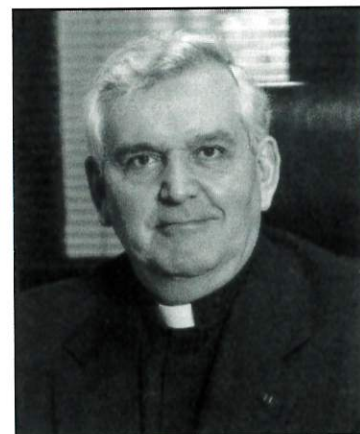
We value the support of all our fans. Your continued support of our players is a vital link in our chain of success.

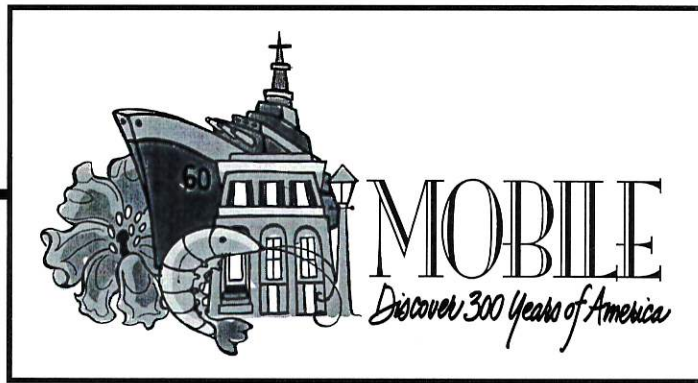

## MOBILE — DISCOVER 300 YEARS OF AMERICA



Rooted in southern tradition, the people of Mobile are committed to the ethics and values that make America great. Through grassroots community projects, Mobilians are active in making the Port City a better place to live, visit, and enjoy. This spirit of cooperation and commitment toward the future placed Mobile in a top-seed position for the title “All America City.” That title, now won, can be seen by visitors not only on the city’s street-side banners, but in the smiles of the friendly people of Mobile.

Mobile has always prospered because of its strategic location. A deep bay and harbor area offer a perfect shipping port. The barrier islands of Gulf Shores and Dauphin Island were ideal for military strategists. There they built strong forts to assure that only welcome guests ventured into the bay. Today these many historic forts offer visitors a glimpse into the past.

The international trade sustained by Mobile throughout her 300-year history has provided even the earliest settlers with the finer things from Europe, England, the Mediterranean and the Orient. Mobile’s five historic house-museums, are open to the public year-round and display artifacts native to this land, and treasures brought from far away.



Grand houses and public buildings, each with their own distinctive charm, reflect the builders’ and owners’ taste and heritage. Festivals and the observance of religious holidays were not forgotten by early settlers. From its founding in 1702, Mobile has celebrated Christmas, “Boef Gras” (now called Mardi Gras), Lent, Easter and more. Modern-day celebrations now include Azalea Trail Run & Festival (March), Providence Festival of Flowers (March), BayFest (October), Kwanza (December), and First Night Mobile (December).

It is no wonder that words such as “southern hospitality,” “charm,” and beauty,” are frequently used to describe this 300-year-old Port City.

After nearly six decades of traveling, the Spring Hill College basketball program finally has a place to call home.

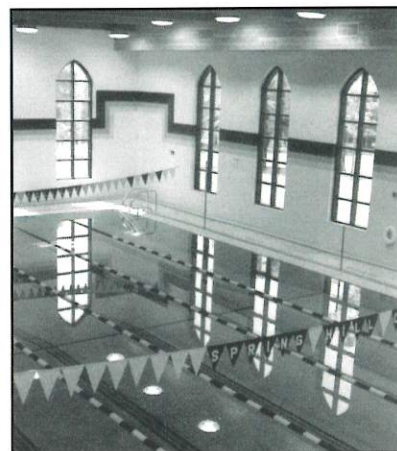
Opened to the campus in June 1997, the \$7.3 Arthur R. Outlaw Student Recreation Center is a state-of-the-art recreational facility utilized by the students, faculty and staff of Spring Hill.

The facility includes a modern

weight room, complete with free weights, station training, and cardiovascular equipment. This equipment was graciously donated by John Burke, a 1963 Spring Hill graduate.

Also included in the facility is a six-lane, 25-yard swimming pool, two raquetball courts, and a dance/aerobics studio, as well as locker room and training facilities for students and staff. Athletic department offices and a Hall of Fame Room for special receptions are housed on the upper level.

The centerpiece of the facility is the 2,000-seat gymnasium. The facility is the home for the men's and women's intercollegiate basketball and campus intramural programs.

## 1998-99 BADGERS SEASON

# PREVIEW

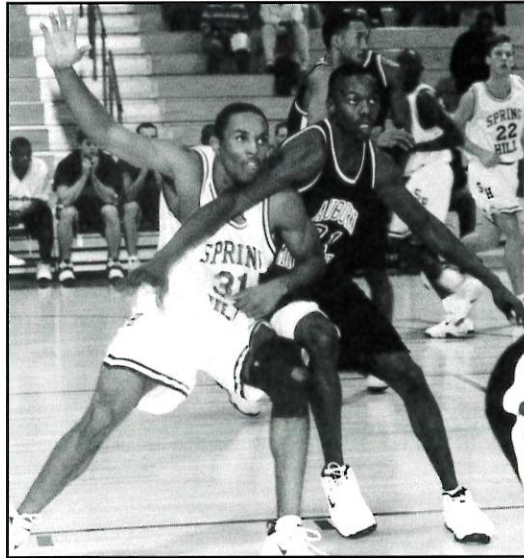
The past decade has been a successful one for the Spring Hill Badgers. After posting just nine winning seasons in 38 years (1946 through 1984) and just two Conference Championships (1950-51, 1974-75), the Badgers of the 90's have had eight winning seasons since 1990-91 and have posted 13 winning seasons since 1984-85.

Under the tutelage of former Badger Coach Carl Nash, the 90's had a roaring start with District 30 Championships in 1991-92 and 1992-93. The success continued in the 1993-94 season under then first-year Badger Coach Joe Niland, with a GCAC Championship, being led by Honorable Mention All Americans Marc Allen and Ronald Gomez. The team went to the 1993-94 NAIA National Tourney.

Spring Hill players have been as successful off the court as they have been on the court. Since 1990-91, the Badgers have graduated 25 out of 26 seniors with many student-athletes earning Scholastic Athlete and GCAC Honor Roll Awards. Without question, Spring Hill is most proud of the academic success its student-athletes have achieved.

The success of the 90's continued last season with the Badgers posting a respectful 22-9 overall record and 13-5 conference mark. Optimism is high for the 1998-99 campaign with a veteran squad returning, led by All American Eric Campbell and All Conference performer Wali Harrison.

Last season Coach Joe Niland asked Campbell to shoulder most of the team's offensive production, being one of few returning experienced players. Campbell responded with an outstanding junior year, posting Spring Hill records for points in season (764) and field-goal percentage (.668). The 6'5" senior from Thomasville, Ala., averaged 24.6 points a game which earned him NAIA All American and GCAC Player of the Year honors for the second time. For the 1998-99 season, Niland believes that Campbell will not have to carry as much of the burden. With a veteran squad back, the Hill can return to a more balanced attack.



Depth is certainly the word for the Badger back court this season. Six-foot-one senior, Wali Harrison, from Lansing, Mich., returns after an impressive All-Conference junior year and likely will be teamed with returning point guard, 5'9" senior Cliff McSwine from Bellwood, Ill. Pushing McSwine and Harrison will be senior Mickey Gorke, a 6'2" guard from Haifa, Israel, and sophomore sharp shooter John Voisey, 6'1" from Slidell, La. Before being hampered by back problems last season, Voisey showed signs of being an all conference-type performer. Also expected to see significant time on the court is combo guard Shane Cline, a 6'0" transfer from Clermont College. Rounding out the back court is Greg Rattigan from Sarasota, Fla.

Quality, not quantity, is the word for the Spring Hill front court. The Badgers not only return with All American Eric Campbell, but they also have two very good post players in senior Ronald Robinson and sophomore Nicky Saacks. Complimenting that trio is 6'5" sophomore, David Hughes, a local product from McGill-Toolen High School, who is now focusing on basketball after playing both basketball and baseball last year. Newcomer Anthony Younger may be the most versatile performer for the Badgers this season. The 6'5" freshman from Queens, N.Y., can play any of the five

positions on the floor and could be called on this season to do so. It is expected that Younger will see time at both post and perimeter positions. Another Badger freshman, 6'5" Shawn Mckee from Georgiana, Ala., is expected to be redshirted this season while building strength for the college game. As always, the Spring Hill Badgers play a demanding pre-conference schedule. The season opening tourney is with NAIA national power, Birmingham Southern, on Nov. 6 and 7. The home opener, Nov. 13 at the Outlaw Recreation Center, pits the Hill against the University of Central Arkansas, alma mater of Chicago Bulls great, Scottie Pippen. After home and away games versus the always very tough Faulkner University and Auburn University at Montgomery, the

Badgers close out the non-conference schedule at NAIA power Life University in Atlanta, Jan. 4.

The challenging non-conference schedule will prepare the Badgers for what could be the most balanced and competitive GCAC season ever. Conference favorites this year include last year's conference champion, University of Mobile, and GCAC tournament champion, Southern University of New Orleans. Not to be overlooked as tough competitors are GCAC power Dillard University and Xavier University, both of New Orleans. William Carey College, last year's regular season co-champion from Hattiesburg, Miss., will be contenders for a title this year. The Badgers will definitely have to fight and claw to survive this conference season.

The SHC faithful feel comfortable in their new home court at the Arthur Outlaw Recreation Center. A 12-1 home record proves the Badgers have finally found a true home court.

The 90's have brought exciting moments for Badger Basketball fans. From four district titles, GCAC Conference Championships, NAIA National Tourney appearances, and the first on-campus arena in more than 60 years, the only way to close out the decade is a return trip to the NAIA National Tourney.



## HEAD COACH - MEN'S BASKETBALL

# JOE NILAND

Joe Niland starts his sixth season as Spring Hill Badgers' Head Men's Basketball Coach. Last season, Niland became the coach with the second highest winnings at the Hill and only the second coach in Spring Hill history to break the 100 win mark (102-52), establishing a SHC best-winning percentage of .662. During his tenure at the Hill, the Badgers have posted a GCAC record of 61-25 (.709) in conference play, winning the GCAC Tourney Championship and earning a NAIA National Tourney bid in 1993-94.

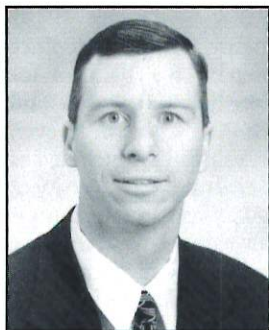
Along with the team's athletic prowess, Coach Niland also is proud of his players' academic abilities. During his time at Spring Hill, all 16 seniors who completed eligibility earned SHC degrees. Four of those former Badgers are in the coaching ranks—Eric Lovett, in Williamson, N.J.; Mark Hubbard at Alma Bryant High School; Marc Allen at Mobile Christian School; and Sam Coats at Colorado College of Minnesota.

Niland, a 1981 graduate of the University of Buffalo, came to the Hill from Florida Southern College in Lakeland, Fla., where he was assistant to head coach Gordon Gibbons from 1990-93. During his three-year stint at FSC, the Moccasins were 73-20, earning two Sunshine State Conference Championships and two berths in NCAA, Division II National Tournaments.

From 1988-90, Niland was an assistant for Richard Schmidt at the University of Tampa. The Spartans won two Sunshine State Conference titles and two NCAA Division II berths in the National Tourney.

Coaching is in the Niland blood lines. His father, Joe Sr., was a head coach at Canisius College in Buffalo, N.Y., and was director of college scouting for the Buffalo Braves (LA Clippers) of the NBA. His uncles, Tom and Mike, had long coaching careers. Tom was at LeMoyne College for 43 years, while Mike coached in the Buffalo parochial high schools for many years. His brother, David, is head basketball coach at Penn State-Behrend College in Erie, Penn. Joe's cousin, John Beilein, is the head basketball coach at Richmond University in Virginia.

Niland is married to the former Ellen Bonin. They have four children: A.J. (14), Katelin (11), Jake (6), and Patrick (2).

# JOE DAWSON

Boca Raton native Joe Dawson enters his first season as the assistant coach of the Men's Basketball Program. Dawson comes from Florida Southern College where he was an assistant coach last season. He assisted Head Coach Gordon Gibbons and helped guide the Moccasins to a 24-6 record, a Sunshine State Conference Tournament Championship, and a berth in the NCAA Division II National Tournament.

Prior to Florida Southern, Dawson was the head coach for Miami Pace High School in Miami, Fla. He posted a 107-23 record over four years and won the 1996 Class 4A Florida State Championship.

Dawson played for Florida Southern from 1987-1990, where he competed on three Sunshine State Conference Championship teams. He appeared in NCAA Division II Tournaments and the Final Four in 1988. Dawson earned his degree in criminology from Florida Southern. He is responsible for recruiting, scouting, video exchange, and other administrative duties in addition to on-the-floor coaching.

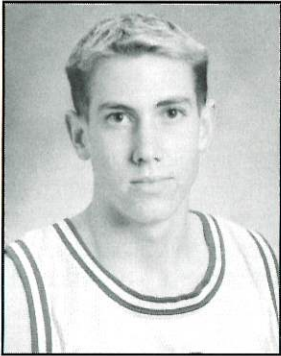
# JON STAUFFER

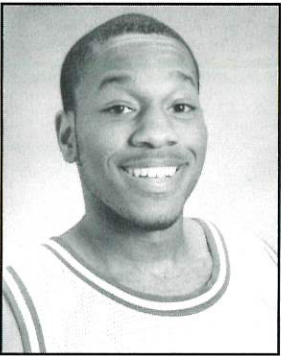

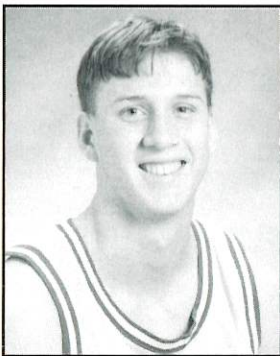


## 13 CLIFF McSWINE

## 22 JOHN VOISEY

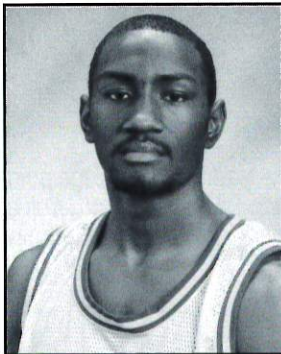
**6'1" SOPHOMORE GUARD SLIDELL, LA.**

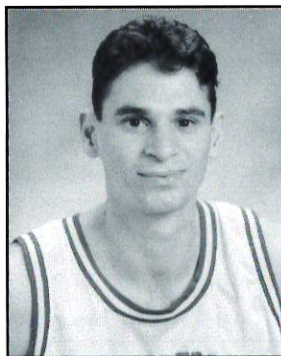


## 23 WALI HARRISON

## 1998 - 99 LADY BADGER SEASON

# PREVIEW

First-year coach Terry Fowler moves up a level from his assistant coaching position of the past five years. During his time as an assistant, Fowler helped the Lady Badgers become one of the top programs in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference. Now the program's mission is to win the conference championship and reach the NAIA National Tournament in Fowler's hometown of Jackson, Tenn.

Spring Hill is an institution with a rich academic tradition, and the Lady Badgers have enjoyed the benefits of success in the classroom as well as on the court. Since 1993-94 the Lady Badgers have graduated 11 out of 12 seniors. Many of the Lady Badgers have also earned GCAC Honor Roll and Scholar Athlete Awards. The program is held to a high academic, as well as athletic, standard.

The coaching staff welcomes back nine Letter Winners from the 1997-98 squad, which finished 17-13 overall and 11-7 in the GCAC. Gone from last year's squad is Donmeka Martin, four-time GCAC All-Conference, 1997-98 third-team All-American, 1996-97 Co-GCAC Player of the Year, and SHC's all-time leader in blocks, rebounds and points. Four-year Letter Winner, Alice Turni, is also gone from the squad.

The Lady Badgers will look for leadership from its three returning starters. Juniors Jill Mathias (9.5 ppg) and All-Conference selection Lindsey Stuardi (10.2 ppg 4.8 apg and 79 ft%) return after starting all 30 games last season. Co-captains Mathias and Stuardi will be expected to provide solid leadership both on and off the court to a relatively inexperienced team. Both have worked extremely hard during the off-season and set high goals for themselves as well as their teammates. Sophomore guard Jessica Wendolek, who had an outstanding freshman season (10 ppg, 48 fg%, and 78 ft%) while starting the majority of the season, will be asked to develop a scorer's mentality and rebound



this season. These three will be as good a back court as there is in the GCAC and will be asked to pick up the scoring load due to the departure of Martin.

Filling the center position is a major concern for the coaching staff. Senior Jennifer Nalu is still suffering pain after rehabilitating from a season-ending knee surgery last year and may be lost for the season. Sophomore Karen Stokes and freshman Sara Daugherty are possible candidates for the starting role. Stokes, coming off a season-ending injury, has been impressive in the pre-season. Freshman Julie Deese will spend this year getting adjusted to the college game. The group of post players adds a good deal of size, but lacks experience.

The forward position will be key to the Lady Badgers success this season. Sophomore Nicolette Nalu makes the transition from the perimeter after spending the summer learning her new position. Nalu's perimeter skills will make it difficult for opponents to match up. She has been impressive during pre-season workouts. Jennifer McGinnis, a talented transfer from Western Kentucky University, will join the Lady Badgers in January. The former Miss Basketball in the state of Tennessee and High School Parade All-American will bolster a young front court. The junior will add Division I experience and is expected to take the younger players

under her wing.

To support the returning starters, the Lady Badgers look to a combination of experienced veterans and a talented group of freshmen. Fifth-year senior guard Elvia D'Orcy returns after missing last season with a medical redshirt. D'Orcy will play all the perimeter positions. Along with junior Heather Wingard, she brings quickness and will add depth to an already strong back court. Wingard is known as a tough defender and will be asked to defend our opponents' best perimeter players. Also adding depth to the Lady Badgers back court will be sopho-

more Caty Butorac, who spent last season adjusting to college play. Freshman Colleen Johnson could push for playing time if she makes the adjustment to the college game.

"Though this team is young, they have set their goals high and understand the hard work it takes to compete in this conference night in and night out," Coach Fowler said. "February has been a tough month for us the past two seasons. Our goal is to be a better basketball team in February than we were in January and to be playing well heading into the conference tournament."

The pre-conference schedule, with two games each against the University of West Alabama, University of West Florida, and Auburn-Montgomery, should prepare the Lady Badgers for the GCAC. SHC also will take on the likes of the University of Montevallo and host the always-tough Port City Classic in December, with games against Berry College and a rare match up against the University of South Alabama.

In GCAC play, Xavier University and Louisiana College are expected to be in contention for the conference title. Also included will be a pair of highly anticipated contests with cross-town rival, University of Mobile. This challenging schedule should prepare the Lady Badgers to earn one of 32 spots at the NAIA National Tournament in March.

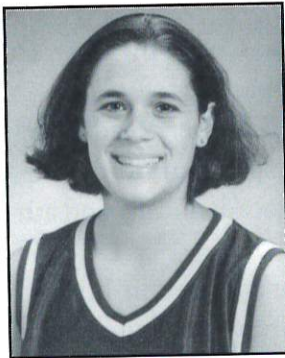

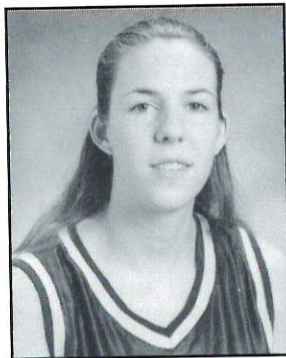


## 00 NICOLETTE NALU

# GULF COAST ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Gulf Coast Athletic Conference developed out of a series of meetings held over a period of almost four years. A number of private four-year schools in the Gulf Coast region with similar educational standards, enrollments, budgets, and athletic philosophies mutually felt the need for a conference.

In April and May 1981, a constitution was developed, officers were elected and the decision was made to proceed with conference competition during the 1981-82 school year. Charter officers were Anthony M. Rachal Jr., Xavier University, president; John Burton, Spring Hill College, vice-president; Mark Windham, Belhaven College, secretary/treasurer, and Thomas Howell, Louisiana College, commissioner.

Charter members were Belhaven College of Jackson, Miss.; Dillard University and Xavier University of New Orleans; Louisiana College of Pineville, La., Spring Hill College, Tougaloo College of Tougaloo, Miss., and William Carey College of Hattiesburg, Miss.

In August 1981, the GCAC received recognition as an NAIA affiliated conference. The University of Mobile was admitted in October, 1985. Southern University in New Orleans was granted admission in May 1986, and Loyola University of New Orleans was admitted in April 1995, rounding out the present membership.

# The NAIA

## PROVIDING BALANCED ATHLETIC PROGRAMS FOR 60,000 STUDENT-ATHLETES



Throughout its history, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) has provided strong leadership for all aspects of intercollegiate sports. Since its introduction of intercollegiate championship basketball in 1937, the NAIA has maintained the highest standards while administering first-rate athletic programs.

Time and time again, the NAIA has stepped forward to address the important issues of the day - be it racial integration in the '40s and '50s or establishing the first women's championship program in 1980. The NAIA has not been afraid to enact changes while others have watched and waited.

In the past decade, presidents of the NAIA colleges and universities have assumed a position of responsible leadership. The NAIA's Council of Presidents, the organization's primary governing body, is comprised of 32 college and university presidents from all regions of the United States.

With its major emphasis on educational development, it was natural for the NAIA to further strengthen academic eligibility requirements in the mid-'80s. All NAIA student-athletes must maintain a certain grade-point-average (GPA) while accumulating credit hours for a declared academic degree. Unlike other associations, NAIA student-athlete academic eligibility is monitored on a term-by-term basis. The All-America Scholar Athlete program, a long-standing NAIA tradition, recognizes junior and senior student-athletes with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale). This past year, more than 700 NAIA student-athletes were so honored, representing 225 member institutions.

During the '90s, the waves of change once again washed over the NAIA. The membership voted to institute affiliated conference and regional groupings and discontinue the use of district play as a means of qualification for national championships, marking the first time since the NAIA's creation that district competition would not be used.

Since 1937, the NAIA has administered athletic programs and championships in proper balance with the overall collegiate educational experience. Serving higher education in this manner is a responsibility the NAIA does not take lightly. It is a relationship built on confidence and trust - a relationship strengthened year after year. The future of 60,000 young people is too important to handle any other way.

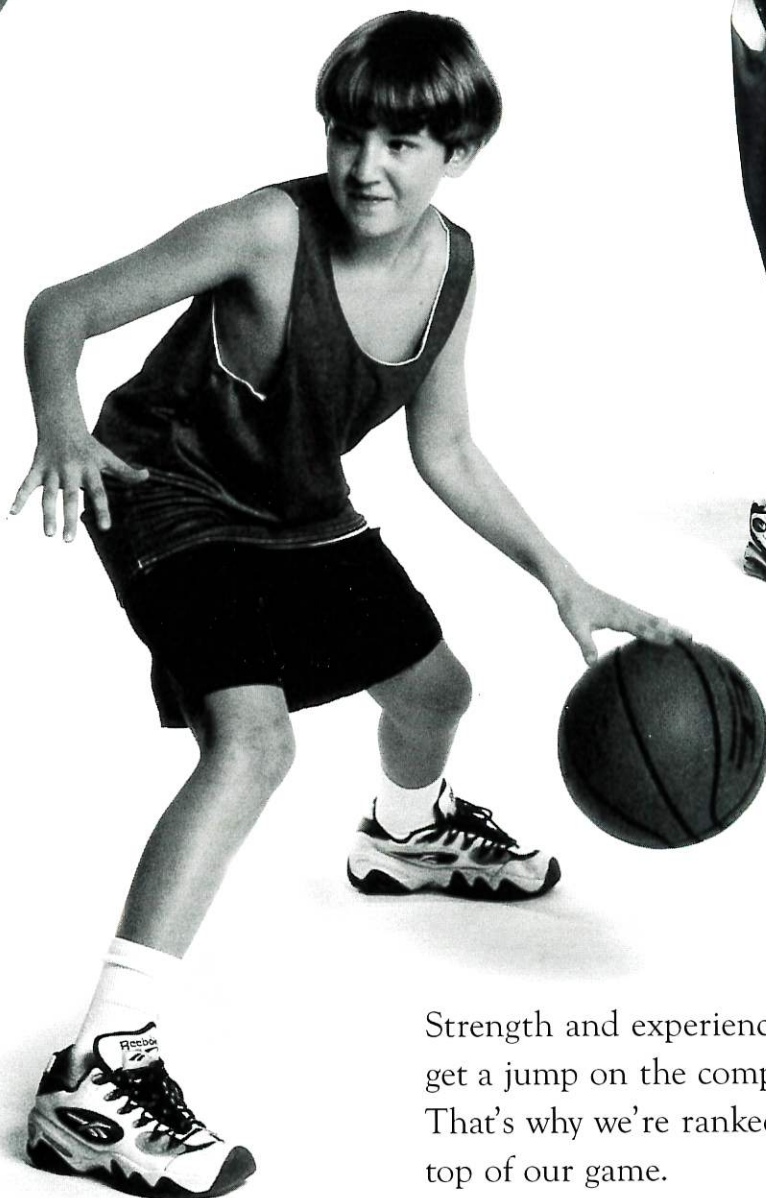
