2007-2008 PREVIEW

When Spring Hill College's new women's basketball head coach, Craig Madzinski, speaks about his first college team, there is one recurring theme to his discussions –maturity. It is a word that he mentions on a regular basis, especially when referring to three of his junior team members, guard Rashonda Belton and forward Keisha Forbes from Ft. Walton Beach, Fla., along with center Angél Parker of Westwego, La. "These players have a level of maturity that many senior-laden teams don't have," says Madzinski. "They give their heart and soul to basketball every day, and I just want them to have an enjoyable and successful season."

Madzinski joins Spring Hill after spending the last two seasons at the US Military Academy and Fairfield University and feels a common bond with his players despite knowing them for only a few months. "It's hard getting to know another system and another staff," he says, "but these ladies want to work. They want to make an impact and leave a legacy. They expect us to push them."

The 2007-08 edition of Lady Badgers basketball should be a fun team to follow since Madzinski believes in letting his players use a wide-open style. "Our core offense will be motion and our core defense will be man-to-man, but I would like to run more on offense simply because we have players who can do it. I want to play the game the way it was intended, stop the other team from scoring and then allow the players to have freedom on the offensive end," he says.

Madzinski and his first-year assistant, Megan McCracken, look forward to the season and the challenges that await their squad. "We have a lot of different pieces to fit together and make work," Madzinski says, "but I haven't even looked at the game films from last season. I told our team that we have no preconceived notions about them and that everyone has an opportunity. We're starting over, starting from scratch."

Asked about the 2007-08 schedule, Madzinski admits that it is a daunting lineup featuring three NCAA Division II teams, two games with Birmingham Southern who was NCAA Division I in 2006-07, and the traditionally tough Gulf Coast Athletic Conference rivalries. "Our non-conference schedule should give us good preparation for the season," Madzinski says. "But it will be an important time for us as we learn to use our experience. It sounds funny, but I keep telling our players that we can't control the uncontrollable. We have to learn to execute together, we score as a team, we play defense as a team, we win as a team and we lose as a team."

"We want to give these players the opportunities that others have given us," says Madzinski. "We want them to get back to enjoying basketball. Basketball players today are so over controlled on the court by their coaches that they have a hard time making their own decisions. I would rather over-teach and under-coach, than have it the other way around."

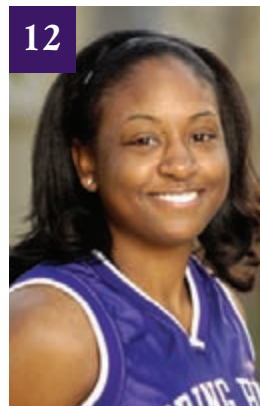
