

We are grateful for the attendance and support of our fans. Your continued support is a vital link in our chain of success.



1997 BADGERS SEASON

# PREVIEW

Spring Hill College finished the 1996 season at the NAIA Southwest Regional in Houston, Texas, with a pair of impressive victories, including a 13-2 drubbing of then #1 ranked Dallas Baptist in the tourney opener. A 9-0 shutout over GCAC foe William Carey followed before a narrow loss to eventual champion, St. Mary's University of Texas, ended the Badgers season.


As Spring Hill coach Frank Sims begins his 12th season as head coach at the Hill, he surveyed The Pit for fall practice and found more than 40 players there to greet him. With the largest roster in terms of depth and talent in his 12 years, Sims will be spending a majority of the opening month of the season fine-tuning the lineup.

The 1997 roster is balanced between upperclassmen and underclassmen. Six of eight position starters return, including two All-Gulf Coast Athletic Conference selections. Four of the six finished the season batting over .300.

As in past years, one of the Badgers strengths for 1997 will be on the mound. Nine return, including five that will divide the starting pitching chores. Senior Stephen Stokes (6-3, 2.15 ERA), juniors Zion Woolridge (4-4, 2.50 ERA) and Steve DeWitt (5-4, 3.57 ERA) are coming off fine seasons, while sophomores Eric Busby (5-6, 6.07 ERA) and Trae McGill (3-1, 6.75 ERA) enjoyed measured success while adjusting to the collegiate game. Senior Michael Brabner, junior Joe Morris, and sophomores Brian Winland and Michael Cummins round out the returnees.

Among the newcomers, three freshmen join the staff this year. Dan Presel (Pascagoula, Miss.), Chris Symons (Pearl River, La.), and Joss Vinson (Fairhope High) will all compete for time on the hill in their first seasons for the Badgers.

Around the infield, SHC suffered a key blow to the lineup when All-Conference selection Sean Yanes was injured and lost for the year in an off-season automobile accident. Despite the injury, the Badgers are still



two-deep in each position, and three-deep in some.

Leading the returnees is junior Tim Hilpert, who will start the season at third base. Hilpert, an All-GCAC selection as a utility infielder last season, is the leading returning hitter (.357). He also led the team in runs scored (40), slugging percentage (.460), on-base percentage (.428), and fielding assists.

Also changing infield positions will be senior Daniel Veres (.314, 24 RBI), who will spend most of the season at first base. Sophomore George O'Dwyer (.320, 29 RBI) is the third returning starter who will either move back over to second base, or split time with Veres at first. O'Dwyer posted a respectable .986 fielding percentage, making only seven errors in 335 chances and helped turn 26 double plays last year. Junior Jared Labue (.320) rounds out the returnees.

The newcomers include three redshirts

from last season. Freshmen Mitch Ackal (Spring, Texas) Daniel Rhames (Bay Minette H.S.) and junior David Baez (Seminole J.C., Fla.) will be expected to make key contributions. Ackal is penciled in to begin the season as the starting shortstop. Junior transfer Mack Cormier (Port Sulphur, La.) rounds out the infielders.

The outfield is equally stocked in depth and talent. All-GCAC center fielder Jason Kuehl (.341, 28 RBI, 13 SB), seniors Shea Grandquest (.299, 18 RBI), Colin Uter (14 RBI), Darryl McPherson (.273, 20 SB), and junior Jason Kelly (.231) all return. The newcomers include sophomores Tony Simoncini (LaVerne, Calif.) and a transfer from the University of South Alabama, Joey Helton. Freshmen Matt Day (Murphy H.S.), Bryan Rahal (Miami, Fla.), and Al Gonzalez (Daphne H.S.) round out the group.

Behind the plate, it was difficult to lose two talented catchers in All-GCAC selection, Randy McKinion and Oscar Tomasich, to graduation, but talented newcomers are working to fill the void. Bo Gunn, from nearby Baker High School, and J.J. Poiroux, a sophomore transfer from Bishop State, will divide the duties, with senior John Steen filling in when needed.

"I think experience will be a key factor for us," Sims said. "The entire lineup is back, and plus we have people that can step in if needed."

The GCAC is well-balanced, as evidenced by three teams being named in the NAIA pre-season poll. The Badgers are ranked #16, the highest pre-season ranking in Sims' tenure at the Hill. William Carey is #24, while cross-town rival University of Mobile is #30. Both SHC and William Carey made it to the NAIA Southwest Regional in Houston last season, and hopefully the Badgers will be one of the teams invited to Dallas for this year's regional in May. "We are as good as anyone in the conference," Sims said. "It's a matter of us going on the field and getting the job done."

## FRANK SIMS

The Badgers finished the 1996 season at the NAIA Southwest Regional in Houston, Texas. It was the third trip to the Regionals for the Badgers, and the tourney yielded a pair of impressive victories, including a 13-2 victory over then #1 ranked Dallas Baptist in the tourney opener. A 9-0 shutout victory over William Carey College followed, before losses to eventual regional champ, St. Mary's University, and Dallas Baptist ended the Badgers season with a respectable 34-26 overall record, and 11-9 mark in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference.

Sims is the winningest baseball coach in Spring Hill history, reaching his 300th win in only 10-plus seasons. Under his leadership, SHC has enjoyed much success in the post-season, with three Gulf Coast Athletic Conference titles and three trips to the NAIA regional tournament. His 1992 team went 40-15 and set 18 team, individual, and conference records.

Sims began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater, Eastern Illinois University, where he earned his bachelor's degree in health, physical education, and recreation. After one season at EIU, Sims moved on to Sparta High School in Illinois, where he served as an assistant coach for football and basketball in addition to head coaching duties for the baseball team. Sims posted a 44-18 record in three seasons on the diamond.

After his experience at Sparta, Sims moved on and subsequently earned his master's degree in H.P.E.R. from Morehead State in 1980. He later became the head baseball coach at Milton College, where his squad finished 36-10, narrowly missing a berth in the NAIA World Series. Two seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater followed before he became the head coach of the Badgers late in the 1985 season.

Now in his fifth year as athletic director, Sims is a member of the executive committee of the NAIA World Series where he serves as chairperson of the International Play Committee. He also was an assistant coach for the Mobile Baysharks of the Texas Louisiana Professional Baseball League for two seasons.

Frank and his wife, Dana, have four children, Drew, 12, Sarah, 9, Kelsey, 7, and Brian, 5.



## HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER MIKE LONG


Mike Long begins his second year as the head athletic trainer, overseeing all ten varsity intercollegiate athletic programs at the Hill.




