HEAD COACH



FRANK SIMS

Frank Sims starts his 29th season at the helm of the Badgers and has compiled a 736-769-3 record over that time span. Over the 29 years he has served as a collegiate skipper, he has accumulated a career record of 772-779-3. Sims is Spring Hill's all-time winningest coach and his record includes twenty 20-win seasons, six 30-win seasons, two 40-win seasons and four conference championships. Spring Hill has appeared in the NAIA Regional Tournament four times in his reign

and Sims has been honored as a conference Coach of the Year on four occasions.

Sims' current total of 772 career wins ranks No. 15 on the NAIA's Top 20 winningest active coaches.

ASSISTANT COACH



MICHAEL BOUCHÉ

Bouché is in his fourth season as the Badger assistant coach after a four-year career as a starter on the mound for Spring Hill College. During his playing career at Spring Hill, Bouché was a two-time Daktronics-NAIA Scholar athlete and a three-time GCAC Academic Honor Roll member.

Bouché is a native of Chalmette, La., and a graduate of Holy Cross High School in New Orleans. At SHC, Bouché serves as the Badgers' pitching coach

as well as event coordinator for alumni events such as the annual alumni baseball game and Badger Baseball skeet shoot.

ASSISTANT COACH



BRIAN MURPHY

Andy is in his third season as an assistant coach at Spring Hill after enjoying a four-year career in the Badger outfield. He hit .335 during his career and owns the school's single season record for triples. During his senior season, he hit .353 with six triples and 44 RBI. McCall was a two-year starter with 81 career RBI.

McCall graduated from De Smet Jesuit High School in St. Louis, Mo., and in 2005 he helped lead

De Smet Jesuit to the State Finals. At SHC, McCall works with the hitters and outfielders and plays a key role in recruiting while also overseeing the strength & conditioning program. He also served as an assistant coach with the Laramie (Wy.) Colts of the Mountain Collegiate Baseball League during the summer of 2012. In the summer of 2013, McCall was chosen to be the head coach of the Socastee Sharks in the Beach Collegiate League located in Myrtle Beach, S.C. He led them to a league best 21-7 record to win the regular season BCBL title. McCall will be coaching the Pascagoula Pirates of the Deep South Collegiate League for the summer of 2014.

PREVIEW 2014

Spring Hill College baseball head coach Frank Sims is confident that the 2014 edition of the Badgers is ready to begin the new season. "We are leaps and bounds better than we were at the same point last year," he says. "We have a solid and experienced defense, our offense is more consistent and our pitching is deeper."

To the outside observer, the most obvious strength of the Badgers is the experience that returns to the infield. Sophomore Willie Floros of University City, Mo., returns to 3rd base after a freshman year where he started all 50 games the Badgers played in 2014 at the "hot corner." Floros will rejoin two-year starter and senior shortstop Brooks Bobinger of Mobile, Ala., on the left side of the diamond while 2nd base will be patrolled by three-year starter and NAIA Gold Glove winner senior Brian Sims of Mobile. The two Spring Hill middle infielders have combined for 243 starts in their careers. Kyle Freeman, a junior from Pensacola, Fla., moves into position at 1st base after transferring from Jefferson Davis Community College. "Our infield is solid," says Sims. "They are confident and consistent, so we look for them to have a big year."

The outfield features two new players, but it is far from being young. Left field will be manned by senior Mykol Sostarich who comes to SHC from Missouri Baptist while junior Taylor Eads of Slidell, La., takes over in right field and junior Andy Robbins of Kirkwood, Mo., returns to centerfield for his third season. "The outfield is a good group of players and they should provide more offense for us this year," says Sims.

Junior Roy Moulder of Milton, Fla., steps into the catcher's role for his first season at Spring Hill and will be backed up by junior Nick Quinn of Jacksonville, Ala. "Both of our catchers enjoyed good junior college careers," Sims says. "They will be strong on both defense and offense for us and had very good fall workouts."

The Badger pitching staff also had very good performances during the off-season according to Sims. "Our pitching staff is much more experienced and brings better knowledge of the game with them to the mound than many of our more recent staffs," he says. "Our starters are strong, our relief is deeper and we have a true closer." Sophomore Johnathan Billings of Luling, La., moves into a starting role after spending 2013 in middle relief. Sophomore Wesley Parrish of Fairhope, Ala., makes his Badger debut this year after a solid season last year at Enterprise State Community College while junior Jack Howard of Decatur, Ga., returns for his third season with Spring Hill. Sophomore Paul Sullivan from St. Louis, Mo., also moves into a starting role after a freshman campaign as a reliever in 11 contests. Sophomore Hunter Nowak of Alpharetta, Ga., who built a 3-1 record with a 2.70 ERA in seven freshman appearances, will also join the starting staff.

The relief staff is highlighted by the return of junior Keller Douglas of Covington, La., who earned five saves with a 3-2 record in 14 appearances in 2013. "Having a true closer in Douglas is nice," says Sims. "Now, it's our job to get some late leads and put more games in his hands." The middle relievers who will look to set up Douglas include junior Brady Hitt of LaPlace, La., sophomore Jesse Hanson of Hallsville, Texas, freshman Christian Bahlinger from Mandeville, La., junior Robert Quinn of Jacksonville and freshman Shane Petrie of Mobile. Junior Ryan Stevens of Theodore, Ala., will also make the transition from catcher to designated hitter and relief pitcher.

The Badger bench is deeper than in the past as sophomore shortstop Blake Toscano of Metairie, La., will see playing time because Sims hates to see his defensive skills not get put to use. Senior 3rd baseman Rick LaForce of Irvington, Ala., has 60 starts to his credit in three years at Spring Hill while junior 1st baseman Cyrus Beermann of Tampa, Fla., has experience in the field and on the mound in relief. Sophomore Garrett Webb of Gainesville, Fla., is a solid performer at both middle infield positions and sophomore Andrew Solliday of Bedford, Ind., can play 1st base and make relief appearances as needed. Junior Jacob Malkoff of Enterprise, Ala., will also see time on the infield at 1st base. Additional outfielders include junior Brian Solliday of Bedford, freshman Michael Ball of Mandeville and freshman Austin Jacques of Cumming, Ga.
