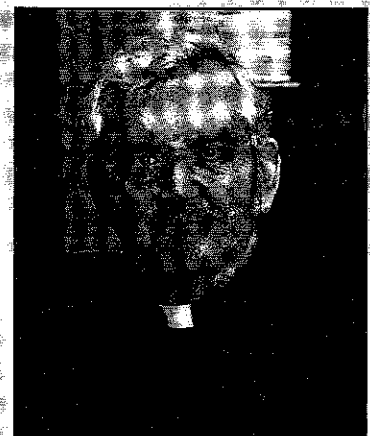
We value the strong support of our fans. Your continued support of our players is a vital link in our chain of success.

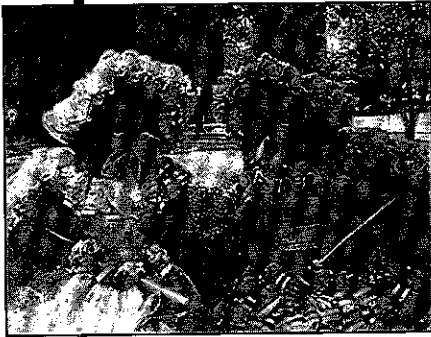

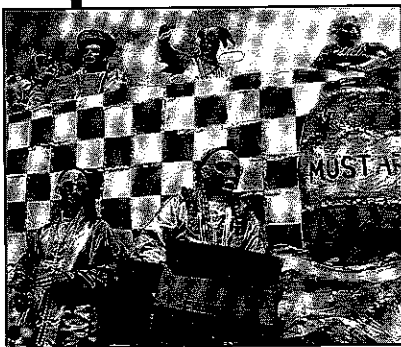
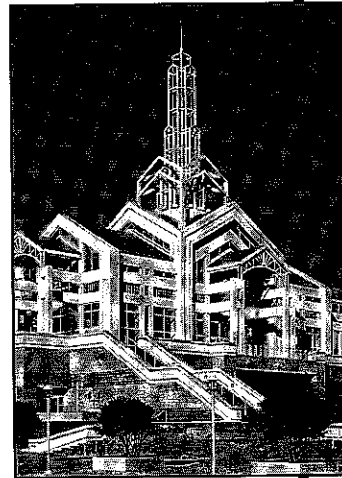
## MOBILE — DISCOVER 300 YEARS OF AMERICA



Rooted in southern tradition, the people of Mobile are committed to the ethics and values that make America great. Through grassroots community projects, Mobilians are active in making the Port City a better place to live, visit, and enjoy. This spirit of cooperation and commitment toward the future placed Mobile in a top-seed position for the title "All America City." That title, now won, can be seen by visitors not only on the city's street-side banners, but in the smiles of the friendly people of Mobile.

Mobile has always prospered because of its strategic location. A deep bay and harbor area offer a perfect shipping port. The barrier islands of Gulf Shores and Dauphin Island were ideal for military strategists. There they built strong forts to assure that only welcome guests ventured into the bay. Today these many historic forts offer visitors a glimpse into the past.

The international trade sustained by Mobile throughout her 300-year history has provided even the earliest settlers with the finer things from Europe, England, the Mediterranean and the Orient. Mobile's five historic house-museums, are open to the public year-round and display artifacts native to this land, and treasures brought from far away.



Grand houses and public buildings, each with their own distinctive charm, reflect the builders' and owners' taste and heritage. Festivals and the observance of religious holidays were not forgotten by early settlers. From its founding in 1702, Mobile has celebrated Christmas, "Boef Gras" (now called Mardi Gras), Lent, Easter and more. Modern-day celebrations now include Azalea Trail Run & Festival (March), Providence Festival of Flowers (March), BayFest (October), Kwanza (December), and First Night Mobile (December).

## 1998 BADGERS SEASON

# PREVIEW

For the second consecutive year, the Spring Hill College baseball team advanced to the NAIA Southwest Regional Tournament. Last season, the Badgers managed their sixth consecutive season with 30 wins or more, finishing with a respectable 31-24 overall record and their second Gulf Coast Athletic Conference championship in the last five years.

Frank Sims, who was named GCAC Coach of the Year last season, begins his 13th year at the Hill. Sims, the all-time winningest coach in Spring Hill history, notched his 400th career victory as a head coach at last year's GCAC Tournament.

The pre-season is usually reserved for fine-tuning the lineup. SHC will face a 30-game GCAC schedule, the largest in several years.

The Badgers begin defense of their GCAC title with a roster filled with a mix of seasoned veterans and talented newcomers, some of whom will be expected to make immediate contributions. Six of eight position starters return, including a former ALL-GCAC selection and ALL-NAIA Southwest Region pick.

On the mound, the Badgers will have five returnees, including a pair of starters competing in their final season at the Hill. Steve DeWitt (5-3, 3.54 ERA) and Zion Wooldridge (5-5, 3.79 ERA) enjoyed measured success, while seniors Michael Cummins and Brian Wiland, junior Eric Busby and sophomore Corey Oubre round out the returnees.

Among six newcomers, freshman Mark Christman (Ormond Beach, Fla.) may compete for a starting spot, while junior transfer Logan Shell from Jeff Davis Community College, sophomore Patrick Wilbenbank, freshman Mike Flavin (Chicago, Ill.) and local freshmen Brian Harp (Baker High) and David Hughes (McGill-Toolen HS) will all compete for time.

Around the infield, two key returnees anchor the middle infield. Leading the returnees is three-time All-GCAC selection, senior Tim Hilpert, Hilpert, the all-time

leader in career hits, led returnees in batting (.393), games played (55), hits (75), doubles (19), total bases (108) and slugging percentage (.565). By season's end, he will more than likely own several career records.

Also returning to the middle infield is senior Sean Yanes. Yanes, an All-GCAC selection as a second baseman in 1996, missed last season recovering from injuries suffered in an off-season automobile accident. Yanes posted a .317 batting average two years ago.

Other returnees include seniors David Baez (.225) and Jared Labue (.273), and sophomore Daniel Rhames (.294). All three may split time at first base with Rhames possibly seeing time in the outfield. The newcomers include junior college transfer Brian Dorgan (Bossier Parrish Community College), and freshmen Jason Downey

(Pensacola, Fla.), Joshua Hebert (Thibodaux, La.), and Tony Vitello (St. Louis, Mo.) and local newcomers Paul McMullan (St. Paul's School), Lenny Motykiewicz (Theodore High) and Travis Rogers (Baker High).

Sophomore Mitch Ackal (.284) will move from the infield to the outfield at the start of the season, but may fill in at either shortstop or third. Other returnees include, senior Joey Hellon (.208) and sophomore Tony Simoncini (.283). The threesome will compete for playing time with redshirt freshman Al Gonzalez (Daphne High), Heath Phillips, a transfer from the University of South Alabama, and freshman newcomers Adam D'Anela (North Springs High), Jeff Nelson (Foley High), Wes Southern (Pensacola, Fla.) and Shane Stanton (Aurora, Colo.).

Behind the plate, sophomore Bo Gunn (.275, 26 RBI), had a fine 1997 season, posting a solid .996 fielding percentage. Sophomore J.J. Poiroux (.243) will be the primary backup.

"I would like to think that this year's team has a chance to win just like last year," Sims said. "We have experience in our first three or four pitchers and in the middle infield, and like last year, some of our freshmen have to step up and contribute."

As in past years, the GCAC is well balanced, with three teams once again listed in the pre-season poll. William Carey College, who advanced to the championship game in the NAIA Southwest Regional in Dallas last season, is ranked No. 22. The Badgers are No. 23, while the University of Mobile is No. 31.

For the second straight season, both William Carey and Spring Hill were participants in the NAIA Southwest Regional Tournament in Texas. This year's regional tournament will be hosted by the GCAC, and the winner of the conference will have the opportunity to host some of the best teams in NAIA baseball this May. For the 1998 Badgers to be that team, it will be, "A matter of getting on the field and getting the job done," according to Sims.

# FRANK SIMS

For the second consecutive year, the Spring Hill College baseball team advanced to the NAIA Southwest Regional. SHC posted their sixth consecutive season with 30 wins or more. The Badgers finished the 1997 season with a respectable 31-24 overall record and second Gulf Coast Athletic Conference championship in the last five years.

Head Coach Frank Sims is the winningest baseball coach in Spring Hill history, reaching his 300th win in only 10-plus seasons. Sims notched career victory 400 in the GCAC Tournament championship game last season.

Under his leadership, SHC has enjoyed much success in the post-season with four Gulf Coast Athletic Conference titles and four trips to the NAIA national tournament. His 1992 team went 40-15 and set 18 team, individual and conference records.

Sims began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater, Eastern Illinois University where he earned his bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation. After one season at EIU, Sims moved on to Sparta High School in Illinois where he served as an assistant coach for football and basketball in addition to head coaching duties for the baseball team. Sims posted a 44-18 record in three seasons on the diamond.

After his experience at Sparta, Sims moved on and subsequently earned his master's degree in H.P.E.R. from Morehead State in Kentucky in 1980. He later became the head baseball coach at Milton College where his squad finished 36-10, narrowly missing a berth in the NAIA World Series. Two seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater followed before he became the head coach of the Badgers late in the 1985 season.

Sims is a member of the executive committee of the NAIA World Series where he serves as chairperson of the International Play Committee. He also was an assistant coach for the Mobile Baysharks of the Texas-Louisiana Professional Baseball league for two seasons.

Frank and his wife, Dana have four children, Drew 13; Sarah, 10; Kelsey 8; and Brian, 6.

## MARK THOMPSON

Mark Thompson returns for his third season as assistant coach for the Badger baseball program and will serve as the first base coach.

A Mobile native and graduate of Davidson High, Thompson started in the outfield for two years at Nicholls State University before transferring to SHC his senior year. He was named team captain his junior season. Thompson also played professional baseball for parts of two seasons.

Thompson received his bachelor's degree in political science in 1995. He is currently enrolled in the MBA program while assisting with staff development in the Student Services Office. He is also the resident hall director at Mobile Hall.
