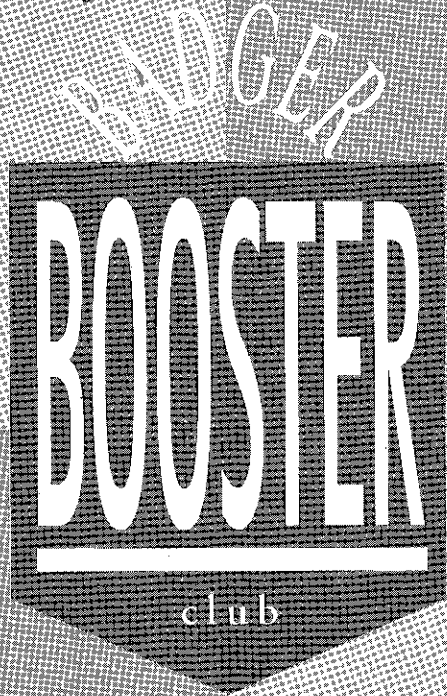

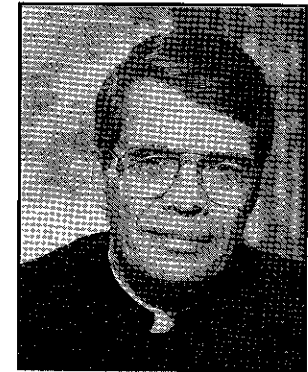

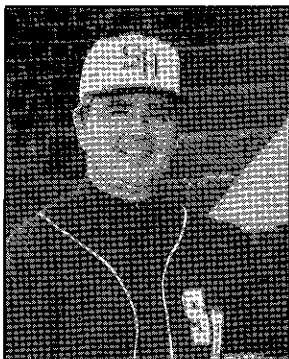

### *Frank Sims, Head Baseball Coach and Director of Athletics*

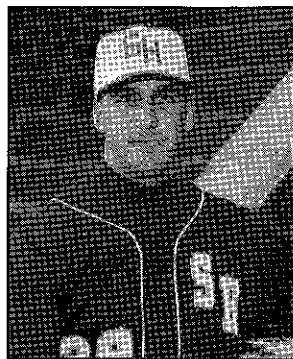
Frank is entering his tenth season as the Badgers' skipper. Frank begins the 1995 campaign four wins short of being the Badgers' all-time winningest coach.

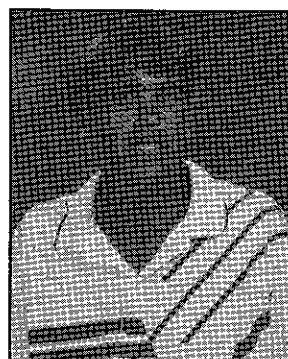
### *Joe Stutz, Assistant Baseball Coach*

Brooks is beginning his first year as the Head Tennis Coach at Spring Hill.

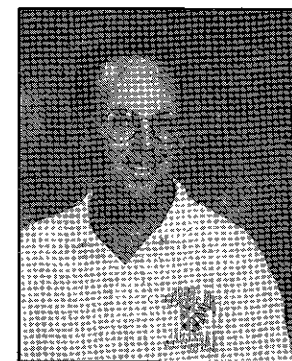
Brooks will be responsible for both the mens' and womens' teams at "Hill."

## Baseball Outlook

When the Badgers take the field February 11th for their home opener they will have a different look due to the loss of five starters from last year's 31-18 team. The biggest losses were in the pitching staff, junior right hander Blake Stien was drafted and signed with the St. Louis Cardinals. Freshman and All-Conference pitcher Chris Demouy transferred to LSU. Other key losses were outfielder Jeff Burg, batting average leader with .339. Jeff was also named to the GCAC All-Conference Team. Senior third baseman Dan Divis is also a key loss, the Chicago native led the team in RBI's with 32. The Badgers' final loss was senior catcher/first baseman Pat Barry who brought versatility and experience to the squad.

Even though the Badgers suffered many key losses from last year's squad, look for them to be as strong as ever. The Badgers have several key players returning, none more important than smooth fielding shortstop David Weems. David batted .329 last season while leading the team in RBI's with 32, doubles with 14, and only committing 4 errors at shortstop. Also returning for the Badgers will be infielder Matt Randol. Matt batted .267 last season, but led the team in homeruns and brings valuable experience to the Badger infield. Bill Horton, a very hard worker who brings a great deal of intensity to the field, will be fighting for the starting first baseman's job.

The strength of the Badgers will be in the outfield where two starters return. Senior centerfielder Chad Cedotal and junior Shea Grandquest. Cedotal is a speedy outfielder, capable of covering a lot of ground. The Badgers will be looking for Cedotal to increase his offensive output from last season when he batted .253 and stole 8 out of 9 bases. Left fielder Shea Grandquest batted .297 last season and led the Badgers in homeruns. Shea's offensive production must also increase for the Badgers to have a successful year. Transfer Mark Thompson, one of three team captains, will be a newcomer to the outfield. Mark has a major league arm and will start in rightfield. Also expected to see action will be Darryl McPherson who batted .313 in limited playing time last season.

Solid behind the plate are catchers Oscar Tomasich and sophomore Gerrit Carver. "Tomasich is an excellent defensive catcher" according to Coach Frank Sims. Returning behind the plate is Gerrit Carver who batted .297 his freshman season.

If there is a question mark this up-coming season it will be the pitching staff. This year's hurlers will be very young and without a senior leader. The staff will be led by junior Steve Quina who had a 5-4 record with an ERA of 3.63. Also returning from last year's team will be Joe Morris who came up with some big saves in last year's conference tournament, and sophomore Mike Koeth who had a 1-0 record in limited pitching appearances. Jim Ringwood returns after sitting out last season and will add valuable depth to the bullpen. Four new faces will see a good bit of action on the hill: Stephen Stokes, Steve Dewitt, Al Keaton and Zion Wooldridge.

Coach Frank Sims is excited about this up-coming season and feels "this young team has the ability to be as good as any at Spring Hill. The key to this season will be the development of our pitching staff. This team will be exciting to watch and we encourage everyone to come out and catch the Badgers in action."

Throughout its history, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) has provided strong leadership for all aspects of intercollegiate sports. ## MEN'S GOLF

### Men's Golf Outlook

The 1995 addition of the Spring Hill men's golf team should be one that has a good blend of youth and experience. The Badgers are coming off one of their most successful fall seasons in recent history. The Spring Hill linksters had strong finishes in several tournaments, but their fall season was highlighted by receiving a pre-season ranking of 24th in the NAIA national poll. The Badgers also finished their fall season by winning the Alabama State Intercollegiate Invitational, which included the defending national champions Huntingdon College and national power University of Mobile.

The Badgers will be depending on their three seniors: Ted Moloney, Bob Ekins, and Gaven Fechter for leadership on this very young squad. Look for Ted Moloney to be the Badgers' leader by playing the number one position. Bob Ekins and Gaven Fechter should also push to be in the starting five.

The Badgers' strength this season should be their depth. Junior Ciaran Fitzpatrick had an excellent fall, coming off a disappointing sophomore season. The Badgers will be relying on Ciaran to continue his fine play. Dan Patti leads a group of three sophomores all of whom will have a chance to contribute this spring. Dan has been the model of consistency playing in every tournament since his Freshman year. Dan Vaughn and Craig Alcon have shown improvement in their play from their Freshman and Sophomore seasons. They must continue to improve and work hard to break into the Badgers' top five.

The biggest reason for the Badgers' improvement is its outstanding Freshman class, led by Keith Hoard who played the number two position and competed in all six tournaments this past Fall. Keith is an All-State golfer from St. Xavier High School in Louisville, KY. Keith will be pushing Senior Ted Moloney for the number one spot on the team. John McLellan has been a pleasant surprise and finished the Fall season on a high note by finishing second in the State Intercollegiate. If John continues to improve he could be one of the finest players to play at "The Hill". Freshman Barry Steiner from St. Louis, MO played in two of the Badgers' six tournaments this fall and had mixed results. At times Barry played excellent golf, but to crack the top five he'll need to work hard on his consistency. Walk-on Bryan Snyder also hails from St. Xavier High School in Louisville, KY. His game is raw but with hard work he could develop into a fine player. Look for Bryan to use his Freshman year as a learning process and to begin challenging for the top five his Sophomore season.

The Badgers have a talented squad who should challenge for a berth in the NAIA national tournament in Tulsa, OK. The Badgers' success this spring will hinge on the continued development of their Freshmen and the leadership displayed by the seniors. Through hard work and dedication, there is no reason why the Badger Linksters cannot achieve their goal of making their first trip to the national tournament in ten years.

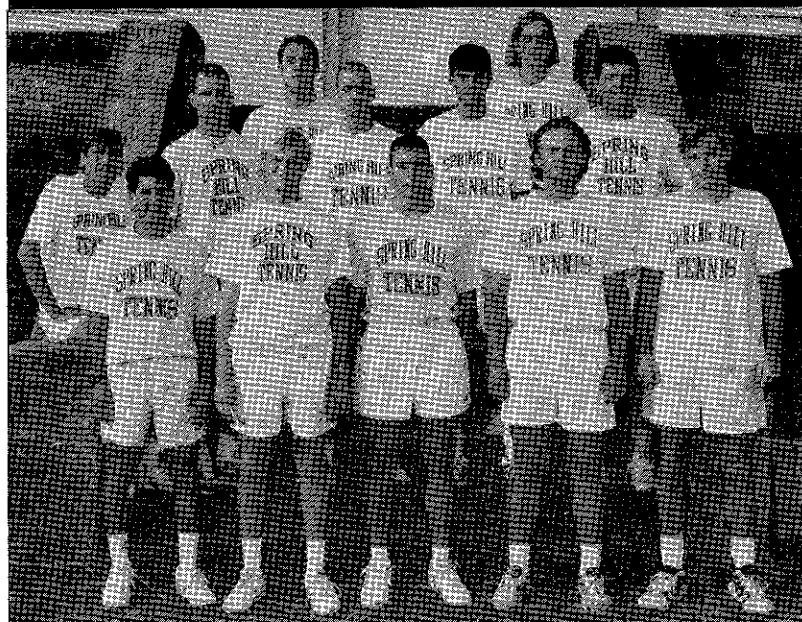
