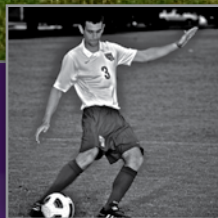

HEAD COACH

PREVIEW 2010



TIM BROOKS begins his first season as the SHC Men's Soccer Head Coach in 2010 after a successful three-year tenure at the University of Great Falls in Montana where he held an overall record of 24-16-1.

At UGF, Brooks' Argonauts squad was a finalist at NAIA Unaffiliated/Independent Conference

Tournament in 2009 in only its third year of competition and finished with a 15-5 record. In 2008, UGF compiled an 8-8-1 record in its first full season of play and was a semifinalist at the UIC Tournament.

Before taking the reins at Great Falls, Brooks was the Assistant Men's Soccer Coach/Goalkeepers Coach at the University of the Cumberland from 2004 to 2007.

As a player, Brooks was a 2nd Team All American at Cumberland College and earned 1st Team All Conference accolades. He was chosen his team's Most Valuable player (MVP) and served as the football team's kicker and punter in his senior year.

He completed his B.S. in Health, Movement and Leisure Studies from Cumberland College, in Williamsburg, Ky., in 2004 and earned a Masters degree in Organizational Management-Human Development from the University of Great Falls in 2009.

Tim and his wife, Misty, have a 3 year-old daughter, Faith, and a 1 year-old son, Isaac.

Spring Hill College's new Head Coach Tim Brooks stresses one aspect of the game more than any other. "We must come together as a team to be successful this year," he says. "We have a new coaching staff, we're learning a new system, and a lot of new players have come into the program since last year. You don't have much time in the spring and summer preseason practices to implement a new system, but we've progressed well so far and I see no reason why we can't be successful."

Even a quick glance at Brooks' coaching record shows that he can build a program in a hurry. In his first stint as a head coach at the University of Great Falls, Brooks took the program from an inaugural record of 1-5 in 2007 to a 15-5 record in 2009.

Brooks takes over a program that is ripe for success. His roster includes 28 players including 17 veterans. "Right now we have the players, but leadership is something we have to learn," he says. "As coaches, we have to teach it. We have to find ways to develop it."

Brooks also likes what he sees in his 11 freshmen. "We have guys who are fighting for starting positions and that's something we need," he says. "We need competition at practice. They also know that they are fighting to win the role of who's going to be first off the bench each game. Our freshmen are going to develop over time, of course, but they are also going to help right away."

Brooks believes that the most important thing his team can do on the field is keep possession of the ball. "Keeping possession creates more spaces and that leads to more attack opportunities," he says. "Again, the key is that we must play as a whole unit."

One area where fans will notice a new look right away will be the midfield. Not only has last season's emotional team leader Zachariah Townsend graduated, but Brooks looks to change the SHC midfield from being simply a transitional zone from defense to offense into a more attack oriented unit.

The Badger defense will also feature the new coach's team approach to the game. "Each individual is important in our defense, but more importantly is the whole team perspective," says Brooks. "They must come together under the new system and that can be hard to do, but with time this will be a solid unit."

On offense, Brooks refuses to put the burden of scoring on the shoulders of just one of his players. "In this system, you can't just rely on one or two players to score goals. Frankly, one of my major concerns for the early part of the season is our ability to score as we learn a new way of doing things."

The Badgers face a difficult schedule in 2010 with the college's move into the West Division of the newly expanded Southern States Athletic Conference (SSAC). "It's a tough schedule," he says. "But a good thing about moving to the SSAC is that all of our conference games come at the end of the year. That allows you to build a non-conference slate that is truly a preparation for the conference schedule. We also got a bit of a break landing three conference games at home and only two on the road this year."

"We face some difficult challenges," Brooks says. "But, as I said, if we learn to play as a whole unit and learn how to lead and accept leadership, we have the players and depth to be competitive with everyone on our schedule."

ASSISTANT COACH



M.J. TEHINI joins the Badgers for his first season in 2010. A 2008 graduate of Birmingham-Southern College with a degree in Computer Science and a minor in Business, he is currently working toward his MBA at Spring Hill.

Over his four-year career at BSC, Tehini played in 31 matches as a midfielder. He

prepped at Briarwood Christian School in Birmingham, Alabama, where he was a 1st team All-State performer.

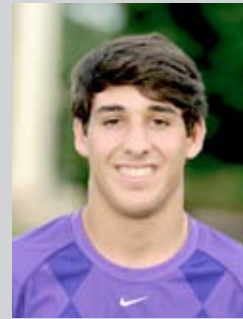

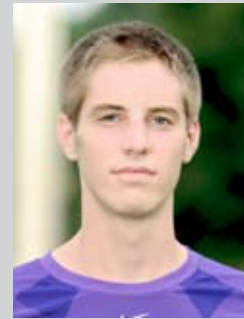
