, while Wendolek averaged 18 points and 6 rebounds per game last season. Returning sophomore Molly Connor and newcomer Caty Butorac (Sterling, Va.) round out the roster.

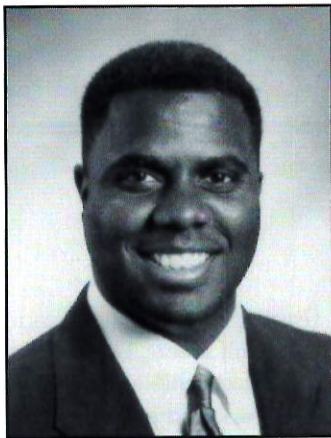
For the first time in four seasons, the Lady Badgers did not finish fourth in the GCAC. The goals set by Walker every preseason have not changed since he arrived at the Hill.

"We try to finish in the top four in the conference and have a winning season each year, and we did not do that last year," Walker said. "In relation to the other teams in our conference we have a senior-dominated lineup, while most of the other teams have players playing at the college level for the first time."

This year's schedule includes a challenging pre-conference slate, including two games each against the University of West Florida and Auburn-Montgomery. SHC will venture to the St. Louis area for two games against Harris-Stowe State College and Lindenwood College, teams perennial ranked in the Top 25. In addition, the college will host the Port City Classic in December.

In GCAC play, Xavier University and Louisiana College have a majority of their teams returning and will be in contention for the conference championship. Also included will be a pair of contests against cross-town rival University of Mobile. The challenging schedule should prepare the Lady Badgers for one of two spots at the NAIA National Tournament in March.

## HEAD COACH - WOMEN'S BASKETBALL & ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

# JAMES WALKER

James Walker has guided the Spring Hill women's basketball program to steady success in the 1990s. Now entering his fifth year at the Hill, Walker has been the most successful women's coach posting a respectable .523 percentage (66-60) over the last four years and will more than likely become the winningest coach in Spring Hill history by the end of this season. Last season, Walker suffered his first sub .500 season in his career, as the Lady Badgers finished with a 14-17 overall record.

Under his guidance, Walker and the Lady Badgers have made four straight appearances in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference Tournament. Annually competing against some of the top teams in the nation, the Lady Badgers have managed a fourth place conference finish for four consecutive seasons.

The Jackson, Tenn., native is a 1990 graduate of Morehouse College in Atlanta, Ga., where he earned his bachelor of arts degree in business administration. He also earned his master's degree from the United States Sports Academy, receiving a double major in sport management and sport coaching. While at Morehouse, Walker set the career record for assists, with 712 and led the 1989-90 team to a NCAA Division II Final Four appearance.

After his collegiate career ended, he played professionally in France for three months.

Walker was recently named athletic director and will oversee the administration of the now eleven sport Badger and Lady Badger athletic programs. He continues to coach the women's cross country team, and will have two runners compete in the NAIA national tournament this year. James and his wife, Kimberly, have a one-year-old son, Kendall.

# TERRY FOWLER

Terry Fowler begins his fifth year as the Lady Badger's top assistant coach. He is responsible for scouting opponents in addition to on-the-floor coaching duties.

Fowler had director of the new Student Recreation Center to his added list of responsibilities. He oversees the daily operations of the \$7.3 million facility that opened this summer. He continues to serve as coordinator for the SHC intramural program.

The Jackson, Tenn., native is a 1986 graduate of Lane College, where he was twice named to the SIAC All-Conference team. He also earned his master's degree in sport coaching from the United States Sports Academy in 1995.

Stephen Brown joins the Lady Badger staff as a graduate assistant coach for the 1997-98 season.

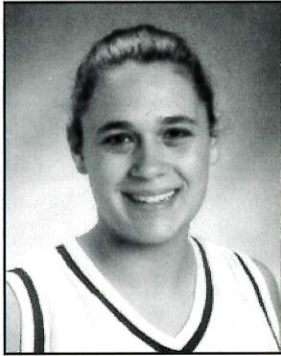

Brown and his wife, Makenzie, have a four-year old-son, Kyle.



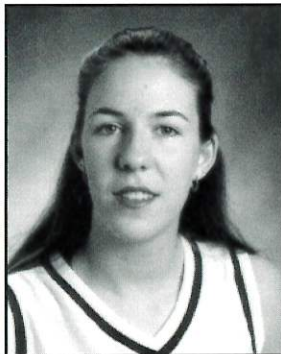

# PREVIEW

Over the past three years, the Spring Hill men's basketball team has been led by a trio of all-conference performers. Each concluded their careers at the Hill with more than 1,000 points, while providing solid leadership and stability for a program that has demonstrated a winning tradition over the last decade.

The program made three consecutive trips to the NAIA National Tournament in the 1990s and narrowly missed a fourth trip last season as two last second shots rimmed out in the closing seconds of the conference tournament final to end the Badgers' up-and-down season with a 16-15 overall record and 10-8 (tied 4th) mark in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference.

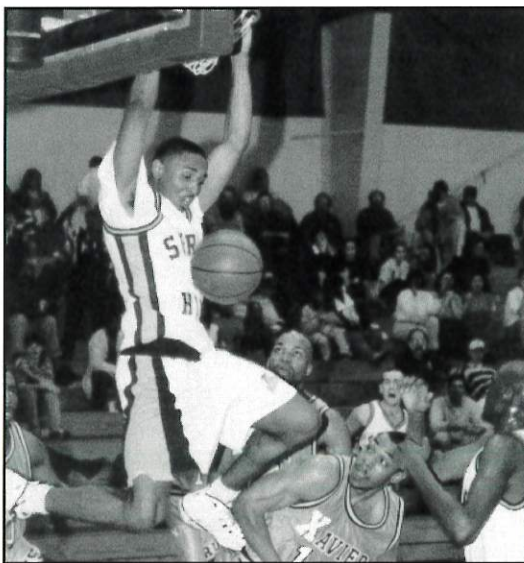
As the 1997-98 season begins, there is a changing of the guard for the Badger program. A new home and a roster full of talented newcomers to play in their new home debuts this season.

In years past, the basketball program has been a traveling road show playing in high school gymnasiums, community recreation centers, and any other place the team could find. This season, the Badger basketball program debuts in the recently completed \$7.3 million Student Recreation Center.

Headlining the Badgers of 1997-98 will be junior forward Eric Campbell (14.5 ppg, 9.8 rpg). Named All-GCAC and All-GCAC Tourney last season, the 6'4" native of Thomasville, Ala., led the team in scoring, rebounding, field goal percentage and blocked shots. Campbell posted 15 double-double outings, including seven in a row. He also managed a double-double in each of the games of the tourney, including a personal best 19 rebound effort in a victory over Tougaloo College.

The other remaining starter from last year is 6'1" junior guard Wali Harrison (9.0 ppg, 4.3 rpg). The Lansing, Mich., native will be expected to step up his game from a reserve role in his freshman season to a starter for most of last year.

Down in the post area, juniors 6'7" Jason Allen and 6'8" Ronald Robinson will



be joined by talented freshman newcomer 6'8" Nicky Saacks (New Orleans, La.). Saacks, and All-City performer at Brother Martin High School, averaged 17.6 points and 10.8 rebounds per game.

At the small forward, 6'4" Josh Frerman returns for his senior season. He will be joined by junior transfer 6'4" Danny Ladd. The younger brother of former Badger Dwight (D.J.) Ladd, averaged 16 points and eight rebounds per game at nearby Faulkner State Community College.

Out on the perimeter, five newcomers will see a major amount of time on the court and will be expected to make major contributions to the program. 6'0" Cliff McSwine and 6'2" Michael Gorke are talented junior college transfers, while 6'1" John Voisey (Slidell, La.), 6'2" Mike Fleming (St. Louis, Mo.) and 5'9" Lamar Hinton (Carbondale, Ill.) are freshman newcomers.

McSwine averaged 10 points, seven assists, and three steals in two seasons at Morton College in Illinois. Gorke started his playing career at the University of West Florida, before transferring to Wallace State Community College in Dothan, Ala., last year. Voisey averaged 16 points, five assists and four steals per game and was an All-Parish and All-District player at former Badger Eddie Timmons' alma mater, Salmen High School. Fleming was an All-Conference selection at St. Louis area basketball powerhouse DeSmet, while Hinton was a member of a conference championship squad at Carbondale High School in Illinois.

"Each season we have a different level of guys stepping in," says fifth-year head coach Joe Niland. "It is going to be difficult having to replace three 1,000-point scorers."

The Badgers open in their new home with a non-conference game against Wesley College. The Badgers will face their usual demanding and challenging pre-conference schedule. Highlights include a trip to cross-town rival University of Mobile to participate in the Pepsi-University of Mobile Classic, two games against perennial NAIA power Auburn-Montgomery, with former Mississippi State star Marcus Bullard and a return journey to Charlotte, N.C., for the Marriott Classic, which features all NCAA Division II schools including top-ranked University of South Carolina-Spartanburg.

The GCAC race is equally challenging with a majority of schools having a legitimate chance at a conference crown. Dillard University, William Carey College and the University of Mobile are rated in the top three in the conference pre-season poll. To arrive at the conference tournament championship in March, the Badgers will have to survive a difficult and challenging schedule. Spring Hill hopes that the Badgers can live up to their namesakes and have the tenacity to survive and end up with one of two spots to the National Tournament.

# JOE NILAND

Joe Niland begins his fifth season as head coach of the Spring Hill men's basketball program as the fifth-all time winningest coach at the Hill. In four years, Niland has posted a .650 winning percentage (80-43), and has guided the team to a berth in the NAIA National Tournament, as well as a Gulf Coast Athletic Tournament championship, and three straight 20-win seasons. Last season, the Badgers narrowly missed their fourth trip to the national tournament, finishing their season with a 16-14 overall record and fourth place finish in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference.

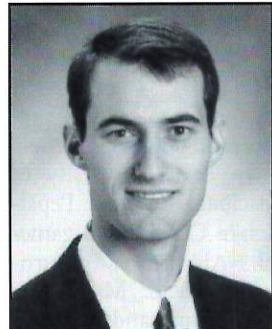
Niland came to the Hill after spending three seasons (1990-93) at Florida Southern College in Lakeland, Fla. He assisted Head Coach Gordon Gibbons and helped guide the Moccasins to a 73-20 record, two Sunshine State Conference championships and two berths in the NCAA Division II National Tournament.

From 1988-90, Niland was an assistant to Richard Schmidt at the University of Tampa. There, he helped lead the Spartans to two SSC titles and two NCAA Division II National Tournament berths.

Niland earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Buffalo in 1981. His family has a strong basketball background. His father, Joe Sr., was a former player and coach at Canisius College in Buffalo, and was director of college scouting for the Buffalo Braves of the NBA. His uncle, Tom Niland, was a long-time coach and athletic director at LeMoyne College. His brother, David, is the head basketball coach at Penn State-Behrend College in Erie, Penn., and his cousin, John Beilein, was recently named the new head coach at Richmond University after a stint as head coach at Canisius College.

Former student-athletes under Niland's tutelage have entered the coaching ranks including Mark Hubbard ('94) at nearby Alba High School, Marc Allen ('93) at Mobile Christian School, Eric Lovett ('97) at Williamson High School (J.V. head coach), along with Sam Coates (Colorado College of Mines), and Derek Wright ('93) and Demetrics Tyson ('94) at Dallas Jesuit (freshman team).

Niland and his wife, Ellen, have four children, A.J., Katelin, Jake, and Patrick.

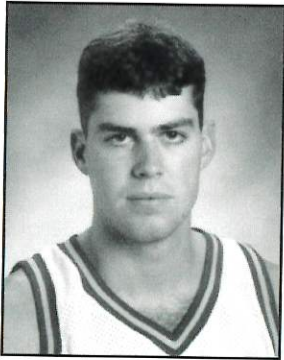
Shipwash earned his bachelor of arts degree in history from Greensboro College.

# The NAIA – Providing Balanced Athletics Programs for 60,000 Student-Athletes



**T**hroughout its history, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) has provided strong leadership for all aspects of intercollegiate sports. Since its introduction of intercollegiate championship basketball in 1937, the NAIA has maintained the highest standards while administering first-rate athletics programs.

Time and time again, the NAIA has stepped forward to address the important issues of the day — be it racial integration in the '40s and '50s or establishing the first women's championship program in 1980. The NAIA has not been afraid to enact changes while others have watched and waited.

In the past decade, presidents of the NAIA colleges and universities have assumed a position of responsible leadership. The NAIA's Council of Presidents, the organization's primary governing body, is comprised of 32 college and university presidents from all regions of the United States.

With its major emphasis on educational development, it was natural for the NAIA to further strengthen academic eligibility requirements in the mid-'80s. All NAIA participating student-athletes must maintain a certain grade-point-average (GPA) while accumulating credit hours for a declared academic degree. Unlike other associations, NAIA student-athlete academic eligibility is monitored on a term-by-term basis.

The All-America Scholar-Athlete program, a long-standing NAIA tradition, recognizes junior and senior student-athletes with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale). This past year, more than 700 NAIA student-athletes were so honored, representing 225 member institutions.

During the '90s, the waves of change once again washed over the NAIA. The membership voted to institute affiliated conference and regional groupings and discontinue the use of district play as a means of qualification for national championships, marking the first time since the NAIA's creation that district competition would not be used.

Since 1937, the NAIA has administered athletics programs and championships in proper balance with the overall collegiate educational experience. Serving higher education in this manner is a responsibility the NAIA does not take lightly. It is a relationship built on confidence and trust — a relationship strengthened year after year. The future of 60,000 young people is too important to handle any other way.

# GULF COAST ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Gulf Coast Athletic Conference developed out of a series of meetings held over a period of almost four years. A number of private four-year schools in the Gulf Coast region with similar educational standards, enrollments, budgets, and athletic philosophies mutually felt the need for a conference.

In April and May 1981, a constitution was developed, officers were elected and the decision was made to proceed with conference competition during the 1981-82 school year. Charter officers were Anthony M. Rachal Jr., Xavier University, president; John Burton, Spring Hill College, vice-president; Mark Windham, Belhaven College, secretary/treasurer, and Thomas Howell, Louisiana College, commissioner.

Charter members were Belhaven College of Jackson, Miss.; Dillard University and Xavier University of New Orleans; Louisiana College of Pineville, La., Spring Hill College, Tougaloo College of Tougaloo, Miss., and William Carey College of Hattiesburg, Miss.

In August 1981, the GCAC received recognition as an NAIA affiliated conference. The University of Mobile was admitted in October, 1985. Southern University in New Orleans was granted admission in May 1986, and Loyola University of New Orleans was admitted in April 1995, rounding out the present membership.

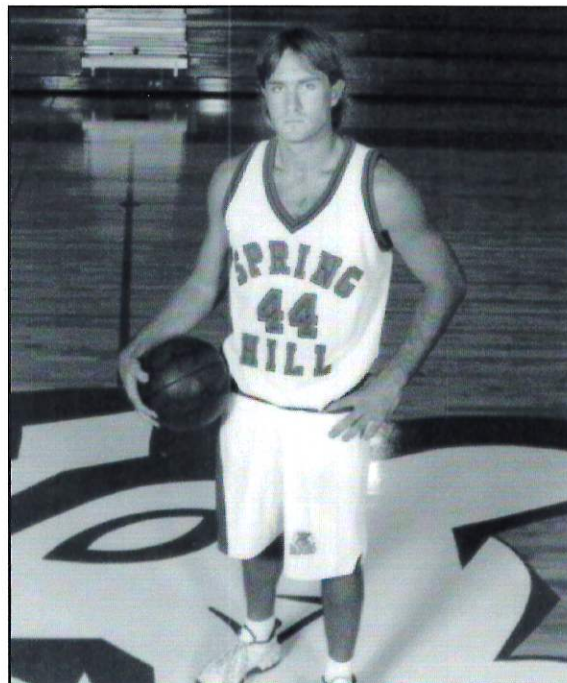

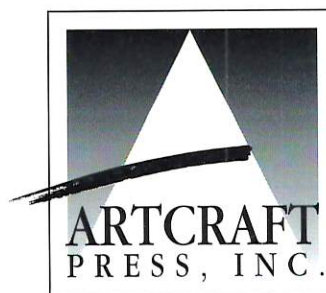
